Our selection process has been improved over the years. Each application is scored by at least five different readers. Academic achievement, community service, several essays and two letters of reference are evaluated systematically following a well-defined rubric. Scores are analyzed and an algorithm is used to rank students.

Then during the final selection meeting, scholarship committee members discuss applicants, select finalists and match them to sponsored scholarships. So, Chi Am scholars of 2022, you should be very proud of your accomplishments.

We're excited to meet everyone in person after two years of virtual award ceremonies. 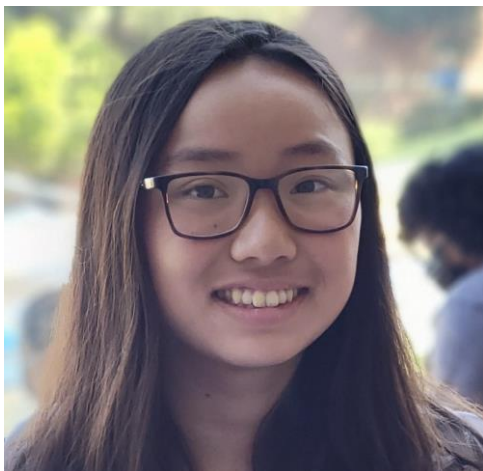
Olivia Gee

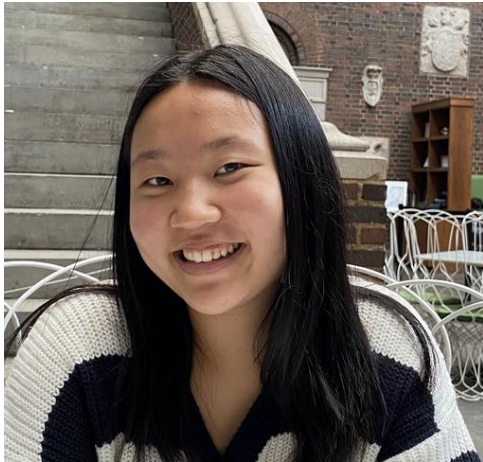
Calvin Fong
