

2023 in Review













With sadness, we said goodbye to three renowned women in Barefoot Bay this year. Wilma Weiglein, a previous Trustee and Chairman of the Board of Trustees (BOT) and President of the previously named HOA (now the CVO), passed away earlier this year. She was a driving force in our community from the early 2000s. Prior to Wilma being on the BOT, Jeanne Osborne also played a pivotal role in the early days of the Barefoot Bay Recreation District (BBRD). She moved to an assisted care facility this year. Finally, Jean White passed away at 104, one of the oldest members of our community. All three will be missed and remembered for their friendship and devotion to our community. Women have played an important role in our community from the beginning, and a new force has been added to our BOT as Elaine VanBerschot was elected to the BOT this past November. She will step into the shoes of the powerful women who have volunteered for this community over the years. She remains the current CVO President and will join the BOT this January.

The weather in 2023 was fantastic! Even though we had the fourth most-named Atlantic storm in history, a strong El Nino sent almost every storm to the north long before we had to fret here on the east coast. We can only hope that the 2024 season is as uneventful since any major storm hitting our community will be devastating, especially with more and more residents passing on wind coverage as insurers flee the state, canceling policies everywhere, and insurance costs skyrocketing. What will we do if a large number of homes are destroyed, and people can't afford to rebuild? Our DOR requires you to replace your home with a new double-wide home that can easily cost \$250,000+ and requires a mortgage for many, which would also require insurance that will rarely cover more than \$100,000 in losses. Can our community survive after a devastating storm with this DOR rule as our only option?

Gratefully, sales of homes in Barefoot Bay remain strong, with prices falling slightly in the latter part of the year, most likely from mortgage rates and insurance costs eroding homeowner budgets. Even with the financial challenges, home sales are still averaging \$200,000, including one home that sold this year for over \$300,000 (and wasn't even on the golf course). Though there are still good deals to be found, the days of purchasing a \$50,000 home in Barefoot Bay appear to be long gone.

The Palm Bay annexation of land between I-95 and Dottie Drive is a big deal. Dix Developments has this land under contract and will be building thousands of homes as well as over 5M sq ft of retail space. Their development, Ashton Park, is a golf cart-friendly community and will feature a town hall and a K-8 school that will significantly shorten bus rides for our youngest residents. Understandably, the new school and retail development won't begin construction until there are at least enough new residents to warrant the investment. Even with the best developments, home sales take time, and Dix Developments is expecting a 20-25-year buildout of the area. Expect 10-15 sales a month when these lots become available (and that's on the high side). Though Palm Bay is behind in providing utilities for the annexed land, Dix Developments is expected to start pushing dirt by the third quarter of 2024.

The 2023-24 budget was a nightmare for the BBRD and the BOT. Prices for everything increased dramatically from 2022 to 2023, and we had limited options for covering our operating costs this new budget year. Though inflation won't have as big an impact, the 2024-25 budget will still have to deal with a 9% increase in wages for our minimum wage employees, who make up a majority of our paid employees. Budget talks will begin in January since the budget must be finalized by July. These budget meetings are public, and if you want your voice heard, you need to show up. The BOT won't be able to make up shortfalls with fee increases or our annual "capped" special assessment, so we can assume that something will have to be cut to accommodate the higher wages.

The Tattler investigation into collusion by several Trustees and Senior Managers to fire Community Manager Kent Cichon and two Trustees, who we were told broke the Sunshine Law, is concluded without any additional evidence to support the claims. BBRD did their best to provide documentation as FOIA requested, but asking for phone records and emails requires full cooperation from those whom the material is requested and without significant resources to pursue legal action and/or a deep forensic investigation into deleted emails/ text messages, etc. we have to take these individuals at their word. With the two Senior Managers no longer working for BBRD and the seating of a new Trustee in January, of the three Trustees accused, only two remain on the Board. Both will be up for reelection come November, assuming they run again. The Trustees have been put on notice. People are watching and more than willing to step up and have their voices heard as they did in October. The Tattler will not hesitate to pursue any future improprieties by our government officials if and when they are brought to our attention.

