

Good Day, Barefoot Bay!



This is a positive result for Barefoot Bay as we move forward into 2024. Jeff Grunow will remain on the current BOT and Elaine VanBerschot will join the BOT in January. Elaine will serve a three year term, due to her two vote winning margin. Jeff will get to do this again in two years. We would like to thank Luann for stepping up and volunteering to run for office. Her challenge gave us options and that's important when choosing who will direct our community under difficult circumstances next year.

The Investigation into Collusion Continues...

A month has passed since we published our story regarding the collusion between a few Trustees and two senior managers to eliminate our Community Manager, Kent Cichon. I'm happy to report that Kent is still here, and the managers allegedly involved in this conspiracy are no longer employed by Barefoot Bay Recreation District (BBRD). One of the managers had been terminated, and the other manager quit the day before The Tatter story was published. A current senior manager says the situation among staff is "improving." Good. We don't need subversives working against our Community Manager (CM) when they're supposed to work for Barefoot Bay.

The three Trustees still sit on the Board of Trustees (BOT). None resigned, probably hoping to avoid appearing guilty. They also did not respond to last month's article in The Tattler. They didn't ask for a retraction or send a letter explaining their actions. Naturally, they don't owe The Tattler any explanation and apparently didn't have any complaints about what was written. The evidence of Sunshine Law violations is weak. There is no video, only a first-hand account of someone we trust. There may never be a "smoking gun," but we'll continue to point out impropriety when we see it.

There is a disconnect between what some Trustees believe is their duty and what their actual obligations entail as a Trustee. Most Trustees are new when they are elected to the BOT. Few have the level of experience that Joe Klosky has, though he never learned or cared about his actual responsibilities. Joe was always trying to fight for the little guy and getting ahead of himself with regard to what you can and can't do as a Trustee. This same disconnect applies to homeowners, as well. This may surprise many, but the Trustees are not your advocates, individually or as a group. Yes, you can ask them for help, and you should bring matters of public interest to their attention. You should inform the Trustees of your concerns via email, in conversations around the Bay, and at public meetings. But you need to realize what the Trustees can do is limited.

Should you contact a Trustee regarding a complaint, The Trustees should tell you who you should contact, whether that be the golf pro, Property Maintenance, F&B, etc. If the resident suggests they have taken that route unsuccessfully, the Trustee needs to direct them to the Community Manager. At no point should a Trustee reach out to an individual manager on behalf of any resident or employee. Trustees are not your champion. They cannot "fix" your problem. The BOT Treasurer and Secretary have discussions with Finance and the District Clerk as part of their responsibility. Other than that, Trustees should never discuss policy or complaints directly with a manager other than the Community Manager, the Trustee's only contact with BBRD. If something needs to be brought before the entire Board, each Trustee can request adding an item to the Board's agenda (i.e., resident complaints about fees in June).

Trustees are not elected to sway the Board or pursue a particular agenda for any employee, manager, or group of homeowners. They are elected to protect the assets of BBRD, make policy changes when needed, and approve the budget. These are done to maintain our assets and make rules that benefit the majority of our community. For instance, most homeowners would love to see our taxes decrease, but the Trustees are not elected to reduce fees or

eliminate assets. The recent complaints regarding fees are an example where a large group complained about the fees, and the BOT dealt with the issue at a BOT meeting. They did not act for those who wanted fees to go down but worked to make some adjustments while balancing a challenging budget. Homeowners often suggest to Trustees we sell the beach or the golf course, thinking our taxes will go down. Maybe so, but so would the value of our homes, something a Trustee should never support. Please take your complaints to the correct manager and not a Trustee, and please don't expect Trustees to cut your taxes while still maintaining our current services and assets.

We have made numerous Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests from BBRD. We have received several documents, including emails from one FOIA request, showing trustees advocating for homeowners with individual department heads. These Trustees are given a one-time pass since we doubt they ever contemplated that advocating for homeowners was not their responsibility. Imagine five Trustees calling/emailing/visiting different department heads to ask for action or responses to resident complaints, most often addressed to all five

There's a reason that Trustees never respond to an email by replying to "all." Too often, these emails can lead to communications between Trustees outside of the Sunshine and become conduits for information to flow between Trustees. Trustees need to follow the Organizational Chart (see page 8), which shows their contact as the Community Manager. If they get an email regarding an issue, they should forward it to the department head and the Community Manager. Other than saying thank you for bringing this to their attention, the Trustee should allow BBRD to do its job. If the complaint persists, the Trustee can discuss it directly with the Community Manager, their only contact with BBRD and someone who understands the Sunshine Laws. If the Trustee feels it is worthy of Board action, they can request the BOT add the concern to the Agenda. This is how all Trustees should handle complaints by homeowners.



