Bridge Replacement Closes **Micco Road**



Micco Road will be closed to through traffic for replacement of the existing bridge over the Sottile Canal, located southwest of Barefoot Bay, just west of Dottie Lane. The road closure is expected to begin on Jan 30, 2024, lasting for a period of up to eight months. Once the road is closed at the Sottile Canal, eastbound and westbound traffic will have to take a detour to get to the other side; this includes local businesses and residences that will be cut off once bridge demolition begins.

Brevard County's Public Works (BCPW) department will be proactively working with the contractor to expeditiously complete the work and reopen the road sooner, if possible. The current bridge - a group of corrugated metal half-pipes encased in concrete supported by timber piling - was constructed in 1938 and has surpassed its life expectancy. The replacement bridge, which includes two 11-foot travel lanes, 8-foot paved shoulders, and a barrierprotected 5-foot sidewalk, will be constructed to current standards and will traverse the canal with a modern single-span design supported by concrete pilings.

The 130+ homes at the Lakes at Saint Sebastian, west of the closure, will be the most seriously affected area and can expect travel times to work, appointments, and leisure activities to increase significantly. The United States Postal Service, Waste Management, and the Brevard County Sheriff's Office have informed the residents of Saint Sebastian that mail delivery, trash removal, and emergency response times will not be affected. Additionally, Brevard Public Schools (BPS) will be adding a driver for school transportation, and pickup times and drop-offs should not change for those west of the closure.

Parents of school-age children east of the closure (including Barefoot Bay) will be receiving an email from their child's school relating to new bus schedules. Earlier pickups (and later dropoffs) will be required to make sure children get to school on time. These times are expected to change by approximately ten minutes each way and may be adjusted once the detours are in place and any unknown factors are considered. BPS is committed to getting your child safely to and from school each day and will keep parents informed as adjustments are made.

Per Brevard County Fire Rescue (BCFR), the interim response time during construction has been minimized and will not affect the quality of emergency services for Barefoot Bay or Micco. BCFR will have a pre-staged vehicle parked west of the work zone, and first responders will be provided on-foot access to cross the Sottile Canal for the homes at Saint Sebastian. The vehicle will be outfitted with advanced life safety equipment and water pumping capabilities so that any situation can be addressed while additional emergency vehicles come from points west as needed.

The \$3M dollar bridge replacement project initially included the construction of a temporary bridge span but this part of the project was considered cost-prohibitive and not userfriendly and was rejected prior to awarding the project. Daughter Charged with Manslaughter

The Brevard County Sheriff's Office has arrested 49-year-old Kelly Tinsley of Barefoot Bay for causing the death of her mother, 69-year-old Cheryl Meurer, on January 8, 2024, at a residence on Sea Gull Drive, Barefoot Bay. Tinsley was arrested after an arrest warrant was issued by Judge Kelly Ingram, charging her with Manslaughter Reclassified with the use of a Weapon. Tinsley is currently being held at the Brevard County Jail Complex on a No Bond status.

The investigation began when deputies responded to the residence at approximately 5:15 a.m. in reference to the report of an injured woman. Upon arrival, deputies located the victim. Ms. Meurer, inside the residence. The victim had been stabbed multiple times and was pronounced deceased at the scene. Based on evidence collected and statements gathered during the investigation, agents believe that on the evening of January 8, 2024, Ms. Tinsley and the victim became involved in a physical altercation that ended with the victim being stabbed to death.

BCSO had responded to a call at the same address the night before the killing after the victim claimed an unknown person had been on her property and had left cigarette butts on her driveway. The call was not domestic violence related and resulted in no further action by the deputies.





Barefoot by the Lake Festival is at hand! Coming to the Bay on February 9th and 10th. Check out the center fold in this issue of the Tattler. It will tell you all that will be going on, when and where it will happen, and the local business sponsors that make this all possible. So I won't repeat that here.

This is the 6th Annual Festival. You can't imagine the scope of work involved...volunteers working hand in hand with BBRD staff! It has grown in both size and reputation, attracting visitors from all over central Florida and even out of state. But where did it all begin?

Shortly after she was hired as Food and Beverage manager in 2008, Kathy Mendes took in the view of the field behind the Lounge and could visualize a music stage, artisan tents, food trucks, and people enjoying the day. Then, in the spring of 2017, she shared that vision with CVO Vice President Roger Compton, who in turn relayed her dream of having a Barefoot Bay "festival" to the CVO team. That sparked a whirlwind of activity.

The original team included Kathy Mendes, Roger Compton, and Elaine Van BerSchot. Betsy Brown, Anne Manzo, Randy Loveland, Tom O'Donnell, Annamae Beal, John Burke, Ellen Woodward, Lorraine Andrews, Dennis, and Linda Levasseur. Each handled a specific area and approached their tasks with NO FEAR. Well, except perhaps for the "R" word.

