Rules of the Road Revisited

Two different golf cart accidents occurred in June on Micco Rd, leaving two golf carts destroyed and a woman with injuries. The first accident occurred when the driver of the golf cart apparently lost control of the cart, flipping it onto the railroad tracks. The immobile golf cart was subsequently hit by a Brightline train, destroying the cart. It's unknown if the train sustained damage. Gratefully, no one was injured.

The second accident resulted in a collision between an SUV and a golf cart crossing Micco Rd at Ron Beatty. The golf cart was badly damaged, and the woman had unknown but apparently serious injuries. Neither golf cart should have been where they were when these accidents occurred. Golf carts are only allowed to cross Micco Rd at East Rd and at Sebastian Rd/Egret. Golf carts are not allowed on any sidewalk or easement the entire length of Micco Rd or US1 unless registered, licensed, and insured similar to any other motor vehicle, and then only allowed to drive on Micco Rd itself, not the sidewalks.

We are reprinting the Rules of the Road below for those unaware of what and where you can drive your golf carts in Barefoot Bay and the surrounding area. Though it is two years old, the information is still accurate. Nothing has changed.

The Golf Cart Club hosted an informational meeting on July 20, 2022, with the Brevard County Sheriff's Office regarding the "rules of the road" when driving a golf cart in Barefoot Bay. Barefoot Bay has not always been a golf cart community in the general sense we know today. Less than 15 years ago, you were only allowed to drive your golf cart from your home to the golf course and back. No visiting friends and certainly no cruising the Boulevard to the Winn Dixie for groceries. The Brevard County commissioners, after successful lobbying efforts by the BOT and our legal representation at the time, agreed to allow golf cart use on the county roads within Barefoot Bay with two crossings on Micco Road and extending the use to the Winn Dixie entrance on Barefoot Boulevard.

The Florida State and Brevard County rules and regulations for driving a golf cart in Barefoot Bay have not changed since that day. First and foremost, when driving a golf cart (or low-speed vehicle), you must obey the rules of the road as if you were driving a car. You should make complete stops and signal your turns, either by hand or blinker. You can drive a golf cart after dark, but only with adequate headlights, tail lights, and a windshield. These are commonly known facts, though we've all seen examples where even the simplest things are forgotten by some golf cart drivers (like stopping at stop signs).

The BCS officer surprised the crowd when he advised golf cart owners they could be ticketed if found driving in the pedestrian lane on Barefoot Blvd. When asked if a golf cart driver should pull over for motor vehicles behind them, the officer told us no, the golf cart must remain in the motor vehicle lane. The driver of a motor vehicle risks receiving a ticket if observed following too closely or unsafely passing a golf cart, even if that golf cart is traveling at very low speeds.

Many in the meeting pointed out that no longer being allowed to drive on the pedway could be dangerous due to impatient drivers and 'road rage,' but per BCS, it is not only the law; it has always been the law. The striped lane on Barefoot Boulevard is for pedestrians only. Golf carts and bikes must share the road with motor vehicles.

Accordingly, motor vehicles within Barefoot Bay must share the road with a golf cart as if it were any other motor vehicle. The speed limit is 25mph everywhere in Barefoot Bay, and most golf carts travel 18mph+, but some may drive much slower. Those needing to get to work via US1 should plan their commute accordingly. There are five side streets to Micco Road and off the Boulevard (East, Pinewood, Midway, Lark, and Bird). Golf carts on Barefoot Boulevard do not have to pull over for a motor vehicle behind them and also accept the risk of getting ticketed if caught crossing the lines into the pedway. There are no other marked







A Word From Your **Recreation District Chair**

BOT Happenings:

05/28/24

The BOT approved the staff-recommended Proposed Budget Mailout. It announced June 25, 2024, at 3 pm in Building D/E, as the date, time, and location of the public hearing for the adoption of the annual assessment in addition to the adoption of the FY25 Budget.

The cost of printing the mailout has increased 47 percent over last year. Mr. Cichon suggested that the Board may wish to consider other options for the future, such as emailing the budget mailout to all residents and having hard copies available at the Administration Building. Our attorney, Mr. Olsen, confirmed that the language in the charter requires that we furnish a copy of the annual budget statement to every parcel owner. In his opinion, furnishing means delivering, but there is no requirement to use

Email delivery will suffice. Paper documents would be physically mailed to the owners who do not have an email address on file. Starting now, the owners' email addresses will be collected and updated so as many emails as possible can be on file. Staff can then use the email method next year for major cost savings.

The need for a Policy Manual Workshop was discussed, and it will be held on August 15th. The trustees and staff will review and update the language in the Manual as needed. As always, the meeting will be open to the public.

