Results of the Decarbonisation Survey

Last April, we invited the community to share their thoughts and feedback in a community survey regarding a proposed project to decarbonise the hall. Central to our considerations was to determine the best course of action regarding a new heating system. Do we replace the existing boiler or seek out a more carbon neutral alternative, and what was most feasible? The results of the survey were then shared and discussed at the AGM on May 20th and priorities set for the coming year. Based on the survey's feedback, our top priority was to proceed with the purchase of a new boiler before the winter. In addition, feedback suggested focus should be on maintaining the structural integrity of the building and a priority was set to seek out grant funding for a new roof. The survey also showed strong support for reducing our emissions and we identified two opportunities which we

will focus on seeking grant funding for in the coming year: upgrading the lighting in the hall and draft proofing the doors.

Summary of survey results:

- 86% of respondents supported the aim of the project to become carbon neutral with a remaining 14% indicating maybe. Comments suggested the integrity of the building be a primary focus over decarbonisation and support for decarbonisation was strong, as long as it did not put the hall at economic risk.
- A primary theme throughout the survey was an expressed concern about the imminent need for a new boiler: however, feedback indicated there was also a concern that the option of an air source heat pump was not adequate to heat the hall and that current technologies were not yet sufficient to be useful for a hall

such as ours.

- The top four stated reasons in support of reducing emissions included: reduction of energy consumption and running costs, making the hall more resilient and sustainable for the future, improving for the benefit of the community and to keep the cost of hiring the hall down.
- The survey indicated that respondents use of the hall was diverse with hall sponsored events being the largest proportion of use.

The survey has indicated there is an appetite to prioritize efforts to achieve Netzero, and we will support this by continuing to identify opportunities, seek grant funding, and work to complete tasks economically and sensibly. 