As we end 2023, we are coming up on the return of the Barefoot by the Lake – 6th Annual Music, Art, & Food Festival, which had a record 5,000 visitors last year enjoying the food, music, and vendors. The annual event will return in early February and The Tattler will be printing the Festival map in the center section of the next issue. This is the biggest event of the year for Barefoot Bay, and we look forward to seeing you there. Come by our table and say hi!

Finally, please look into this issue for two new columns. G-A+Z-ETTE (page 10) will feature news and activities for our youngest residents, Generation Z and Generation A. We thank Becky Culp for volunteering to write this column for the youngest among us. We are also introducing Date Night Reviews (page 9). These will be unsolicited reviews of restaurants and other entertainment options providing our honest opinions regarding our once-a-month date night experiences. Karen and I hope you enjoy our recommendations as we get out a little more in 2024 and enjoy the fringe benefits of writing for The Tattler.

How to Keep Those Pesky New Year's Resolutions

Can you believe it? 2024 is already here! And, of course, we can't start our New Year without making some resolutions, all the ways we're going to improve ourselves this year, right? Well, the truth is, writing resolutions is easy, but keeping them is not so much. That truism – for all of us – is a running theme in your questions; below, we answer a few of them.

Q: Every year, I make a list of New Year's resolutions, and usually, I only achieve one or two of them (out of about 20!), which just makes me feel worse. Would I be better off not making them in the first place?

A: If it makes you feel worse to make a list that you mostly don't live up to, then yes, you're probably better off not making one. Having said that, we offer a useful list of different ways to keep your resolutions (scroll down) that might make for a better alternative than simply not penning any resolutions at all

Q: Every year as long as I can remember, my father would write down his New Year's resolutions – and he would live up to them. But in the past few years, since he turned 80, he's started to "fail" (as he would put it) at achieving a few of them. I told him to stop making resolutions, but that just made him more upset. Any suggestions?

A: If it's important for your father to continue to make resolutions, help him tweak the resolutions themselves. As in, write down resolutions that he can actually achieve. He may be a little resistant to the 'simpler' goals, but he should try to push through that resistance because ultimately when he achieves them, it's most likely he will feel a sense of accomplishment. Additional ways for your dad to achieve his New Year's goals will be provided below.

Q: I'll cut to the chase: how do I keep my New Year's resolutions – especially those that involve exercise?

A: Firstly, you're in a popular club. The vast majority of New Year's resolutions include working out more, but many people who make this goal do not actually follow through with it. But this does not mean you should simply discard the goal altogether. Below are suggestions on how to keep your New Year's resolutions, including your goal to exercise more in the New Year:

1) Be realistic. As in, don't make pie-inthe-sky goals: make goals that, with some effort, you can achieve. Let's take the goal of exercise. If you haven't been jogging in six months, don't put down 'jog two miles every three days.' Start with a one-mile walkrun goal a few days a week and build up to your ultimate goal of jogging two miles a few times a week, even if it takes you six months or more to reach said goal. The benefit of approaching your goal incrementally is that you're much more likely to stick to your long-term regime, as you will feel a sense of accomplishment after successfully reaching your more realistic mini-goals along the way. (* But before you do any of this, you should check with your doctor to make sure that your goals are healthy for your body.)

2) Make less goals. Often, we make so many New Year's resolutions that the sheer number feels overwhelming. When you make a smaller number of goals, they'll feel easier to achieve.

3) Choose goals whose process you'll enjoy, even if challenging. For example, if

your goal is to lose weight and the process by which you plan on achieving that is through a kind of exercise you loathe, you are much more likely to not achieve your objective. Instead, choose a kind of exercise that you maybe enjoy that Zumba class... and you'll forget you even have a goal; you'll be so happy dancing around!

4) Mix it up. Instead of the same old goals as last year, get out of your comfort zone and take that cooking class you've been dreaming about or train to be a docent at your local museum. Whatever it is that you've wanted to do for a while, this is the year!

5) Treasure the present. Our goals are future-based, which too often creates the sense that the future is when you'll finally be happy – after you've achieved your goals. This year, make it one of your goals to simply take at least a few minutes every day to focus consciously on the present moment and feel gratitude for all that you have. Taking deep breaths and long exhales helps with this.

6) Remember, the ordinary is extraordinary. This isn't a goal per se, but ala #5, it will help you realize that in this very moment, you already have everything you need to be happy and fulfilled, so savor your hot cup of coffee in your favorite mug in the morning; bask in the majesty of the sunrise; treasure snuggling with your furry friends; and savor spending time with your tribe - because in the end, that's all that matters.





