A Conversation with Marge Frego: Longtime Barefoot Bay Realtor Reflects on 55-Year Career

I sat down with Marge Frego last week.

Marge sold me my first house back in 2004 on Vireo Drive — at the time, a two-year-old, three-bedroom, two-bath home. It was small, but we somehow managed to raise four children there. I remember walking through the house with its dark plum-colored carpeting and realizing this was going to be home. I would raise my family in Barefoot Bay.

We handed her an earnest deposit check, and the rest is history.

In more ways than one.

As it turns out, the sale of that house in 2022 became the capital that allowed me to purchase The Tattler four years ago this month. We have Marge Frego to thank for that as well.

If they were all as easy as that first sale to me, it's no wonder Marge Frego has been selling homes in Barefoot Bay for the past 55 years.

She's even added two of her own children to that story, both purchasing retirement homes in Barefoot Bay within the past year. Over the decades, Marge herself owned many homes here, too. Early in her career, a financial advisor encouraged her to invest in \$30,000 Barefoot Bay homes instead of a traditional 401(k).

Not a bad investment.

Marge can drive down almost any street in Barefoot Bay and point out homes she's sold. "Sold that one... and that one twice."

I asked her what the record was.

"Six times," she said.

That's a pretty remarkable career when you've sold the exact same home six different times.

Today, she's gathering photographs, maps, keepsakes, and knick-knacks from the office she's called home for years. A four-foot pink metal flamingo still stands proudly inside. The building itself, located on Micco Road, will likely become one of her final sales.

"This building has been a perfect location for my business," she told me. "Another Realtor would do well here."

Until that final sale happens, the office remains open, and Marge says she'll still be around when needed to help the other sales representatives.

"It's been a great life," she said. "I'm thankful for everyone who trusted me to help them buy or sell their Barefoot Bay home. I'm 78. Time to relax and take care of myself."

Marge Frego is another in a long line of Realtors who helped shape Barefoot Bay over the decades. She's watched this community grow, change, struggle, and thrive.

And I'm proud to call her my friend.

"Hey, kiddo," she tells me. "You've done well."

I appreciate that.

So did you, Marge.

Trustee Candidate Qualifying Set for June 8-12

Candidate qualifying for the Barefoot Bay Recreation District Board of Trustees begins at noon on Monday, June 8, and closes at noon on Friday, June 12, through the Brevard County Supervisor of Elections Office.

Candidates must complete qualifying paperwork and pay a \$25 qualifying fee unless qualifying by petition.

Two Trustee seats will appear on the November ballot. The top two vote-getters will be elected.

At least three qualified candidates are required for an election to take place. If only two candidates qualify, both would automatically be deemed elected.

New Tenants Expected as ALDI Reshapes Micco Shopping Center

The upcoming conversion of Winn-Dixie to ALDI continues to reshape the Micco shopping center, creating new opportunities in the area's busiest and most visible retail area.

The Tattler had previously reported that Indian River Fitness was considering the larger, newly available retail space adjacent to the future ALDI location. Since then, those plans have changed.

Owner Lynn Fraser confirmed this week that the larger space ultimately did not work out for Indian River Fitness. Fraser says she continues exploring other possibilities for the business, including the former Family Dollar location or potentially remaining at the gym's current location.

Meanwhile, activity surrounding the former Winn-Dixie property continues behind the scenes.

While no official announcement has been made regarding the larger available retail space, The Tattler has learned that a letter of intent has already been signed and that multiple contractors are currently working on potential build-out plans.

At this time, sources indicate the space is being considered for either a fitness-related concept or a hardware store. Final lease details have not yet been publicly announced.

Another portion of the former Winn-Dixie property also appears close to being filled. A regional liquor retailer is expected to occupy the former Winn-Dixie liquor store location, though the tenant has not yet been formally announced.

That addition may prove especially popular with Barefoot Bay residents, as the location can be accessed by golf cart via Barefoot Boulevard, without requiring travel along Micco Road — something many residents will likely appreciate once the store opens.