The first Festival was held on February 18, 2018, a time when the maximum number of homeowners would be in residence. Only one day long, its focus was on high-end artisans, food vendors, and musicians. Issues that had to be addressed concerned licensing, required permits, soliciting business sponsors, signing up the right vendors, making the best use of the space, managing/parking traffic, equipment rental, advertising, and gathering more than 100 volunteers to work at the event along with the hardworking BBRD staff. Whew!!! That's not all of it, either. But what a day it was! It was estimated that more than 3000 people came through the festival that year.

Since then, the Festival has grown in both what it offers and in attendance. It has been expanded to two days (a Friday and Saturday), a Kid's Zone was added to provide activities to our younger visitors, crafters were added in Building A, and the number of artisans eager to spend the day here has doubled, as has the attendance. As the makeup of the organizing committee changed, new ideas were introduced to make the event even better. But still, they have remained true to their original purpose.

The BBTL Committee is made up of volunteers who spend an untold number of hours over the course of 8-9 months creating, planning, and organizing this event. They work along with our dedicated BBRD staff, who handle the extensive setup/takedown, grounds maintenance, and serving food and beverages. All of the people involved are at the heart of this festival. Barefoot by the Lake Festival is a joint effort of BBRD and the CVO. It is incorporated as a 501(c)(3) organization under the IRS code.

We hope you come and enjoy a couple of days with us.

Take Charge of Your Heart Health

Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the U.S., according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). That's quite a statistic, one not to be taken lightly. Perhaps the first thing to understand about heart disease is that there are different kinds; when you read or hear about "heart disease," what's technically being described or referred to is a range of conditions that affect the heart, according to mayoclinic.org. This range includes coronary artery disease (CAD), heart arrhythmias, heart valve disease, heart failure, pericardial disease, cardiomyopathy (heart muscle disease), and congenital heart disease. Below, in honor of American Heart Month, we answer some of your questions about your ticker, including preventive measures you can take to help increase your odds that you will not become another statistic.

Q: My wife's doctor said she had coronary artery disease. What's the difference between that and coronary heart disease?

A: There is no difference. Coronary artery disease is also called coronary heart disease, aka ischemic heart disease.

Q: I'm in decent shape, but my cholesterol is high. Am I at risk for heart disease?

A: According to Cleveland Clinic's website, clevelandclinic.org, high cholesterol leads to plaque buildup inside your blood vessels. This buildup is called atherosclerosis. When atherosclerosis affects your coronary arteries, the blood vessels that carry blood to your heart, you may develop coronary artery disease, aka coronary heart disease. This is because when your heart doesn't get an ample blood supply, it becomes weaker and doesn't function the way it is supposed to. Sometimes, this can lead to a heart attack or heart failure.

Q: I read that cholesterol and high blood pressure are related, but I don't understand how. Can you explain?

A: According to clevelandclinic.org, "Cholesterol plaque and calcium cause your arteries to become hard and narrow. So, your heart has to strain much harder to pump blood through them. As a result, your blood pressure becomes too high."

Q: My leg was hurting, and I went to the doctor, who told me that I had peripheral artery disease. She said it's related to heart attacks but didn't say how. Could you please explain the connection and also what peripheral artery disease is exactly? Maybe start with that!

A: When atherosclerosis, the buildup of plaque in your blood vessels, affects the arteries in your legs and arms, it's defined as peripheral artery disease or PAD. This is because the arteries in your legs and arms are considered "peripheral" since they're away from your heart and center of the body, according to clevelandclinic.org. If you have PAD, then you're at an increased risk for developing coronary artery disease, which may lead to a heart attack or

Q: My father died of a heart attack, and I don't want to repeat history. Are there any ways to help prevent heart disease?

A: Yes. One of the best ways, if not the best way, to increase your chances of preventing heart issues is by living in a healthy way. Some main suggestions of how to do this are below:

- Exercising regularly.
- If you smoke, quit.
- Limit your alcohol intake.
- Get your cholesterol and blood pressure checked periodically (check with your physician on how often).
- Watch your diet. Make sure to choose low-fat, low-sodium, heart-healthy meals, which include lots of leafy green vegetables, fruits, whole grains (like brown rice), and protein-rich foods, including fish high in omega-3 fatty acids (think salmon and tuna). Also, legumes, nuts, oils, and foods high in monounsaturated and polyunsaturated fats are good to nosh on.
- It's also important to note what foods to limit (or avoid altogether). These include sodium, added sugars, and saturated fats.

Everyone's body is different, and practicing healthy living may mean different things to different people and may be more important for some than others, but there is really no downside to pursuing a healthier lifestyle, so why not start now? A good place to begin is by visiting your doctor, getting a physical, and learning what could help your body function optimally.



Bridge Closure

My name is William Hale, and I live in the new subdivision, 'The Lakes at St. Sebastian,' on the South side of Micco Road. On New Year's Eve, we were advised that the bridge connecting Micco Road with US Highway 1 will be closed beginning mid-January 2024 for at least eight months. This effectively will isolate our community of approximately 400 people (many senior citizens) from all emergency and essential services for that period of time and leave us vulnerable to a myriad of potential threats.