We just arrived to spend our 22nd winter in Barefoot Bay. We come down each year, rent a nice home, and always feel very welcome here.

A day or two ago, we went over to the office to purchase our park passes. Last year, they cost us \$267.00 for a five-month stay. This year, the passes cost \$642.00, a 240% increase.

So, let's stick it to those renters! Yeah! We'll show them!

Suddenly, we don't feel so welcome anymore!

Editor's Note: Welcome back. While you were gone, the Barefoot Bay Recreation District (BBRD) and the Board of Trustees dealt with serious increases in our budget, including a mandated minimum wage increase, skyrocketing insurance costs, and inflationary pressures on everything we purchase. BBRD is locked into increasing homeowners' annual special assessments by no more than the CPI, regardless of how much our costs have increased. The discretionary fees were our only option to make up for budget deficits. The fees have not been increased in years, to your advantage as renters for the past 22 years. We don't dislike renters, but we also don't want to see our services cut. Our upcoming budget will be equally as difficult; though inflation is down, the mandated minimum wage will haunt our budget until 2026.

This is concerning your articles about BFB sunshine laws, etc., being broken.

April Krueger and I would like to know if you are also contacting the Attorney General, Ashley Moody, about what is going on. We have a draft letter created to send, but maybe we can work together on this. We know that possibly it goes further than what is stated in your articles. I love poker. I started playing when I was a teenager. We played stud, baseball, inbetween (acey-deucey), and various games with wild cards. As with all young gamblers, luck played the biggest factor when determining who left with a pocket full of cash and who left broke. I left broke frequently. I also had my run-ins with conmen, losing my entire paycheck one day when my full house got beat by a better full house under the most suspicious of circumstances. A valuable lesson.

Since those early days, I've come to appreciate playing Texas Hold'em and Omaha and have entered hundreds of poker tournaments. I prefer tournaments over cash

games simply because I know what my investment is and what my potential return could be. I'm a small stakes player and love playing the \$60 dollar Friday night tournament at Club 52 in Melbourne, the only poker club in Brevard County. Many times over the past two decades, I've turned that small investment into a \$700-\$800 windfall.

My friend Scott Windwood and I recently played in different tournaments on the same weekend. He traveled a couple of hours south to the Hard Rock Casino poker room to play a World Poker Tour (WPT) event. His buy-in was \$400 for a shot at a \$2M prize pool, while I played the semi-annual \$100,000 tournament at Club 52 for a \$360 entry fee. I had enough for one entry, where Scott would be bringing \$1200 for multiple reentries if needed. The extra "bullets" allow Scott to play aggressively while building an early stack, where my single buy-in limits my options to premium hands (AA, KK, AK, etc) and little room for error. As poker goes, I had two full houses in the first three hands I played, losing one hand and chopping the other. Finding myself going in the wrong direction, I managed to hold on for a few hours but, unfortunately, was knocked out of the tourney when my pocket 1010 lost to my opponent's pocket KK. Frustrating, but losing in tournaments is the norm since only 10-15% of the field actually makes the money, and you have to make the final table in any tournament to win the big money.

Since I was the first to get knocked out, I rooted for Scott. Scott had his way with the poker gods early at the Hard Rock. He had started the tournament with 20,000 chips and had built his stack close to 180,000

Started with perfectly fried conch fritters, hot and crispy on the outside, soft and moist inside, served with a spicy, perfectly paired remoulade.

Most of you remember the original *Godzilla* that came out in 1956 (we saw it on Creature Features more than once). It was in black and white and terribly dubbed, but watching Godzilla tear up miniature cities was a blast. We've also had at least 29 different Godzilla spinoffs, some more worthy of our attention than others.

The latest version is a film by Takashi Yamazaki entitled *Godzilla Minus One*, which is still playing in theaters around the area due to positive reviews. The movie was filmed in Japanese and is subtitled in English. Understandably, some people do not enjoy foreign films for that reason, but that's a shame since *Godzilla Minus One* is probably the best Godzilla movie we've ever seen. Postwar Tokyo is not an easy life, and



shame prevents him from pursuing a romantic relationship, though his love and care for the woman and child are evident. Years of struggle pass before Godzilla returns, wreaking havoc upon Tokyo, taking his adopted family away from him, and providing him one last opportunity for redemption.

