Early Summer Musings



There's something about these long, hot, quiet summers. I'm not exactly sure why, but they remind me of my youth. Those dry summer days in Colorado were nothing like what we experience here in Florida, so it's not about the weather. I've got a great job, I'm happy, I'm healthy — and much can be said for having a place like Barefoot Bay to call home. It's cliché to suggest I don't have a care in the world, but truthfully, I didn't have any cares at all when I was a kid — and living here, I feel younger every day.

For many of our newest readers, welcome! You may, or may not, be aware of our little community just off US-1. Some may have noticed our sign and our pier, but many of our neighbors, even those who have lived here for years, still don't know very much about Barefoot Bay. Some think we're a gated community. Nope, no gates. Some think we're 55+. Nope, we have lots of younger families in Barefoot Bay. Some have no grasp of the size of our community. Yes, almost 4900 homes! Curious about our community and how we see ourselves? Enjoy our Welcome to Barefoot Bay spread in the center of this issue.

Now, back to the weather. As we enter a typical "busier than normal" hurricane season, we're reminded that preparation matters. And you should start sooner rather than later. Batteries, water, and other essentials can all be purchased now, well before a storm is headed our way. This is not the year to wait for necessities. Get them while you can.

I'll be continuing my amateur weather updates on the Forum at BarefootBay.com (register for updates!) and posting links on Facebook as well. I appreciate all of you who've complimented me on my past storm coverage — we'll continue that coverage on our new platform. See you there.

The soft launch of BarefootBay.com continues to have its ups and downs, but we're aiming for a bug-free, full launch by the end of June. From the feedback we've received, people are excited about the potential and eager to use the site. Based on early analytics, residents are logging on regularly, even with new content being added sparingly over the past month. We're proud to report over 300 registered users and growing daily.

Sometime in the next 60 days, homeowners will receive a ballot proposing changes to the Deed of Restrictions (DOR). These recommended changes were developed and approved by the AdHoc Committee and presented to the Board of Trustees. Four of the five proposed questions made the ballot, including the most significant zoning change in nearly 30 years. If approved, the new rule would permit homes no less than 600 square feet — consistent with Brevard County zoning — and eliminate the outdated 20' x 34' minimum size requirement. I fully support this update and hope the majority of our community will see the value in it. It ensures that, in the event of disaster, residents will have every opportunity to rebuild rather than be forced to walk away. Please vote YES on all four questions.

The new Barefoot Bay Recreation District budget will have been voted on by the time this issue is out — and yes, it went up a little. But these small, steady increases are expected. We still get the best value of any similar community in Florida. A few quick notes: the cost of an annual pass for non-owners was not reduced, as the new rate met revenue expectations. A \$2 walking fee was introduced for the golf course, and annual golf memberships saw a 10% bump — but at under \$1,000, it remains an exceptional value for resident golfers. A special shoutout to Kathy Mendes, our Food & Beverage Manager, for her department's continued outperformance. Her team has delivered positive net revenue for over 18 months. Thank you!

Commissioner Adkinson's column in this issue responds in part to questions I submitted last month at her Meet & Greet, especially concerning the future path of the St. Johns Heritage Parkway (SJHP). Early conceptual drawings from Dix Developments for the Ashton Park project show the SJHP turning south from the I-95 interchange, crossing Micco Road, and winding through their community, before dumping traffic back onto Micco Road just west of us. That traffic almost certainly heads east... toward Barefoot Bay.

As far as I know, the final route for this last stretch of SJHP is still unsettled. My suggestion? Run the road south of Barefoot Bay and the solar farm, straight to US-1, and keep Micco Road from becoming the final two-mile stretch of a high-speed corridor. We still have time to influence this decision and protect both our community and our lifestyle.

We've got about 90 days before the one-week qualifying window opens for candidates interested in the Barefoot Bay Recreation District Board of Trustees election this November. This may seem early, but summer will fly by. If you've ever considered running, now is the time to start thinking about your campaign, talking with neighbors, and preparing. One seat is open, and with Bruce Amoss term-limited, the field is wide open. But it takes at least two candidates to hold an election. Fingers crossed.

The Tattler Expands Into **Grant-Valkaria** (and Crystal Bay)

Future Transportation Planning Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization (SCTPO) Annual Open House

On Tuesday, April 29th, I held a very positive town hall meeting attended by approximately 100 Barefoot Bay residents and heard about a variety of issues, including roads and transportation. One of the advantages of being a local elected official is the ability to make positive changes for the improvement of the community and respond quickly to the needs of the residents. However, not all decisions made by local officials can be made solely by the local government. There are areas where the local governments share jurisdictional responsibility with either federal or state agencies or both. One such example of this multi-jurisdictional relationship existing between the federal, state, and local governments is in transportation projects. Funding for road projects is derived from federal, state, and local resources and may even be combined for individual projects.

Each year, the Florida Legislature appropriates funds to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for projects across the State of Florida. In 24-25, the Legislature appropriated \$15.5 billion for transportation projects. While many states rely heavily on the federal government to fund their transportation infrastructure needs, federal funding accounts for just 24% of Florida's record transportation budget. The state gas taxes make up nearly 70% of revenues going into the State Transportation Trust Fund and are adjusted for inflation. Other revenue sources for the state trust fund include various fees, such as license fees, rental car surcharge, registration fees, and title fees. These sources are not adjusted for inflation, so their buying power diminishes over time.

The Department of Transportation's Budget is divided into several areas. Off the top of the budget includes preservation of the existing transportation system, such as resurfacing and maintenance of state bridges and causeways. A significant amount of dollars is allocated to non-highway projects like airports, seaports, spaceport program, rail, and public transit programs, like bus service. Other portions of the budget are earmarked for safety improvements and enhancement projects, such as sidewalks and trails. The remaining funds are used for priority capacity projects that require either the widening of current roadways or the construction of new ones.

