One area where the website has become especially valuable is weather coverage.

My amateur weather reports have moved to BarefootBay.com. Hurricane season is now underway, and while forecasters are expecting a quieter season thanks in part to a historically strong El Niño pattern reducing favorable conditions in the Atlantic, we all know that "fewer storms" doesn't mean "no storms."

It only takes one.

And hurricanes aren't our only concern. Flooding, tornadoes, severe thunderstorms,

lightning, and wildfires are all part of life in Florida.

Whatever the weather decides to do, we'll do our best to keep you informed as it happens.

Did you know Aldi has a "Twice as Nice" Guarantee? If you're not satisfied with an eligible Aldi-brand food item, they'll refund your money and replace the product. Just save your receipt and bring back the packaging and unused portion. It's a great policy to remember if your milk goes bad unexpectedly or if you try something that simply isn't to your taste.

I recently posted one of my favorite salmon recipes online. It doesn't get much easier. Place 4-ounce Atlantic salmon portions on a parchment-lined cookie sheet, spread a little softened butter mixed with dill over the top, and bake at 400 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes.

That's a much more enjoyable story to write than another article about homeless camps near the Pier.

But sometimes important stories need to be covered.

Recently, we reported on concerns involving individuals camping on private property near the Pier. Thanks to the efforts of local residents and the Brevard County Sheriff's Office, the situation was addressed, and trespass warnings were issued.

Barefoot Bay remains one of the safest communities in Florida, but common sense still applies. Whether you're walking near the Pier, along one of the trails, or around the ponds and lakes, especially when you're alone, stay aware of your surroundings.

If you see something that doesn't look right, report it.

Another story that generated plenty of discussion this month was Florida's proposed property tax amendment.

I've already gone on record with my prediction.

It's going to pass.

Homeowners will occasionally vote for a tax increase when they understand the benefit. They'll almost always vote for a tax cut.

I understand the appeal. Based on my own numbers, I'll probably save around \$700 a year if the proposal reaches its full implementation.

Who wouldn't like an extra \$700?

The question that interests me isn't

whether it passes. The question is what happens afterward.

Will counties make up the difference with new fees? Will road projects get delayed? Will some services receive less funding than they otherwise would have? Will southern Brevard County get its fair share of future improvements?

Those are questions worth asking.

The good news is that Barefoot Bay's District government isn't funded by county property taxes, so District operations shouldn't be affected directly. Public schools also appear to be protected under the proposal.

A Word From Your Recreation District Chair

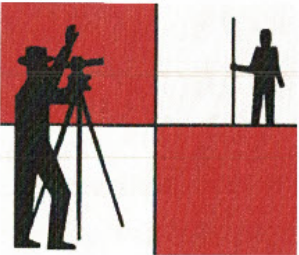

May 14, 2026 Meeting Highlights:
The Board honored past Trustee Dave Wheaton with a moment of silence to commemorate his recent passing.
DOR Violations located at 1010 Ginger Lane, 1002 Robin Drive, 1211 Arcea Drive, and 1106 Oriole Circle were referred to legal counsel.

May 28, 2026 Meeting Highlights:
Chairwoman Van Berschot presented employee appreciation certificates to Sharon Petrillo, for 25 years of service, Leslie Kadlec, for 20 years of service (not present), and Edward Blair, for 5 years of service.
The Board approved a proposed settlement agreement in the case of Pamela Marie Morrison v. Barefoot Bay Recreation District by a 3–2 vote following mediation and continued negotiations. The settlement resolves two consolidated claims involving separate slip-and-fall incidents within the District. Legal counsel recommended approval of the agreement to avoid additional litigation and trial expenses. Trustees discussed concerns regarding litigation costs and potential precedent before approving the agreement.
The Board unanimously approved the Proposed Budget Mailout and scheduled a public hearing for June 23, 2026, at 1 pm in Buildings D/E to consider adoption of the annual assessment and the FY27 Budget.
The Board approved the purchase of a dishwasher for the Lounge.
The Board continued discussion regarding the installation of a barrier at Egret Circle. Staff recommended pursuing a guardrail and advised that placing it within the County right-of-way would require permitting and engineering plans. To reduce costs and simplify the process, staff recommended relocating the guardrail onto District property. The Board reached consensus to proceed with obtaining quotes for installation.
If funding remains available at the end of the fiscal year, Property Services plans to purchase additional chaise lounge chairs for Pool #1. If not, the Board may consider using FY27 discretionary funds after October 1st.
Staff is scheduling paving projects for the shopping center and Veterans Gathering Center, with work anticipated to begin by June.
We encourage all residents to stay informed and participate in upcoming meetings.
The Board and staff held a public hearing June 23, 2026, to consider adoption of the annual assessment and the FY27 Budget.