The Tattler has requested a variety of documentation from BBRD. The first of these documents were provided in the past few weeks. Have we received everything requested? Not yet, and BBRD is requesting hundreds of dollars in fees for some of the records requested. There is also an issue with the BBRD phone companies being unable to tell us what was deleted from government-issued phones. Frustrating.

The first "innocent" responses to my FOIA requests remind me of my first few months on the Board of Trustees and a mistake I made as a Trustee. Trustee Ann Hansen, at the October 12 meeting, was seen texting during the meeting. We requested a copy of the text. Ann had texted Jason Pierman, our primary contact with Special District Services (SDS). This company provides candidates and employs our Community Manager, Kent Cichon, and Jason was present at that October 12 meeting. We don't have any more context regarding her text, but we assume she wanted to discuss a review of the Community Manager, seeing as she had added it to the agenda for that meeting. Besides the impropriety of texting during a BOT meeting, Ann had no business contacting SDS for any reason without the explicit knowledge and approval of the BOT. We can't have Trustees acting as unauthorized agents of BBRD and requesting responses, documents, etc., from our vendors. That's not their job! We also can't have Trustees randomly calling the Attorney, SDS, or the local liquor distributor since it exceeds their authority and could result in additional fees/charges to BBRD. If the entire BOT approves, based on a discussion of the pertinent facts at a meeting, then and only then would a Trustee have that authority. Without that approval, it's just a Trustee

In 2007, I learned a valuable lesson when I went "rogue" as a Trustee. The CM had purchased a liquor inventory management system for the lounge and 19th Hole. The BOT found out after the fact, and the purchase price was discussed. Per the CM, the purchase price was less than \$25,000 and was not subject to the requirement that new capital purchases be put out for a vote of the homeowners. I didn't believe the CM regarding the purchase price and took it upon myself to investigate, contacting the vendor and requesting documentation. At another BOT meeting, I presented the documentation showing that the cost of the system was over \$25,000 and that the total price had been split between two separate invoices, proving the CM had lied to the BOT. The CM had her supporters on that BOT, and I was vilified for having contacted a vendor without approval and was officially censured by the BOT, the only BBRD Trustee to be censured ever. I promptly left that meeting, feeling unreasonably censured, but returned for the next meeting. I had proven the CM lied and would not let the censure force me to resign. I understood why the BOT must sanction those efforts, and as a Trustee, I accept that. Had I tried to get approval, the CM's supporters would have stopped me anyway. If you're wondering about those liquor systems, they were pulled out by the District a few years later, the total expense being a waste of taxpayer dollars.

We intend to continue to dig for information regarding the collusion to fire Kent Cichon. There may or may not be evidence of that collusion. The Tattler is waiting on additional documentation from BBRD, videos, and specifically, the emails and text messages of one of the managers involved in the collusion against Kent Cichon. It's been reported that this manager was asked for their government-issued phone by a representative of BBRD, refused to provide it, and eventually dropped it off two days later. We are attempting to get records showing if any text messages or emails have been deleted. BBRD is asking The Tattler to pay \$900 for six hours of IT time to recover these lost emails. After the parade, there will be a lighting ceremony and celebration in Building A, offering up Christmas treats and music by Barefoot Bay Open Mic Club starting at 5:45 pm.

December 31st – New Year's Eve, join us for a dinner show tribute to Frank Sinatra and Dean Martin. Jeff Granger has been performing his endearing tribute to "Ole Blue Eyes" for more than 20 years. 

Being a caregiver is a very challenging job in every way: mentally, emotionally, and physically. And during the holidays, it may become even more challenging. Below are frequently asked questions and answers on this topic.

Q: Caring for my elderly parents falls on me and another sibling, leaving our two other siblings doing nothing—they always have "more important" things to do. My one sister and I have accepted this, except around the holidays; we could really use the extra help then. Any suggestions?

A: Dealing with family, particularly around the holidays, can be stressful. And when you add in caring for your parents, it's quadruple that. A good place to start would be to set up a meeting in person or via Zoom. Be sure to have a set of talking points and be clear on what your main objective is: do you want help for one day? One week? One month? Also, provide a visual timeline that clearly shows all the time you and your other sibling have been caring for your parents. In a sense, you should approach it almost like you would a business meeting because that will help minimize charged emotions. If that meeting does not go well, consider inviting a mental health counselor qualified in family dynamics to participate in a follow-up meeting as a mediator.

Q: My wife's a caregiver, and during the holidays, a time when she used to be extra happy, she's gotten less and less so due to the stress of her job. Is there anything I can suggest for her to do to lessen the stress?

