State Launches New Intersection Analysis of U.S. 1 and Main Street

After years of concern from local residents and two recent fatal crashes, the State of Florida is taking a new look at one of the area's most talked-about intersections.

Officials with the Florida Department of Transportation confirmed this week that a new intersection analysis is underway at U.S. 1 and Main Street in Micco.

According to FDOT, the review was prompted by recent crash activity along with continued public concern, including outreach from residents and questions raised by The Tattler. The study is expected to take several months.

What the State's Data Shows

In response to a request for crash data, FDOT provided a 10-year summary covering January 2016 through mid-March 2026.

According to the state, 31 crashes were identified in the broader area. When narrowed to the immediate intersection, that number drops to 22 crashes over the past 10 years, including two fatalities and several crashes involving injuries.

FDOT noted one important point: the most recent fatal crashes are not included in their numbers. Those cases are still under investigation and have not yet been finalized in the system.

There is also a geographic limitation. The data focuses on a defined area near Main Street and just south of Palm Avenue. Crashes occurring just outside that boundary, including along the bridge approach, may not be included.

FDOT indicated they are working to obtain additional crash data from the bridge area to provide a more complete picture.

Last Studied in 2014

This is not the first time the intersection has been reviewed.

FDOT last conducted a formal study of the area in 2014. That review resulted in additional warning signage, including "Do Not Enter" signs at Palm Avenue and "Intersection Ahead" warnings along U.S. 1.

No major redesign or signalization followed. More than a decade later, the intersection is once again under evaluation.

Experience and Visibility

I have driven to Sebastian thousands of times and have never been involved in a crash at this intersection. But I also know it is there.

For drivers unfamiliar with the area, that is not the case.

Traveling southbound on U.S. 1, Main Street sits almost immediately at the north end of the bridge, just beyond Palm Avenue. You pass Palm, and you're not expecting another street that quickly, especially with trees along the roadway making it less noticeable. That leaves little time for unfamiliar drivers to react to a vehicle attempting a left-hand turn on Main Street.

For northbound traffic coming off the Sebastian Bridge, the roadway crests at a high point, limiting visibility just as drivers from Main Street attempt left turns into traffic that is also permitted to make left turns and U-turns.

While working on this story, I realized how close to home some of these crashes are. I personally know the surviving driver from a 2022 crash, and I know the wife of a bicyclist who was killed in this area.

Behind every number is a person, a family, and a moment that does not show up in a report.

What Residents Are Already Doing

For many in the community, the response has been simple: avoid the intersection.

A review of local comments shows a consistent pattern. Drivers are changing their behavior rather than taking the risk.

Some of the comments include:

"I avoid that intersection at all cost."

"Main Street should be right turn only. No left ever."

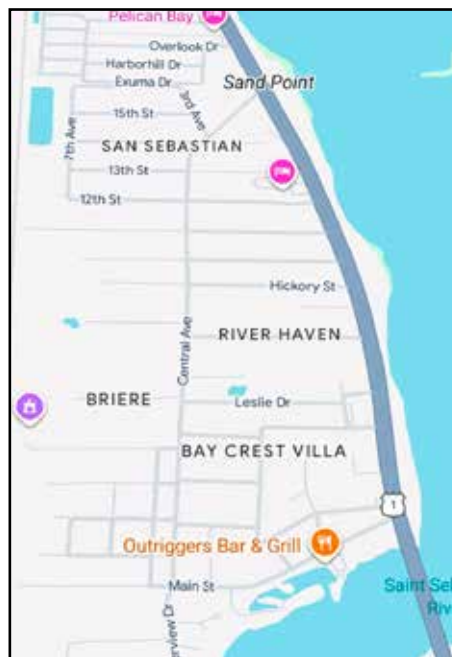
"I go up to Central to get on U.S. 1. It's not worth it."

"You can't see traffic coming over the bridge, and they're flying."

This is not confusion. It is a caution.

A Question of Volume and Risk

FDOT data suggests the intersection handles approximately 2,100 vehicles per day.



Main Street sits just north of the bridge. Nearby routes like Central Avenue offer a northbound option to U.S. 1, a route many locals already choose to avoid turning left at Main Street.

That number appears high for a side street like Main Street. If actual traffic volumes are lower, it raises a more important question:

Are the number of crashes high, relative to the amount of traffic using the intersection?

That is something the new analysis may help answer.

A Strange Image and an Unanswered Question

While reviewing satellite imagery of the intersection, a Google Earth image currently in circulation appears to show what may be an active crash scene near Main Street. What looks like patrol vehicles can be seen positioned in the southbound lanes.

A local resident suggested the image may have been captured during a fatal motorcycle crash that temporarily closed U.S. 1.

That has not been independently confirmed. Even so, the image reflects some-

thing residents already understand. Crashes at this location are not hypothetical.

What Happens Next

FDOT officials say the current review will take several months and they will evaluate the intersection based on updated data and current conditions.

Possible outcomes could range from operational changes to more significant design modifications. No decisions have been made at this stage.

Closing

Two deaths in just a few weeks. The latest was a three-vehicle crash that took the life of a 66-year-old woman from Melbourne.

Would a "No Left Turn" sign have prevented that crash, or would it have been ignored?

What is not in question is how locals respond. Many already avoid the turn entirely, choosing routes like Central Avenue instead.

The Tattler will report the FDOT findings when available.

Crashes rarely happen because one person simply "didn't do what they were supposed to." They happen because people misjudge speed, hesitate, rush, or get distracted.

That's why dangerous intersections get redesigned.

This crossing on US-1 requires drivers to judge fast-moving traffic in multiple lanes with very little margin for error. Even if traffic volume is low, the risk per vehicle is high — which helps explain the serious crashes we've seen here.