A Word From Your

County Commissioner

I was pleased to have the opportunity last month to tour the Brevard County Mosquito Control Department at Valkaria Airport and learn more about the vital services it provides for our community. The department operates under the authority of Chapter 388, Florida Statutes, and 5E-13, Florida Administrative Code, and was established as the Brevard Mosquito Control District in 1937. As a special taxing district, it is funded through its own millage rate and operates with an annual budget of \$14,646,948. The district was created to provide both the authority and financial resources necessary to control the large populations of salt marsh mosquitoes, which are the predominant mosquito species found throughout Brevard County, as well as vector mosquito species capable of transmitting mosquito-borne illnesses. Through its comprehensive mosquito control programs, the department plays a critical role in protecting public health, enhancing quality of life, and supporting the county's economic and environmental well-being.

The Brevard County Mosquito Control Department provides residents of Brevard County with the most effective mosquito control using a technique called Integrated Pest Management. These techniques include chemical control for both larvae and adult mosquitoes, biocontrol that includes the use of native (mosquito-eating) mosquitofish, and other biological means. Mechanical control and drones are another successful technique, which includes the management of mosquito impoundments, tire removal, aerial adulticide, and truck treatments. All these methods are used to their fullest potential to provide effective and environmentally sound mosquito control for the citizens of Brevard County.

The Brevard County Mosquito Control Department operates one of the largest source reduction programs in the state of Florida. This non-chemical control has been achieved by impounding salt marshes and flooding these impoundments with water during the mosquito breeding season, thus denying salt marsh mosquitoes an area on which to lay their eggs. The department manages over 28 thousand acres of these impoundments, which also includes over 100 water control structures, 11 pumping stations, and maintenance of approximately 30 miles of dikes. In conjunction with these impounded areas, the department actively participates in a Rotational Impoundment Management program in cooperation with the St. John's River Water Management District (SJRWMD). These impounded areas represent a huge potential source for primary and secondary fish and wildlife habitat. The department continues to coordinate with agencies like the Florida State Parks and SJRWMD to manage these impoundments in the lagoon system for the purpose of conservation. This work not only supports the ecological function of these impoundments, but it also enhances the department's ability to control mosquitoes in these areas.

During the warmer months, mosquitoes breed and develop faster. Do you have mosquitoes in your house and yard? It may be time to check your yard for breeding locations. Don't overlook a single small pool of water, even if there is no mosquito larvae present; they will be back. A half-cup of water can produce enough mosquitoes to cause a problem.

Potential Problem Areas for Mosquito breeding include:

- Potted plants with pans underneath that hold water, standing water in low grassy areas, tire tracks, and swales can breed mosquitoes
- Roof gutters with plugged leaves hold water and mosquito larvae
- Water in pet dishes should be replaced every couple of days
- Trash or spare parts and the like. Remove items or cover what cannot be thrown away
- Old tires
- Kiddy wading pools
- Flat roofs that get lots of leaf litter. Removing the debris should solve the problem
- Boats on trailers, dry-docked or unused, will collect water and breed mosquitoes

There are several products that will assist you in reducing mosquitoes around your home. Lowes, Home Depot, and other gardening stores may carry foggers and products that help to reduce and/or repel mosquitoes. 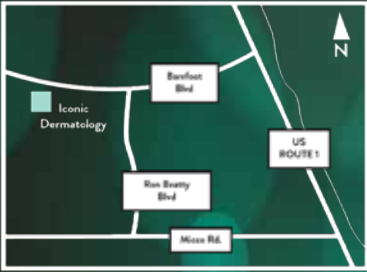

