

# Late Winter Musings

We are coming up on budget season in Barefoot Bay. The process takes months, culminating with the finished budget and new assessment being voted on June 25th this year. There will be an increase based on the CPI, and we can only hope that we don't have any surprises to our budget since we don't keep a lot in reserve if something goes over budget. Last year, we had approximately \$100k in reserves for emergencies, and our insurance increase was unexpectedly \$50,000 higher. Kent Cichon, at the Town Hall on January 25th, mentioned the current reserve has less than \$15,000 remaining for the rest of this fiscal year. He provided a PowerPoint presentation addressing the challenges the Board of Trustees (BOT) are facing with the new budget including labor costs, inflation, small project funding, as well as other budget items and requirements that will need further consideration in the months ahead.

The upcoming BOT meetings are at 1 pm on Feb 27, March 14, and March 26. A Budget workshop is scheduled for March 19 at 6 pm, with several others scheduled in April, as needed. The public has limited input at these meetings, but if you attend or watch the meetings online at BBRD.org, you can email the Trustees and BBRD management your questions and concerns prior to the finalization of the budget in June.

We are approaching the 20th anniversary of Hurricane Frances (Sept. 5, 2004) and Hurricane Jeanne's (Sept. 26, 2004) back-to-back impacts on Barefoot Bay. More than 900 homes received significant damage due to those storms. Most of those homes have been replaced since but that still leaves Barefoot Bay with 4000 homes over 20 years old with many over 40 years old. A Category 2-3 storm this summer would be bad. A Category 4-5 would be catastrophic. It took years for Barefoot Bay to remove abandoned, derelict properties after those 2004 hurricanes. What happens if we lose 900 homes this year, with the increase in costs to replace and insure these homes today over what it cost 20 years ago?

I've been told many long-term residents, most on fixed incomes and without a mortgage, have dropped their wind coverage insurance entirely. Even those of us with insurance don't have enough to cover the full replacement cost of our home. We're lucky if we get enough to pay off the mortgage, let alone rebuild. It can easily cost \$250,000 to put a new home on a lot in Barefoot Bay. I won't have the money to rebuild without a new mortgage, but the insurance after a hurricane in Barefoot Bay will cost what? \$6000 a year? More? Will the payoff be enough to cover my new mortgage? And what about the folks that don't have any coverage? We could have hundreds or thousands of homes where the homeowner is unable to live on the property or afford to repair their damaged homes. We would be surrounded by destruction with little to no help to recover. It would take years for BBRD.org to get permission to demolish these unrepairable properties. Even then, adding another empty lot still leaves the owner with the same problems regarding insurance costs and mortgages when building a new home in Barefoot Bay.

Who can afford to buy a brand-new manufactured home, pay for it, and then insure it affordably? There are still some people doing that. We are constantly reminded our homes are a DEPRECIATING asset when viewed by insurers. it's time we consider a serious alternative alternative before the next hurricane. We need to change the DOR to have the option to build a CBS home on our lots, in the event of a catastrophic loss of homes. These can be built to look like every other home in Barefoot Bay, but mortgages would be easier to get, insurance would cover more and cost less, and homes could be built to be more energy efficient, reducing utilities long term. We're only one disaster away from losing our community, possibly forever. We need better alternatives before that happens. Last year, a strong El Nino was in effect, and almost every Atlantic-based storm veered to the north. This summer, we will see a strong La Nina, the number of forecast storms will be much higher, ocean temps will soar again, and Florida will be a prime target. The next hurricane is a when, not an if.

The new paving and street markers pointing you in the right direction along US-1 north of the Sebastian Bridge also come with dozens of Wrong Way and Do Not Enter signs, as well as new radar speed-limit signs facing in different directions before you get to Barefoot Bay. A little unnerving and a major distraction even for those not drunk, incompetent, visually impaired, or likely to turn in the wrong direction onto the highway. We've had accidents and fatalities on US-1, but what's been done here is "overkill," pun intended.