I am pleased to represent District 3 as well as representatives from the various cities and counties to serve on the local planning board, known as the Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization (SCTPO), which reviews the transportation needs for our area and recommends priorities of state funding and construction of new projects. The TPO works in conjunction with the FDOT to schedule and rank projects based on the priorities established by the local government. Many of the state projects require local government matching funds for the total project cost. One of my priorities is widening Babcock Street, Micco Road improvements, and a traffic light at US1 and Valkaria Road. While there are plenty of vital projects, funding is inadequate and continues to decline each year.

Each year, the TPO is faced with funding cuts and construction cost increases that directly impact the backlog of road needs throughout Brevard County. As with many government services, the level of funding never seems to meet the requirements for providing adequate service. As budget cuts continue, local governments will be hard-pressed to improve local transportation networks and meet the increasing demand of our transportation needs.



BOT Happenings: 4/22/2025 Meeting Highlights:

The BOT reviewed and unanimously accepted the DOR Ad Hoc Committee's list of recommended substantive changes to the DOR. It includes removing the width requirement, allowing single-wide manufactured houses to be placed in the district.

Also, some clarifications on language on obstructed carports and other clarifications. 4 questions in all.

All questions on the mailout ballot will be voted on individually and either approved or not approved. 50% + 1 of lot owners must return the ballots, then 50% + 1 of those returned must be a "Yes" vote on a question to effect the change of that question.

Lot Owners: Make sure your mailing address is correct with the administration office, as sometimes the post office does not forward all mail.

4/29/2025 Town Hall and 5/1/2025 Fourth Budget Meeting:

You will need to view these two meetings online for yourself.

5/8/2025:

The Violations Committee opening is to be filled at the next BOT meeting, as there was a last-minute application. The board closed all applications and will choose an appointee from the three candidates.

The postage machine lease renewal was granted to Automated Mailroom. This lease saves the district about \$400.00 per year compared to the closest vendor.

Resolution 2025-07 Implementing a Convenience Fee for the use of Credit/ Debit Cards at District Facilities to recoup

approximately \$59,000 in fees the district must pay the clearing house for Credit/Debit Card charges was put on hold while staff determines if the Point Of Sale system can accommodate the Debit Card rules.

The BBRD Clubs' Open General Public Events Requests Log Spreadsheet was created with some clubs' requests for Fund Raiser Events being entered, so they don't have to address it again for continuing their events in future years.







His driftwood pieces are mostly used "as found" and painted to represent the animal he sees in the wood when he gathers it. These unique pieces are quite popular.

Martin has a doctorate in Educational Leadership, worked 42 years in education in New Jersey, and now serves as secretary of the Lagoon Artisans. Retirement has afforded him the time to paint and create his pieces.







COMPUTER CLUB

At the Computer Club meeting in April, 4 of those attending had received the iCloud storage email message indicating that they needed to purchase more space. Each of us wondered if it were true or a scam. Several noticed that the email address did not look legitimate. To check that, hover your mouse over the email heading and see what it looks like- all numbers and letters jumbled together is a pretty good clue to a scam. Misspelled or inappropriate capitalization also frequently appears in scam emails. The standard response is "I didn't even look at that, I just opened it!" Take a moment to check who the sender might be to avoid this problem. The standard advice when using your phone or computer is to "not open anything from anyone you do not know or that you did not request information from". You can also Google the email address to see if there are reports of fraud or scams on that name and address.

If you want to check your iCloud storage to make sure that you are not out of space, there are steps for Android and Apple products. For an iPhone, open settings, tap your name and Apple ID, select iCloud, and view storage (bar graph). You can learn more by tapping the Manage Account Storage tab.

To check your iCloud storage on an Android, you must first select which service is with- Google Drive, Dropbox, or OneDrive. Open the app (usually OneDrive, but could be different), locate Storage/Usage/Settings. Look for the Storage or Usage section to show your usage. You can review or delete files here to free up additional storage. Make sure you really want to delete the file!!

Scams that are reported are investigated, and that investigation could help you and thousands of other people avoid being scammed. ReportFraud.ftc.gov is the Federal Trade Commission's report line. A helpful resource where you can talk to a person is the AARP Fraud Watch Network Helpline at 1-877-908-3360.



Thoughts Brought On by An Armadillo

I spotted a couple of armadillos beside the road one evening recently. I remembered that they can carry the bacteria that cause Hansen's Disease (leprosy).

One of the great men of the 20th century who probably did more for lepers than anyone in all the previous centuries combined was Dr. Paul Brand. He grew up a missionary kid in India. He himself became a medical missionary and specialized in hands. He was knighted by the Queen for his work. His work was with India's lepers.

Leprosy deadens the nerves, and because of deadened nerves, there is nothing to tell you to move your hand from a hot stove. Consequently, injury, infection, and a bunch of terrible stuff follow.

Dr. Brand did his work with lepers when it was not clear where it came from or how to arrest it. That means he did it at personal risk. He came home one night to find that his wife had let a leper fall asleep on their porch. He looked at her with concerned eyes. What he meant was, you've let a leper onto the porch, and this could mean infection for our family. His wife replied that the man had walked for weeks to get here just to see Dr. Brand, that he was desperate, that he had no place to go, ... what else could she do? That interchange showed how risky and torn people felt.

This dread existed in the New Testament world. All I want to say at this point is that Jesus healed lepers. And that leprosy is also a metaphor for sin in our soul. Then I'll say again, Jesus heals lepers. Join us Sundays at 10 am.