Unlike larger metropolitan areas dealing with widespread retail vacancies, commercial space in our area has generally remained active and occupied. Instead, the ALDI transition has created a rare opportunity for existing retail space to be reconfigured with new tenants and concepts, which is exciting for our community.

With construction planning already underway and lease discussions continuing, additional announcements are expected in the months ahead.

BOT Happenings

April 9, 2026 Meeting Highlights:

The Barefoot Bay Recreation District Board of Trustees discussed proposed policy changes regarding beverages and alcohol compliance within the Pool #1 and Golf Course picnic areas. Staff recommended allowing pool hosts and other employees to visually inspect bags, coolers, and similar items for prohibited beverages before granting access. Proposed rules would also limit outside beverages to unopened, manufacturer-sealed clear plastic containers and cans. The proposal would not restrict residents from bringing food into the pool area, emphasizing that only beverage containers are affected and that residents would still be allowed entry without restricted items. The Board unanimously approved a motion to table the decision until after the upcoming town hall meeting to allow for additional resident discussion.

The Board also discussed the Crystal Bay gated access on Barberry Street. Discussion included the need to clarify control of the gate with the homeowners' association and the possibility of requesting additional signage from Brevard County.

April 16, 2026 Budget Workshop Highlights:

The Barefoot Bay Recreation District Board reached consensus on several fee updates, including discussing a \$50 flat fee rather than a \$5 per person fee for non-residents attending club ticketed or special events. Discussed raising the social membership fee to \$1,600 for new homeowners. The Board also approved updated guest pass and lowered seasonal renter pass rates. Also discussed a new \$5 lounge guest pass that includes a redeemable coupon for the Lounge. Golf fees for residents and non-residents will remain unchanged from last year. In addition, the Board agreed to pursue FRDAP and water quality improvement grants to enhance canals throughout the District.

April 21, 2026 Townhall Meeting Highlights:

Residents expressed concerns during the meeting about not being allowed to bring outside water or snacks into the Pool #1 area. It was clarified that unopened bottled water, canned beverages, and snacks will continue to be permitted, and free filtered ice and water are available at the Lounge.

Additional topics discussed included a proposed dog park, which received both support and opposition from residents, golf carts traveling on Micco Road, ticket pricing, and vouchers for the April 18 music event, pool temperatures, adding more chairs during special events, and Deed of Restrictions requirements for house numbers on carpports.

April 28, 2026 Meeting Highlights:

DOR Violations located at 446 Egret Circle, 908 Hemlock Street, 889 Laurel Circle, and 401 Osprey Drive were referred to legal counsel.

The Barefoot Bay Recreation District Board of Trustees unanimously approved waiving guest pass fees for residents who purchase buffet tickets for the 2026 Mother's Day and Father's Day events at Lakeside of the Lounge. Staff noted the change would allow families to celebrate the holidays together, with each buffet ticket including a complimentary guest pass for the day.

The BOT moved an alternate on the Violations Committee to a voting position after a resignation was received. We now have an open alternate position on the Violations Committee and encourage anyone interested to apply. The Board also passed a settlement agreement following a court-ordered mediation.

We encourage all residents to stay informed and participate in upcoming meetings.

April 30, 2026 Budget Workshop Highlights:

The BOT reached a consensus to set the social membership fee for new homeowners at \$1700 and established a \$3 guest pass fee after 5 pm for the Lounge and Pool #1 area. The Board also approved funding for tables and chairs for the new deck being built for the 19th hole; an annual skydiving event for the Veterans; a new ping pong table, and a commercial outdoor pizza oven. The Board of Trustees of the Barefoot Bay Special Recreational District will hold a Public Hearing and Regular Meeting on June 23, 2026, at 1 pm in Building D & E located at 1225 Barefoot Blvd. The purpose of the Public Hearing is the adoption of the FY27 Budget and the approval of the Resolution fixing the assessment amount for FY27.