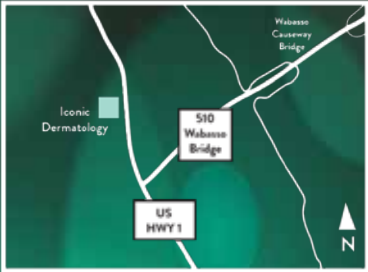

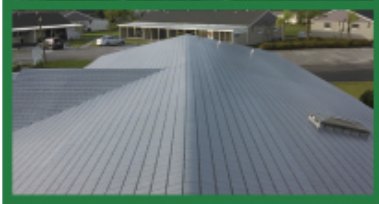

WHAT DO YOU CALL A DEER WITH NO EYES? NO-EYE-DEER

Dear Valued Patients,

Glaucoma is a stealthy disease of the optic nerve, where prolonged high pressure can lead to irreversible damage. Like blood pressure, we can't feel our eye pressure, making early detection challenging. Primary open-angle glaucoma (POAG), the most common type, often progresses silently, with no symptoms until irreversible nerve damage has occurred. The optic nerve, much like the cable for your TV, is the only connection between your eyes and your brain.



POAG requires preventive management. However, eye pressure alone isn't enough for diagnosis, as individuals have varying pressure sensitivities. Some with elevated intraocular pressure (IOP) have ocular hypertension (OHTN) but don't develop glaucoma, while others, despite statistically normal pressures, develop normal tension glaucoma (NTG), leading to nerve damage.

Ophthalmologists use specialized tests like optic nerve scans (OCT), photography, and visual field tests to monitor changes over time. The hallmark signs of glaucoma include optic nerve thinning, increased cupping, and peripheral vision loss.

Early diagnosis is crucial, as nerve damage is irreversible. Fortunately, modern treatments like selective laser trabeculoplasty (SLT), prescription eye drops (often blood pressure meds in drop form), and minimally invasive glaucoma surgeries (MIGS) offer effective management. MIGS, often combined with cataract surgery, safely lowers eye pressure with minimal added risk.

Regular eye exams, especially for those with a family history or suspicious optic nerve appearance, are essential. Without testing you will have no-eye-deer—prevention and early intervention are key to preserving your vision and quality of life!