06/13/24 Regular BOT meeting was Cancelled

An update for housing information: I visited a local retailer for manufactured housing. I learned that an 800 sq. foot single-wide (14x60) retails about the same as an 800 sq. foot double-wide (24x36). There are smaller single-wides but no double-wides to compare them to. Under the current DOR, any manufactured home installed on a property in Barefoot Bay Recreation District after 1999 must be 20 feet wide or greater. Singlewide homes are a few feet less than that minimum. To change the DOR to allow a smaller width, an ad hoc committee must first be formed to make a list of changes. At the conclusion of the committee, the new DOR language will be presented to the board of trustees. After approval, a printed ballot must be created and mailed to the lot owners on file. Note: these will be addressed to the lot owner, who is not necessarily the resident at the address. The ballots must be returned, and then each change must be counted and tabulated. This process takes a long time, costing many thousands

I also visited a local insurance agency. A certified modular house, which is allowed by the DOR, is considered the same as a "stick-built" house by insurance companies, and the cost to insure is less than that of a manufactured house. A modular house is also built to stricter standards and can withstand stronger winds than a manufactured house. Additionally, unlike a manufactured house, the coverage does not go down as the house ages.



Living with COPD

Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) occurs when airflow in the lungs is obstructed. According to the World Health Organization, it is the third leading cause of death worldwide and the sixth leading cause of death in the United States, according to the American Lung Association (ALA). COPD is not curable but can be treated and managed with the help of a physician and by maintaining a healthy lifestyle.

Q. My dad was just diagnosed with COPD. Can you explain exactly what that is?

A. COPD is a lung disease that blocks the airflow as a person exhales, therefore making it difficult to breathe. The two main forms of COPD are emphysema and asthmatic bronchitis.

Q. Both of my grandparents have COPD. I'm afraid I might get it. Is there any way to prevent it?

A. The best way to prevent COPD is to refrain from smoking. Tobacco smoke is the leading cause of COPD, and long-term exposure to tobacco smoke greatly increases your odds of developing this pulmonary disease. If you already are a smoker, you should quit immediately. If you need assistance in quitting, you should consult your physician about nicotine replacement products and

If you do not smoke, you should limit your long-term exposure to secondhand smoke. Even secondhand smoke can contain certain toxic chemicals such as benzene, carbon monoxide, and cyanide. Particles from secondhand smoke can stay in the air for hours, so prolonged exposure can increase your risk of developing COPD.

Q. I think I may have COPD. Can you tell me what typical symptoms are and what I should do if it turns out I have COPD?

A. The symptoms of COPD may include shortness of breath, wheezing, coughing, and tightness of the chest. COPD develops slowly over time, so the long-term effects of these symptoms can cause serious damage. In severe cases, basic activities such as walking, getting dressed, and light exercise can cause shortness of breath and make it difficult to complete these tasks.

If you think that you might suffer from COPD, you should consult your physician.

There are a few tests your physician might conduct to determine the cause of your symptoms:

- Arterial blood gas analysis Blood is taken from an artery and tested for how well your lungs bring oxygen to your blood.
- Sputum examination—The mucus, or sputum, you might cough up is analyzed, which can help rule out certain cancers.
- Spirometry test- A clamp will go over your noise, and you will breathe into a tube while trying to exhale as hard as you can. The tube is attached to the spirometer, which will measure the airflow rate.
- **Q.** If you have COPD, what is the treatment for it?

A. Since COPD is caused by long-term lung damage, there is no cure for this disease. However, there are some treatments to help control your symptoms and reduce the risk of further damage to your lungs.

If you are a smoker, the first thing that you should do is stop smoking immediately. This is a vital step to take to ensure that your symptoms do not progress into more serious problems.

There are a few medications you can take to treat your respiratory ailment. A bronchodilator is a medication that usually comes in the form of an inhaler and relaxes your airways. Inhaled steroids can also help by reducing the inflammation in your airways. Antibiotics can assist with and help fight infections. All medications should be taken under the care of a physician.

Oxygen therapy might be recommended if you are not getting enough oxygen. Patients can use oxygen when doing light activities or sleeping. Portable oxygen tanks are useful for daily activities.

Q. What kind of lifestyle can I have with COPD?

- **A.** There might be some activities you have to give up when living with COPD. However, there are various things you can do to help you manage living with COPD:
- Ask your doctor for breathing techniques to use throughout the day when you feel short of breath.
- Keeping yourself healthy with exercise and diet will keep the rest of your body strong.
- Vaccinate yourself to help avoid worsening of symptoms. Vaccinations are the greatest defense against respiratory illnesses such as influenza and pneumonia.
- Minimize cold air exposure to help avoid triggering shortness of breath.



WHAT DO YOU CALL A DEER WITH NO EYES? NO-EYE-DEER

Dear Valued Patients,

Glaucoma is a stealthy disease of the optic nerve, where prolonged high pressure can lead to irreversible damage. Like blood pressure, we can't feel our eye pressure, making early detection challenging. Primary open-angle glaucoma (POAG), the most common type, often progresses silently, with no symptoms until irreversible nerve damage has occurred. The optic nerve, much like



the cable for your TV, is the only connection between your eyes and your brain.