<Editor's Note: The Annual Assessment was increased 2.7%, or approximately \$28, for the fiscal 2026-2027 year. The \$1700 Social Membership fee is a one-time fee collected from new homeowners at closing. Current homeowners have already paid their Social Membership fee. Fees for renters and passes for guests were modified for 2026-2027. The complete list of fees will be posted on BarefootBay.com. The budget is complete, and residents will soon receive copies in the mail. This year's budget, fees, and annual assessment will be voted on and adopted at the June 23rd, 2026, meeting.>

Commissioner Kim Adkinson Urges Residents to Prepare for Hurricane Season and Follow Yard Waste Collection Guidelines

As Brevard County enters the 2026 hurricane season, I encourage residents to take proactive steps to prepare their properties and remain aware of important yard waste collection guidelines due to unusually high debris volumes across the county. Severe cold freezes earlier this year caused widespread vegetation damage, resulting in yard waste levels far above normal. Yard waste tonnage in May 2026 is approximately 70 percent higher than in May 2025, creating challenges not seen by the solid waste industry in more than 40 years.

Waste Management is actively working to collect the backlog and prioritize debris removal as hurricane season approaches. Preparing our neighborhoods now is essential to reducing storm-related hazards later. Residents can help by following collection guidelines and scheduling special pickups when needed. Residents in Barefoot Bay and unincorporated Brevard should note that yard waste piles larger than a picnic table are considered bulk piles and require a special pickup request. The same rule applies to large household items such as couches, mattresses, and furniture. These items will not be collected through routine curbside service unless scheduled.

To schedule a pickup, residents may call (321) 723-4455 or visit Waste Management Support.

I encourage residents to keep debris piles manageable, schedule large removals in advance, and avoid blocking sidewalks, roadways, or drainage areas. Proper yard waste management is a critical part of hurricane preparedness. By acting now, we can help keep Brevard County safe, clean, and storm-ready throughout hurricane season. Residents are encouraged to review hurricane preparedness materials and remain alert to local emergency management updates throughout the season.

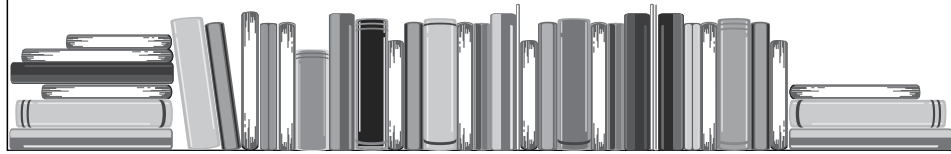

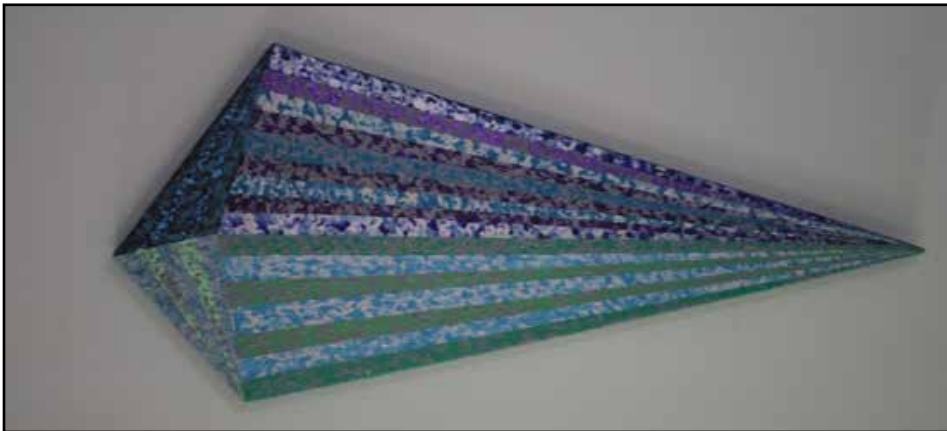

We Need Trustees Who Understand Barefoot Bay

In just a few weeks, we'll know who the candidates are for the two open Barefoot Bay Recreation District Trustee seats.

Over the years, I've seen all kinds of candidates run for Trustee. Some were excellent. Some had good intentions but little understanding of how the District actually functions. I've also seen organized groups of residents run together on platforms centered almost entirely around cutting spending, reducing amenities, or shrinking the role of the District itself.