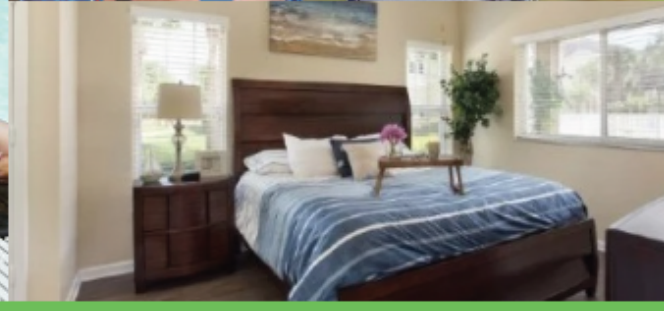

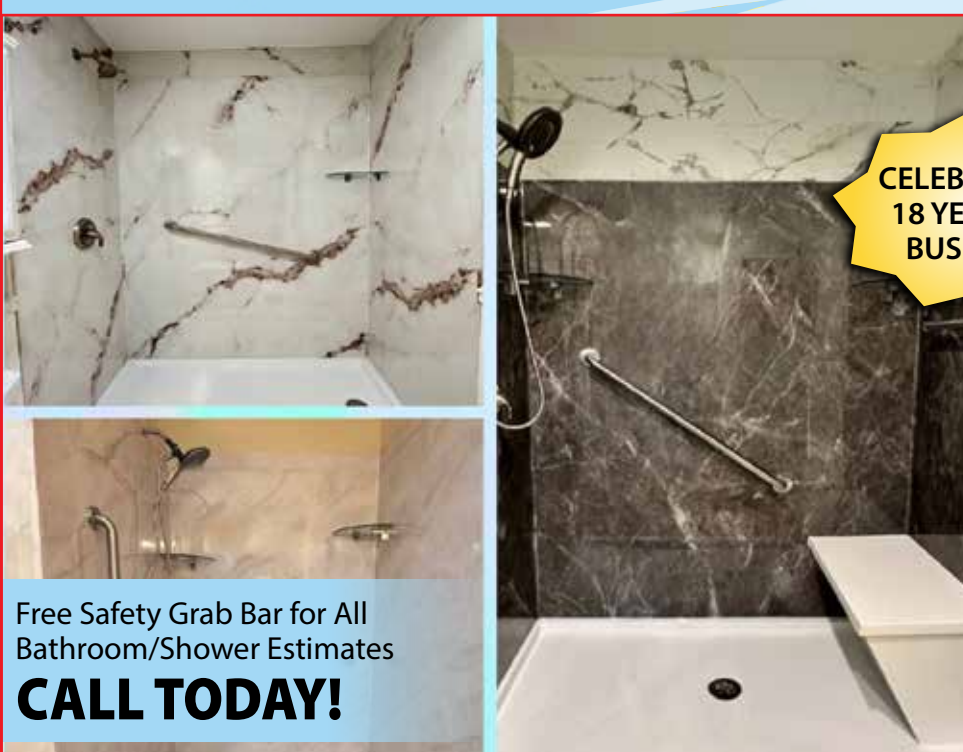

COMPUTER AND TECHNOLOGY CLUB

Welcome to summer! Hopefully, one of your indoor projects involves getting ready for any emergency. We keep hearing about hurricane season, but weather emergencies can happen in any season, and the threat of a flood or fire is also a possibility in any season. The recent Hurricane Preparation presentation from the Brevard County Emergency Operations Center reminded everyone to prepare now. That means checking your evacuation supplies- batteries, weather radio, first aid kit, supply of medications, and of course, food and water. Also include those important phone numbers- doctors, repair people, insurance (car and house) policies, and service providers like Florida Power, Barefoot Bay Utilities, and Waste Management. It is also time to look for ways to provide backup power for items you use every day- phones, tablets, and computers, rechargeable hearing aids, and any device using a USB connection. Look for rechargeable power units- some charge electrically and store enough energy for two or more charges. Larger models have higher charging capacity, and there are solar models that could save the day if a power outage lasts for

several days. You can do an online search or check stores that sell electronics to compare pricing and capacity. These devices do need to be charged in advance. Another valuable tip from the EOC was to make sure your evacuation kit is portable. John Scott, Director of the EOC, suggested using an old suitcase- the kind with wheels on it. If you don't have one, check the thrift stores - it doesn't have to be pretty- just portable and something you can manage on your own. If you would like to download more Hurricane Preparation tips, go to the Brevard County EOC. Their website contains information about signing up for medical needs shelters, needs for pet-friendly shelters, and general use shelters, transportation to shelters, and what you need to take for your comfort at a shelter. Have you signed up for alerts through the Barefoot Bay website and the Brevard County EOC? Emergency information can be sent to your home phone and cell phone. Get prepared now and enjoy your summer.

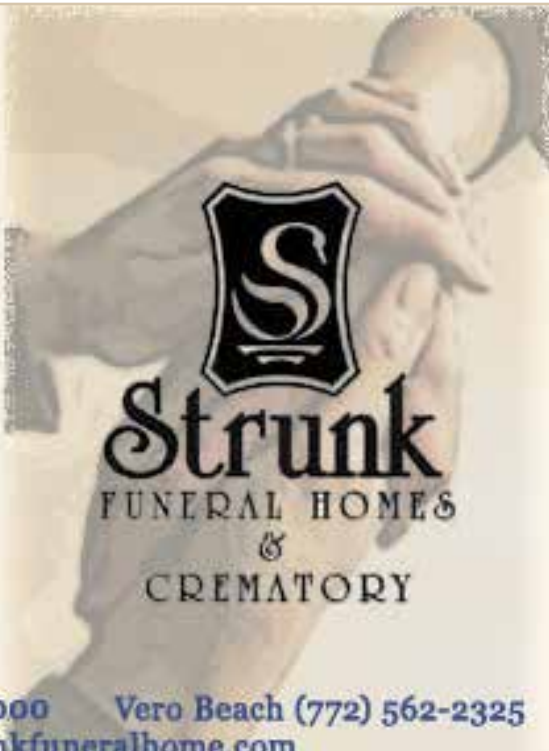

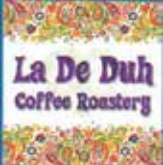