Good road design anticipates mistakes and reduces the consequences. Sometimes that means closing or rerouting low-volume crossings to safer, signalized intersections.

It's not about blaming drivers or the road.

It's about recognizing a high-risk location and making it safer before someone else gets hurt.

A Word From the

CVO

Let me begin with a quote. "I hope you realize that every day is a fresh start for you. That every sunrise is a new chapter in your life waiting to be written." In the most recent days, I have experienced the loss of several Barefoot Bay residents who have touched my life in very different ways. Not deep friendships, but the type of friendship that is an everyday assumption that they will be there. It has made me stop and think about the expectations of tomorrow, and that it will always be there waiting. So, my "aha" moment has happened!

We need to remember that we have new chapters waiting to be written each and every day. Chapters that include paragraphs of acquaintances, moments of laughter, and moments of tears. They are all experiences and people that add to the richness of our lives, and we need to remember them and look forward to writing those chapters. My book needs to be a never-ending story!

Okay, back to business! If you haven't been following the BOT budget workshops, I would encourage all Barefoot Bay residents to join in and follow along so that you may come to understand our budgeted expenses and expenditures for the current year and our future years.

Recently, we had a meeting regarding the Food & Beverage Revised Principles of Operation. Our staff, Kathy Mendes, Charles Henley, and Linn Britt, presented a very informative Supplemental Methodology document to better understand the concept of amenities and the "methods by which Food and Beverage data has been tracked and presented historically and the resulting way in which Food and Beverage has been viewed by the community." This document truly is helpful for us as a community to understand, and I would encourage all to get a copy and read it. Knowledge is always an asset!

I would also like to remind our community that the Civic Volunteer Organization of Barefoot Bay (CVO) is NOT a Homeowners Association (HOA).

An HOA is typically an organization within a subdivision, planned community, or condominium that creates and enforces rules governing properties and residents.

The mission of the CVO is very different. As stated in our mission:

"We are a resource and information center for the residents of Barefoot Bay, sponsoring educational and social events. Part of our mission is to encourage participation and volunteerism within the community."

Under no circumstances does the CVO create, enforce, or participate in enforcing rules within Barefoot Bay.

We are currently facing litigation related to a case from several years ago involving the Recreation District and a Barefoot Bay homeowner over a dog bite incident. In that case, the CVO has been named as a plaintiff, apparently under the mistaken belief that we function as a homeowners' association.

To be clear, the CVO is not an HOA and has no role in the matters involved in this case. The lawsuit against the Recreation District was previously dismissed by the court, but the homeowner and their counsel are now attempting to pursue damages by including the CVO.

As a result, the CVO must now defend itself legally in a matter that does not involve our organization. This situation appears to stem from a misunderstanding about the structure of our community.

It is an important reminder that understanding how Barefoot Bay is organized — and which entities are responsible for what — matters. Accurate knowledge of our community can prevent unnecessary situations like this from occurring.

A Word From Your Recreation District Chair
 Elaine VanBerschoot

February 12, 2026 Meeting Highlights:

The Board considered proposed eligible elements to replace the two new pickleball courts for the pending FRDAP grant application with the State of Florida. Proposed items include extending the "Under the Oaks" walking trail with additional benches, constructing a new gazebo along the trail extension, installing ADA-compliant playground equipment with possible playground expansion, adding a carved sea turtle climbing feature for children, resurfacing the shuffleboard courts, installing new sod for the lawn bowling area, constructing a fence with a gate to fully enclose the pickleball courts, adding a small shade structure at the tennis court, and reconstructing the tennis court as a clay court. The Board reached a consensus to revisit the list once pricing is obtained, so the projects can be prioritized.

The Board was informed that the Lounge Walk-in Cooler project has been completed. The BOT subsequently directed, through consensus, to leave the temporary smoking area open for use until further discussion at the February 24, 2026, BOT meeting for further consideration.

February 24, 2026 Meeting Highlights:

Three DOR violations were discussed and referred to legal counsel for resolution. They are DOR Violation DOR Violation 25-001713 - 446 Marlin Circle, DOR Violation DOR Violation 25-002252 - 808 Oriole Circle, DOR Violation 25-000847 - 935 Vireo Drive.

The Board approved a request from the Computer & Technology Club to allow a one-time event on safety and security on March 31st to be open to the general public.

The Board discussed the possibility of other smoking areas at Pool #1, as well as a proposed Florida Senate Bill 986 and Florida House Bill 389, which would redefine what constitutes public places, including banning smoking along sidewalks, at pools, outside restaurants and bar patios, on beaches, and inside vehicles. The BOT tabled the discussion and decision to the March 12, 2026, regular meeting.




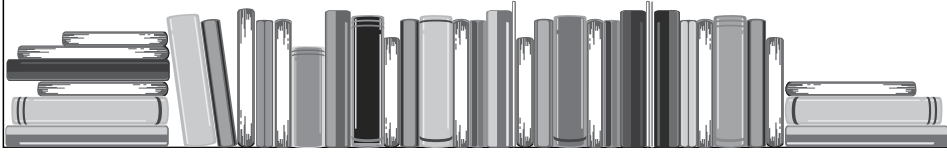

Helpful Tips for Veterans

Good news for veterans. Progress has been made with Florida's veteran dental program from its initial 2024 implementation into a more robust, expanded initiative for 2026, driven by legislative action and continued funding. Key advancements include expanding income eligibility, extending the duration of the program, and increasing the cap on available dental services. Increased Eligibility: The income threshold for eligibility will rise to 400 percent of the federal poverty level, expanding access beyond the previous 300. Increased Benefits: The cap on dental services per veteran has doubled to \$5,980.30. Ask your local veteran service officer if you qualify.