Barefoot Bay did not become one of the most desirable manufactured home communities in Florida by accident. Previous generations invested in this community. They built amenities people were proud of. They protected assets that added long-term value. They understood that quality of life matters and that some things cannot simply be measured on a spreadsheet.

That doesn't mean every expense should automatically be approved or every idea embraced. Trustees absolutely have a responsibility to question spending, challenge waste, and protect taxpayers. But there is a major difference between responsible financial management and slowly dismantling the very things that give Barefoot Bay its identity.

Over the years, I've heard just about everything from the peanut gallery.

"Sell the beachfront property."

Absolutely not.

Oceanfront property is one of the rarest assets any community can own, and once it's gone, it's gone forever. Is the property underutilized at times? Probably. Mostly because of the distance from Barefoot Bay itself. But the simple fact that our community owns beachfront property says something about Barefoot Bay that very few manufactured home communities can say.

A one-time payout might temporarily help a budget, but it permanently removes one of the community's most unique long-term assets.

Then there's the recurring suggestion to sell or lease the golf course.

People who don't golf often fail to understand what the course actually represents. It's not just about golfers. The course helps define the appearance, character, and value of Barefoot Bay itself. It separates this community from thousands of ordinary manufactured home developments across Florida.

And once control leaves the community's hands, good luck getting it back.

A private operator's priorities are not necessarily the same as the priorities of the residents who live here. Deferred maintenance, declining conditions, reduced accessibility, rising fees — it happens all over Florida.

I've also heard the argument that the District should simply "run things like a business" by leasing out Food & Beverage operations or privatizing additional amenities. But Barefoot Bay was never designed to operate as a pure profit-maximizing business. If it were, many of the things residents enjoy today probably wouldn't exist in their current form. Summer entertainment and amenities would be scaled back during slower months. Services would be evaluated strictly on profitability instead of community value.

That may improve a spreadsheet. It doesn't necessarily improve the community.

Meanwhile, every homeowner in Barefoot Bay benefits indirectly from having well-maintained amenities, whether they personally use them or not. Appearance matters. Reputation matters. Lifestyle matters. Property values reflect those realities.

The same goes for many of the so-called easy fixes that get floated during election season. Austerity by itself is not a vision. Selling assets is not a growth strategy. Shrinking your way forward rarely works.

Trustees are not simply managing numbers on a balance sheet. They are helping shape the future of a community that generations of residents spent decades building.

We need candidates who understand the long-term value of community assets and who recognize that maintaining Barefoot Bay's quality of life is not the same thing as wasteful spending.

Barefoot Bay has always offered exceptional value compared to many Florida retirement communities. But value and "cheap" are not the same thing. The amenities, golf course, pools, entertainment, beach property, and overall character of this community are precisely why people chose to buy here in the first place.

The Trustees who succeed here usually understand that difference.

Club!!! For most of these past years, the focus has been on teaching and learning about computers- that new tool that would save time and energy when typing letters, improve the use of spreadsheets for getting quick answers to budgets, costs, and funding, and even provide some quick answers to replace putting a letter or invitation in the mail and waiting for a response. It seems that everyone learned what they wanted to know, and then cell phones and tablets took their place. We have adjusted our programming to provide more help with these devices and the technology that has developed from these devices. While we will not be meeting again until September, we will continue to provide assistance with your questions as we are able.

