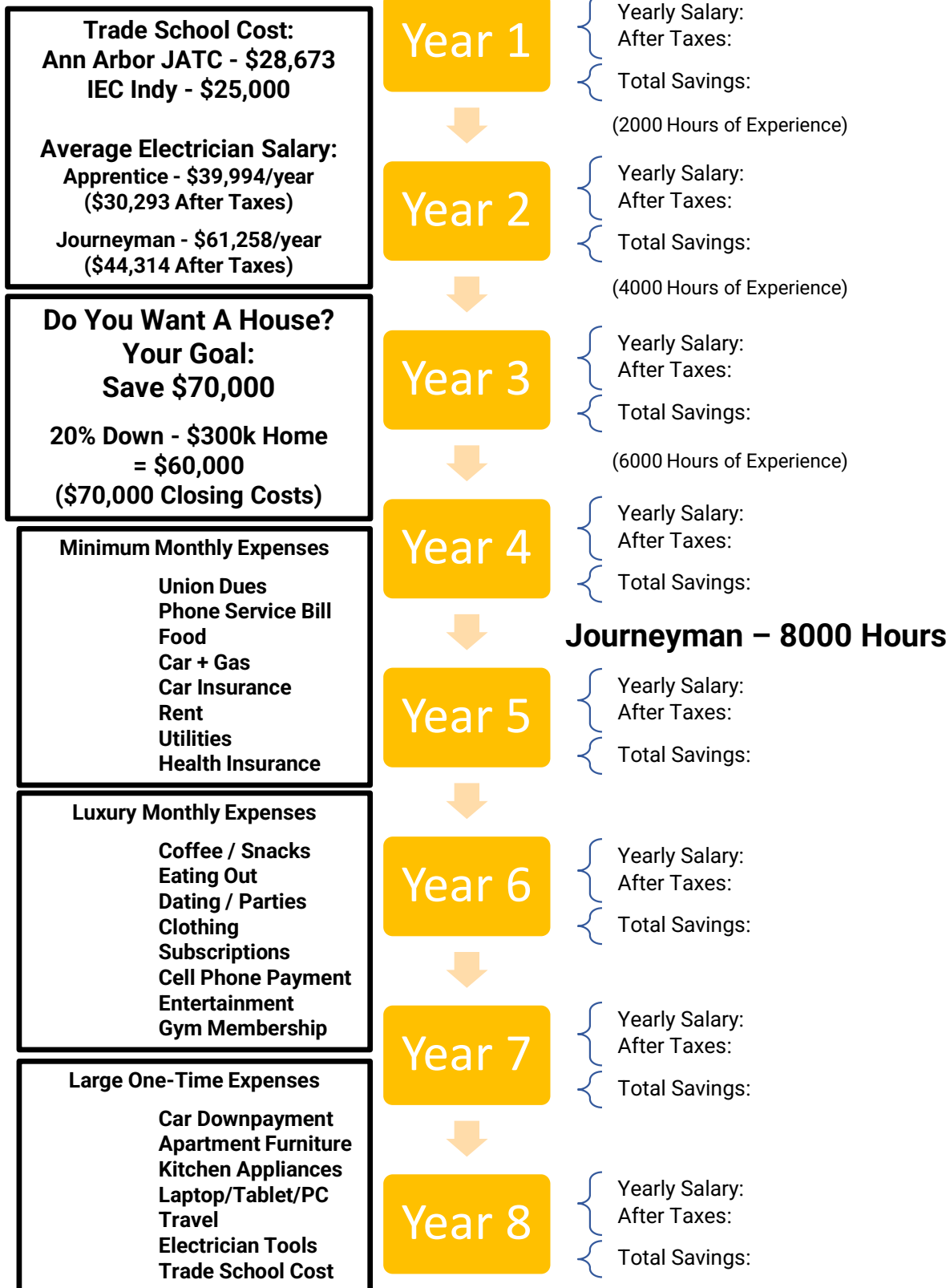

If you work enough overtime, you can outearn a US Navy Electrician.

(\$29/hour is the average Electrician Salary in Indianapolis, IN and Detroit, MI)

40 Hours/week - \$55,680/year - \$40,683 After Taxes

60 Hours/week - \$97,440/year - \$67,702 After Taxes

Now realize that you will work **12 Hour Days** to keep up.