POAG requires preventive management. However, eye pressure alone isn't enough for diagnosis, as individuals have varying pressure sensitivities. Some with elevated intraocular pressure (IOP) have ocular hypertension (OHTN) but don't develop glaucoma, while others, despite statistically normal pressures, develop normal tension glaucoma (NTG), leading to nerve damage.

Ophthalmologists use specialized tests like optic nerve scans (OCT), photography, and visual field tests to monitor changes over time. The hallmark signs of glaucoma include optic nerve thinning, increased cupping, and peripheral vision loss.

Early diagnosis is crucial, as nerve damage is irreversible. Fortunately, modern treatments like selective laser trabeculoplasty (SLT), prescription eye drops (often blood pressure meds in drop form), and minimally invasive glaucoma surgeries (MIGS) offer effective management. MIGS, often combined with cataract surgery, safely lowers eye pressure with minimal added risk.

Regular eye exams, especially for those with a family history or suspicious optic nerve appearance, are essential. Without testing you will have no-eye-deer—prevention and early intervention are key to preserving your vision and quality of life!



pedestrian zones in Barefoot Bay. Pulling to the side makes sense, regardless of vehicle type, when someone is right behind you, which can be difficult to avoid when you're going less than 25mph.

These facts were also presented during the lively discussion in Building A. Golf carts that can exceed 20 mph must be licensed, registered, and insured and can only be driven by a licensed driver. Golf carts that do not exceed 20 mph can be driven by anyone over the age of 14 years old. You can have no more passengers than seats available. Three people in front of a golf cart would be illegal. A DUI is a DUI, and getting stopped on a golf cart will not save you from jail or an SR22. You can drive your cart to the entrance of the Winn Dixie shopping center, but not along the sidewalk towards the pier, so legally, Family Dollar can not be visited by golf cart, nor can you drive to the Cumberland Farms, because golf carts and low-speed vehicles are not allowed on US1 or any of the trails along US1.

Most importantly, you can cross Micco Rd in a golf cart in only two places, East Drive and Egret Circle/Sebastian Road. It is illegal to cross Micco Road (regardless of signage) from any street other than those two intersections since you cannot drive on Micco Rd. or the sidewalk on Micco Rd. There is an exception to this rule if your golf cart is licensed, tagged, insured, has seat belts, and can travel 25mph, but the golf cart must drive on Micco Road and not the sidewalk. (Infortunately, you cannot take your golf cart to St Luke's (for church, bingo or the thrift shop), even if you live on the south side of Barefoot Bay, because you cannot drive on Micco Rd or the sidewalk on Micco Rd. One of the most dangerous things we can do in Barefoot Bay is cross Micco Road in a golf cart, broadside and unprotected, even at the approved intersections.

Many of the residents were new and appreciated the efforts of the BCS and the Golf Cart Club to make them aware of the legalities associated with driving a golf cart through Barefoot Bay. Additional efforts are being made by the Golf Cart Club to add or change information signage and to permit access to Kiwi Drive across Fleming Grant Road, but these are for future consideration by the county and are unlikely to happen anytime soon. For those that find these rules "different than it was," these are the legal rules of the road in Barefoot Bay. For those that are "gonna do what I want," if you get pulled over and ticketed by BCS, it will probably only cost you \$60+ for a ticket and some minor annoyance, but it only takes one serious injury or death to prompt Brevard County to reconsider our golf cart privileges in Barefoot Bay, an amenity you may not have even considered an amenity. Follow the rules of the road, and drive with care.





O Beautiful for Spacious Skies

The great hymn we are going to look at today, a day on a holiday weekend, is what I like most about "O Beautiful for Spacious Skies." It is something so biblical, and that is its position. Now, its lyrics were penned in conjunction with a trip to Pike's Peak in Colorado. Katherine Lee Bates, an English professor at Wellesley College in Boston, visited that mountaintop in 1893 and began a poem inspired by the view. A Baptist minister later put the words to a tune someone else wrote. In the end, we have a piece some say is an alternative national

anthem. But when I say "position," I do not mean a mountaintop. Rather, what I mean is that the hymn is both in America and beside it.

Abraham was called to leave his country and follow God. Abraham became, in that stepping out of his home in Ur of the Chaldees, a God-person first and a Chaldean second. He, I think we might say, loved Ur of the Chaldees, but he also, heeding the call of God, stepped out of it. He had been in, and then he was beside. That's what I mean by position.

This is important because sometimes, to see something rightly, you have to be in it and also beside it. If you want to see your automobile correctly, you have to be in it, but you also have to get out and walk around it. Katherine Lee Bates, in this hymn, exults in the purple mountains of America as she stands there on Pike's Peak. She's in her homeland, loving it. But then she steps out of it as it were and prays for it – "God, shed thy grace on thee (America)." When you sing this hymn, you are in America appreciating it and, beside it, praying for it.