Recently, there have been several questions regarding issues where the device seems to be stuck- not able to scroll, delete, or swipe away the problem- both on Android and Mac products (iPhone, iPad). Updates, internet issues, and program failures can cause these problems. The remedy may be a full shutdown, not just the blank screen you get when you put the phone down. If you do not know how to do this shut down (something you should do regularly), you can call for help, go to the computer/ phone stores for help, or you can use Google to ask your question. To get information specific to your phone, know your phone brand and the model. If not, just Google " How do I shut down my Samsung phone?" You will get many responses and some YouTube videos to help you. Perhaps you still have another device where you can Google the question or ask a friend with a working device. Included in that immense Google program is a full 'encyclopedia and dictionary' to answer almost any question, maps to determine routes or weather for today or a week away, and emergency information to help you. Beyond those examples, you can Google a location (doctor, restaurant, theater) and it will take you to that website where you can learn about the location, hours of operation, address, directions to the location, menus, and even a phone number that will connect you to that location. When you Google, provide as much detail as you can- Full name (or specialty like- Mexican food, optometrists, movie theater), and the city and state. This will narrow the search to give you the requested information. If you Google a person, be prepared to see information on everyone with that name or a similar name in your requested area, obituaries, arrest records, professional licensing, previous residences, and people who may be associated with that person. There are also programs you can pay for to get more details, but generally, you will find the information for free. Let Google be your resource. Remember- this is an AI program and may not be perfect!!





There are three different surgical approaches for total hip replacement. I will focus on two of them: the posterior procedure and the anterior procedure.

The posterior procedure is performed from the rear of the hip (the buttock area), while the anterior procedure is done from the front of the hip.

In 2017, at age 60, I underwent the anterior procedure. After surgery, I was able to walk with a walker and use the restroom shortly afterward. I was released about an hour later and returned to work in just 18 days as a manual machinist, spending up to 10 hours a day on my feet.

On April 1st of this year, at age 69, I underwent the posterior procedure on my left hip. My surgeon explained that he has performed many posterior hip replacements and believes it to be the best approach.

I am now more than six weeks into recovery, and it has been a much more difficult experience. The healing process has taken longer, and I have required more physical therapy.

I understand that my experience is only one example. However, having undergone both types of procedures, I hope this perspective encourages others to have an informed conversation with their orthopedic physician when considering hip replacement options.