We are on the west side of the bridge in question, with the Barefoot Bay community on the east side of the bridge and a rural conservation area to our west. Currently, we are two to three miles from doctors, fire department, police, library, churches, schools, gas stations, shopping, etc. Closing the bridge with no alternative requires a 40-50-mile trip each time we leave our community. Additionally, to add insult to injury, we have been advised that our mail service will be suspended, and all mail will be put on hold and held for pickup at the main Sebastian Post Office. A 40-50 mile trip just to get our mail each day? How about Fed X and UPS? Effectively, we will be held hostage by Brevard County Public Works!

Who pays for all of this? Additional fuel (\$\$), wear and tear on automobiles (\$\$), our time (\$\$)?

We were told there was no alternative? Public Works says it's just a minor inconvenience; driving 40-50 miles each time I leave my home, plus the impact this would have on our community? A minor inconvenience? Really? The facts speak for themselves. The decision to close the bridge at this time, without any public hearing or local community input, was not thoroughly evaluated before the decision was made, and it is unacceptable!

We all know if the administrators in charge of this project use all of their resources in a constructive manner, a much better and safer solution to this problem can be found without causing total disruption and chaos to the families that live in 'The Lakes at St. Sebastian.'

This project must be suspended and amended now!

Wonka

I saw the original film, Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory, and Gene Wilder's iconic characterization of the chocolatier when I was ten years old and I loved every second of it. The music, the darkness, the weirdness, and the candy(!) only fueled my dreams of winning my own Golden Ticket. What a fun, wild ride, still enjoyable today. Over the years, I've watched the film dozens of times, memorizing the lines and lyrics, thoroughly enjoying the characters (Augustus Gloop, Veronica Salt, Mike Teevee, Slugworth, etc), and lately reminiscing the great, late Gene Wilder. The Tim Burton film was just weird, and I didn't care for Johnny Depp's bizarre take on Willy Wonka, though the film itself was closer to Roald Dahl's original story.

The new Wonka drops a surprisingly spirited prequel to the original film loaded with songs, dancing, an unusually perky and charming Willy Wonka, and plenty of homages to the original film, including a sequence with Timothy Chalamet singing Pure Imagination. I needed that, like whipped cream on strawberry shortcake, for a film that was occasionally a little dry and felt like it was missing something truly special.

Timothy Chalamet's sweet characterization of the young Willy Wonka has little to do with the original story but is a reimagining of Wonka's early days as he struggles to make his candy dreams come true. We can only imagine Gene Wilder with a disposition similar to that of a young man prior to forty years of loneliness and separation from



society and the struggles of running his factory, even with the help of Oompa Loompas. When they remake the original film again, as we know they will, I would happily applaud an older Timothy Chalamet back in the role since his performance in Wonka was a

Hugh Grant is perfectly cast as the lone Oompa Loompa and steals the show in several scenes. The other characters have their peculiarities, as expected, but seem to be missing the wonder. The film has its magical moments, great songs, and choreography, but seemed to drag in places.

I'm looking forward to seeing the film again once it becomes available online and seeing if Wonka doesn't grow on me. I sincerely hope it does since I wanted to love this movie, and I'm indifferent after seeing it. I wanted a Scrumdiddlyumptious, not just a

The Kilted Mermaid





The Kilted Mermaid is a quaint little hole-in-the-wall restaurant in Vero Beach with reviews. There is seating inside and tent-style seating outside for better weather days. The decor is eclectic and colorful and provides lots of charm to discover. Live entertainment, a singer with acoustic guitar, was pleasant and not overbearing or overly loud. Despite rushing the wait staff to get to our movie, we were in and out in no time but could have lingered longer without somewhere to be. The food looked good, the temperatures were fine, the presentation was as expected, and the meat was seared well.

However - each dish lacked seasoning, salt, and/or flavors that 'popped.' We tried the much-reviewed duck empanadas, which had a good texture and a generous portion of duck, but the sauce missed the mark, and the filling was generous but bland. We also tried the much raved about tuna wonton appetizer. Tasty but heavily assertive, with raw onion and a horseradish sauce that overpowered the dish. Our main course was a spinach and artichoke cheese fondue, which should have been deep and nuanced but was flat and lacked flavor. The grilled skewer combo of chicken and steak for dipping alongside the bread cubes and raw vegetables was grilled to perfection. Still, without salt, marinade, or seasoning, it was just another example of food with little to no flavor.

Though we did not order beer, if you're a fan, there is a wide range of options. The Kilted Mermaid has a full complement of craft beer and IPAs, local brews, and a good wine list. However, we felt our \$88 meal really missed the mark on the food, though we enjoyed the ambiance. We are unlikely to be back soon to eat unless our physician recommends a

Whereas our meal at Hemingway's last month was a solid 8/10, tonight's fare, despite friendly waitstaff and a charming environment, only warrants a 4/10 in our opinion. We look forward to sharing a better dining experience in the next issue!
