PARISHIONERS' WAR SERVICES COMMEMORATED

Mrs Leslie Melville Performs Opening Ceremony

Collessie Victory Hall, a well-equipped harled building with red-tiled roof, was opened on Saturday in presence of a large gathering of parishioners by Mrs Milbank Leslie Melville of Melville House.

With accommodation for over 200 people, the hall has been erected at a cost of over £1000 met by local enterprise, mainly led by Mr and Mrs Robert Strang, Collessie Mill, and Mrs Loslie Melville, who, it will be remembered, entertained Her Majesty when she visited Falkland and Cupar last year, and deputised for her kinsman, the Earl of Leven and Melville, who was detained in London owing to an attack of

War Memorial to commemorate the war services of the whole Parish during war (WWI)- not just the fallen.

'Not only will the hall be a great asset to Collessie, but it will be also a standing example to future generations of the loyalty and spirit of the people of our district during the times of the greatest stress our nation has ever passed through.'

Ensuring the sustainability and viability of Victory Hall into the future.

Collessie Victory Hall Decarbonisation Survey

Survey closes Friday, March 29th, 2024

As we mark Victory Hall's Centenary year, the hall committee has begun investigating the potential for decarbonising the hall, seeking to make the hall sustainable for the future. The project is timely as the hall's antiquated oil boiler needs replacing and is costly to run, the window's let in water and leak heat, and the current lighting system is costly to run. In short, the hall leaks energy, equivalent to an estimated 9,925 car miles per year. Last June, we commissioned a report from Business Energy Scotland, to identify opportunities to improve our energy efficiency. The report identified the following key opportunities to reduce our carbon footprint to 0%:

- · Solar PV + Battery Storage
- · Air Source Heat Pump (or alternately air to air)
- · Internal Wall Insulation
- · Double Glazing
- · LED Lighting Upgrade