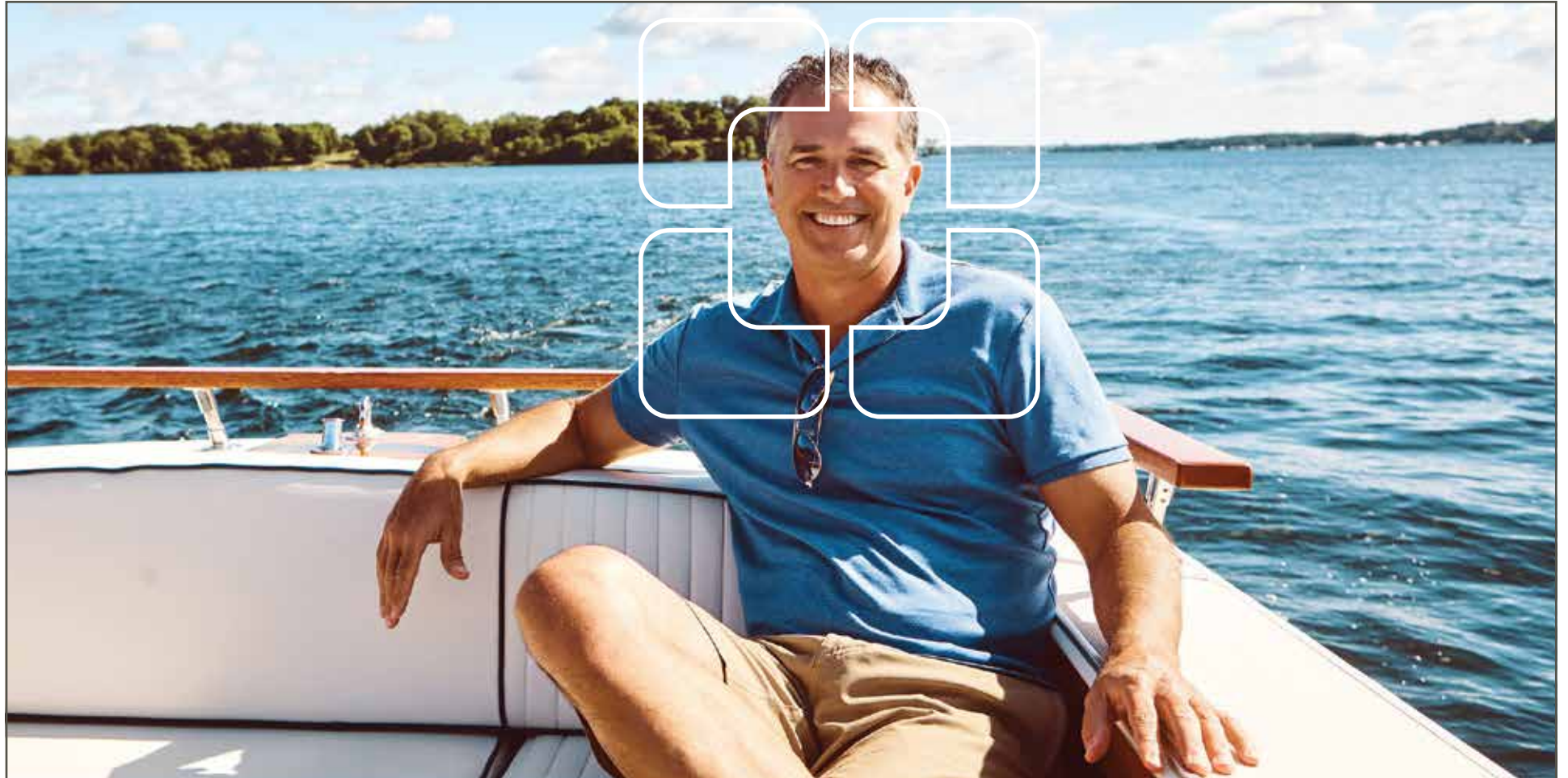

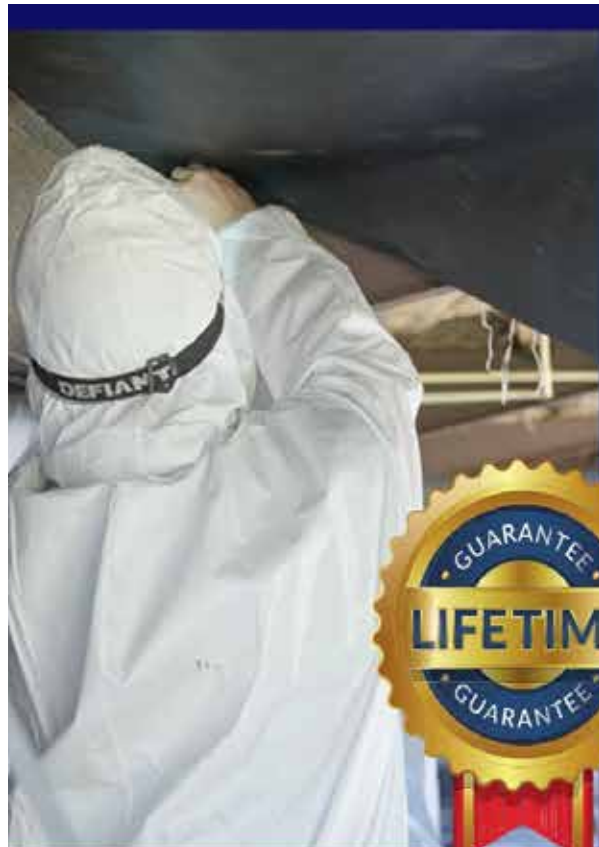

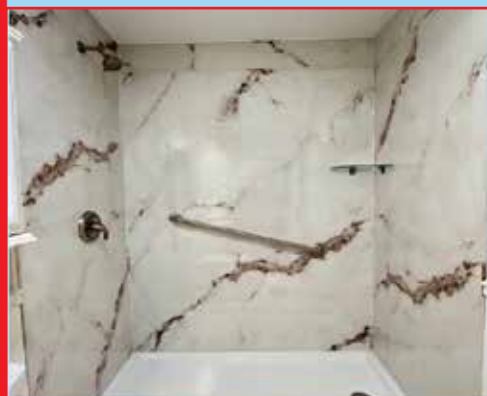
