HOW TO USE A SKETCHBOOK

Your sketchbook CAN and should be your most valuable tool, perhaps the most inexpensive tool you have at your disposal to accomplish many tasks on your road to improving your art! Although I am aware that many of you resist grabbing a pencil and sketching on a regular basis, I encourage you to set aside that fear and make a silent vow to yourself to SKETCH SOMETHING AT LEAST ONCE A WEEK!

A SKETCHBOOK CAN SERVE AS A PRACTICE TOO AND A POTENTIAL FUTURE REFERENCE. All the great artists in history did enjoy the benefits of sketchbooks as they planned and executed their works... (now they are worth MILLIONS!) Few of these artists had the conveniences that we have today – (a trip to Michael's or Arizona Art!) Nevertheless, they drew incessantly. They understood and coveted the benefits of sketching: heightened visual acuity, increased speed and enhanced visual memory. They were repositories of new ideas and labs for their artistic explorations. It is the perfect place to be bold, to experiment and take chances! If one sketch is not to your liking, go on to the next page. Little risk (It's just a piece of paper!) Try again. Sketches can take 30 seconds or ten minutes. Don't be critical of your work now – your goal is to record information as you see it, NOT create a masterpiece.

WHAT GOES IN A SKETCHBOOK?

ANYTHING! Yes, anything and everything that catches your eye., attracts your interest or activates your emotions. A future painting? Or just something to look back on when beginning a painting of that subject. The spontaneous details that you've noted when you first laid eyes on it. I have my sketchbook with me nearly everywhere I go. It is small and inconspicuous and I can fit it in my purse or glovebox so it's ready at a moment's notice. When I travel, even short distances, I keep a sketch journal, noting things like time, weather, light direction, etc. and my little arrow noting the light source since that is such an important factor. I rely on my camera to record reference material for later use of course. But the sketchbook reveals my spontaneous reaction to the scene and therefore create a springboard to an artistic rendition of that reaction rather than a photographic representation of it. (Photos sometimes distort and deceive. Therefore, I rely on my initial response to the scene and can change things around to suit the composition or mood AND I can select the impact I may want to create when transferring this idea to canvas later on.

YOUR SKETCHBOOK IS YOUR OWN PRIVATE THING! DON'T FEEL OBLIGATED TO SHOW IT TO ANYONE. IGNORE YOUR FEARS AND BECOME FRIENDS WITH YOUR MATERIALS! I GUARANTEE YOU WILL NOT REGRET IT!

Tess Mosko Scherer is an accomplished artist with a lot of experience coaching and mentoring artists. She has a diverse background as a gallery owner, as the Artistic Director of Schemer Art Center, and she is Director of Facilitation and Curriculum for the World Academy for the Future of Women. Tess is also currently Executive Director of Arizona Art Alliance.

In her position with AAA Tess has noticed a lot of issues with photographs of artwork submitted for AAA shows. Some submissions are rejected simply because the photograph is so bad. She will be demonstrating setting up to take your picture of your work, transferring the image from phone to computer, resizing and renaming the image, cropping, and skewing, lightening, and darkening, etc. Do not miss this informative presentation.