A: Caregiver burnout is a real thing. Below are some tips to help prevent this from happening (paste it on the fridge so your wife can read it every day).

Tips for Caregivers During the Holidays

- 1. Practice self-love and keep it simple: 'Practice self-love' may sound corny, but it's imperative to take care of your physical and mental health. You're not only helping yourself but improving the quality of care for those who depend on you. So, make sure you take time for yourself. This could mean doing things as simple as setting aside enough time to savor your cup of coffee in the morning and carving out time to take a daily walk outside, enjoy nature, and make your body smile.
- 2. Start a new tradition: Sometimes, our old traditions just don't fit our current lives. Give yourself permission to create new traditions. For example, if you're extra sleep-deprived this holiday season, instead of hosting your annual Christmas party, ask everyone to meet out somewhere, maybe a favorite restaurant, for a casual get-together.
- 3. You can ask for help: It's okay to ask others for help when you're feeling wiped out. As a caregiver, it can be difficult to do, but remember the way you can perform your job optimally is by feeling your best.
- 4. Stay positive: Practice positive affirmations. You can create your own or Google 'positive affirmations," and a gazillion websites will pop up. Practicing these a few times a day, beginning in the morning, can make a small but significant difference in feeling more upbeat.
- 5. Practice self-care: Now is a good time to splurge a little on yourself. Get a massage or pedicure, or whatever it is that feels like a treat to you.
- 6. Connect with caregivers: Connecting with fellow caregivers is extremely important and therapeutic. They'll be able to identify and empathize with any travails you're having at work and emotions you carry over from work.

Q: As a caregiver, I've found that around the holidays, many of my patients start to become more stressed and start asking a lot of questions about services I don't have the answers for. Do you know of any reputable resources geared toward elder care?

A: The Florida Department of Elder Affairs operates numerous community-based services that focus on the well-being, safety, and independence of Florida's seniors. Information on these services, including the Adult Care Food Program, Community Care for the Elderly, the Senior Companion Program, and more, can be accessed via the Elder Helpline. October 17th Budget Kickoff/Town Hall meeting.

A good turnout attended this meeting. Mr. Cichon provided a PowerPoint presentation overview of the FY25 budget development and FY25-29 Capital Improvement Project Plan. Residents made many points and asked many questions. Some of the items were a discussion on ADA compliance. A question about priority lists for capital projects was asked, and it was answered that there are priorities. Many things were brought up. 




Changes are Possible for the Barefoot Bay Recreation District Organizational Chart Currently Under Review by Kent Cichon







Balancing Revenue And Expenditures For Our Future

Balancing a budget is a simple procedure: increase revenues or decrease expenses. We as individuals go through this process as inflation challenges our ability to keep our household afloat. I would encourage our trustees to work with our community manager to have the wisdom to go through the budget process. Understanding that two major factors impede or limit the ability to produce a budget that will deliver the best results for Barefoot Bay.

The unknown effect of the state-mandated Minimum wage increase and the agreement with the County commissioner to cap our fee increases. With respect to this, I would encourage the board to review the agreement with the county commissioner and find a way to satisfy that restriction and, at the same time, increase revenue. My personal view is that this was railroaded by a previous board and should have had more discussion with the commissioner as it has hamstrung the budget process.

I have great respect for our department heads, Community Manager, and trustees to formulate a plan and develop a sound working budget.

Cutting expenses is never a popular position, but one that may have to happen over the next several years. On the other side of the equation, neither the raising of fees nor assessment is a popular position, and it is limited by the agreement with the county on revenue increases.

At the recent Town Hall Meeting for the Budget Kickoff, we had the opportunity to listen to the community manager present the 5-year capital plan. This was presented by the year of anticipated expenditure.

I took the opportunity to accumulate the expenditures by area rather than by year. WHY? Because there may be an opportunity in this, and I recognize that years two and out may change due to unforeseen or unanticipated needs. I am sure that all the expenses shown were, in the minds of the group, a necessity.

For those who did not attend the presentation at the Town Hall Meeting, here is a summary of some of the larger capital expenditures.

SHOPPING CENTER = \$421,920, PRO SHOP/D&E = \$46,000, SWIMMING POOLS = \$162,100, LOUNGE = \$46,070, VETERANS CENTER = \$13,605, ADMINISTRATION BUILDING \$35,600

As I previously stated, balancing a budget takes effort and conviction.

We all need to support our Community Manager and Trustees in their efforts to balance the budget. I would urge each resident to become informed about our community and the budget. If you have suggestions or alternatives, please attend a budget meeting and become involved.

Let us make Barefoot Bay beautiful and affordable.