The special effects are fantastic, but it's the tear-jerking love story that makes this film worth watching. Burabo!

before hitting a run of bad luck and, in three hands, got knocked out an hour before the money bubble was broken. He had lasted all day on a single \$400 buy-in. He took a break for dinner and joined the last flight of players fighting to make "the money" on the final day. Sometimes, it's your day, and everything goes your way. Other days... not so much. Scott quickly went through two more \$400 entries before determining it was "not my day." We both had high hopes and aspirations and, like a majority of poker players, ended up going home with nothing to show for our efforts.

When it comes to playing poker in Florida, there are plenty of options. There are many poker clubs around the state besides Club 52 in Melbourne. Daytona has a poker club, both Hard Rocks have poker rooms, and most of the casinos in the Miami area offer poker as an option to slot machines and roulette, etc. Most offer No Limit Texas Hold'em and Omaha at different stakes, and most run their own tournaments. I have played around the state and would love to play poker more often, but as we're all aware, you have to use common sense and not gamble the rent money. My \$60 every week or two doesn't break the bank.

Barefoot Bay has its own poker club that meets every Thursday between 5 and 9 pm in Building C. I joined them a few weeks ago and had flashbacks to my days as a teen. They play limit-poker and a variety of games (dealer's choice) to keep things interesting and reasonable, but for me, luck is too much of a factor when you can't put pressure on

those who would call with any two cards. Bluffing is a big part of poker, and there are few opportunities to get it "all in" when playing limit poker. The local poker club is a great source of fun and socializing. You'll limit your losses (and your winnings) and make new friends. Please note you should plan on getting there early and hope they have enough players and seats to accommodate everyone who wants to play. The long-term players get priority over the new kids on the block, which is fair. You should bring about \$30-\$40 in quarters. Here's to hoping they have enough new members to support another poker table!

Playing online poker is illegal in Florida. I have found ways to play online previously, but honestly, it's too much of a hassle to play poker on the illegal sites when you can't simply use your bank account to buy chips and almost always were paid back in Bitcoin. About a year ago, I joined a legal online poker club (ClubGG.net) where you pay a monthly \$50 membership and can play poker anytime, 24 hours a day. You're given free entries into tournaments where you can practice playing, and "winners" receive tickets into bigger tournaments, including tournaments with cash prizes, such as a \$10,000 seat at the World Series of Poker in Las Vegas. I have won a variety of tournaments on ClubGG, but I'm going to have to keep trying if I'm ever going to get a seat for the Main Event. Based on my skill level, I can't imagine ever having \$10k that I can justify blowing on a single tournament. Sigh.

We know that poker is a skill game, but you can still wish me luck. I could use some in my next tournament!

Noise Regulations Revised by County Commissioners

On August 22, 2023, the Board unanimously passed an amendment to the Brevard County Code related to noise regulation. Concerns were initially brought to the Board by residents who reside near short-term rentals, which were generating an excessive amount of noise in otherwise quiet residential communities.

The amendment passed by the Board creates more objective and clear guidelines as to what noise level is permissible within areas in unincorporated Brevard. From 7 am to 10 pm, noises that are "plainly audible" from 300 feet are subject to enforcement. This distance was reduced to 150 feet during the hours of 10 pm to 7 am. The former language in the Brevard County code described an enforceable noise as "loud and raucous," which was determined to be too subjective, causing issues for enforcement officers to determine whether or not someone is violating the code.

Once a complaint is made, either a Brevard County Code Enforcement Officer or a Brevard County Sheriff's Office Deputy will respond to the complaint. If the enforcement officer finds there is a violation of the code, a warning is then issued to the violator, in which they are required to reduce the noise within a reasonable amount of time. Should the person choose not to cooperate or violate the code again after the first warning, the person shall be subject to a penalty. An absentee owner shall be responsible for any tenants or guests on their property and will receive a citation after two warnings issued by an enforcement officer within a 12-month time frame.

The code continues to allow for exemptions such as schools, gun ranges, festivals or concerts, law enforcement, etc. I believe the passage of this amendment was a positive change toward ensuring peaceful environments for our residential neighborhoods.