We implore everyone to slow down and follow the traffic laws. E-bikes and golf carts ignoring street signs is an epidemic in Barefoot Bay and could result in injuries and deaths, if not a ticket from a random deputy. Those driving cars carelessly are not immune to this same criticism. My son, Bobby, was sideswiped while driving my Geo Metro Convertible two months ago on US-1 at Conlan in Palm Bay. The other driver was at fault, smashed the car in the driver's rear quarter panel, spun it around, and could have seriously injured my son. A week ago, my daughter, Laura, was driving on US-1 near the 1919 Building, and someone forced her off the road into the median at 55mph and then didn't bother to stop. In both instances, my children are OK, but not for the careless driving of others. When two of my children can be involved in similar accidents on the same road less than two months apart, what the heck!?! It's no wonder auto insurance prices are skyrocketing. Slow down. Obey traffic laws. Put your phone down. Pay attention! And if you're advanced age has made it impossible to drive safely for any reason, it's time to give up your driver's license and let others drive before someone gets hurt. Or do we just need to put up another sign?



BOT Happenings...

#### January 23rd meeting:

Trustees approved 5 DOR violations, 446 Egret Circle, 510 Sea-Gull Drive, 808 Oriole Circle, 815 Thrush Circle, and 1025 Wren Circle, to be given to General Counsel Olsen for legal action.

Mr. Cichon provided project updates listed on the BBRD website and reminded residents that they can visit the website to stay current on progress. Brevard County has recorded the Sidewalk Assessment Agreement and approved the Sidewalk Waiver for the beach restroom project.

#### January 25th meeting:

A Budget / Townhall meeting was held at 6 PM on Thursday, 1/25. Attendance was sparse. Mr. Cichon explained what may be in the FY25 budget and the 5-year plan. The PowerPoint presentation should be on the bbrd.org website.

#### February 8th meeting:

The Budget was amended: FY2023 R&M/Capital Projects Roll Over to FY2024 This means the money allotted for projects in FY2023 that were not completed and charged out will be carried over for inclusion in FY2024's budget.

A discussion was held about adding language to the Policy Manual to exempt a totally dependent person from existing fees. This will be implemented at a future meeting.

Mr. Cichon informed us that Brevard County accepted the sidewalk easement for the Beach, and the Indenture has been recorded in county records. Next will be the approval of the Major Site Plan. The County then schedules a pre-construction meeting for approval of our construction application. Mr. Cichon, Mr. Goetz, our Engineer and General Contractor, and Mr. Olsen will be attending.

The Sandy Lobello Memorial Veterans Tournament was held on Saturday, Feb. 3rd.

It was a great day, weather-wise, for a change. The Sebastian parachute jumpers were able to jump with all the flags and smoke to the enjoyment of hundreds of residents and golfers! A great fundraising event and a fun day!

The golfers had the pleasure of using brand-new Yamaha golf carts that were delivered the day before. The previous 4-year lease had expired, and the new 4-year lease commenced.



# March is National Kidney Month

Kidney disease is known as a 'silent disease' because there are often no obvious symptoms during its early stages. Nevertheless, there are still steps you can take to see whether or not you're at risk. Below, we answer your questions about this sneaky disease.

**Q.** A friend of mine is diabetic and just found out he has kidney disease. Do all diabetics develop kidney disease? And are there any other people who are vulnerable to developing it?

**A.** No, not all diabetics develop kidney disease, but factors that may increase a person's risk of developing it do include diabetes as well as other health issues such as high blood pressure, being over 60 years old, and heart disease.

**Q.** I read that I'm at risk for kidney disease since I'm 65. What kind of test do I need?

A. You'll need two tests; just ask your primary care physician. The first is a urine test to determine if any damage has been done to your kidneys, and the second is a blood test to evaluate how well your kidneys remove waste from your blood.

**Q.** My dad just found out he has "Stage 2" kidney disease; how many stages are there?

*A.* There are five stages, as prescribed by the National Kidney Foundation (NKF). The

different stages require different treatments. For specifics on what kind of treatment your dad requires for Stage 2, he should consult his physician. The kind of doctor who specializes in kidney disease is a nephrologist.

**Q.** My spouse was just diagnosed with kidney disease. Is it curable?

A. There's no cure for kidney disease. It's a chronic condition (which is why it's also known as chronic kidney disease or CKD), but getting treatment is important because it might not only help relieve symptoms but it also might help prevent the disease from getting significantly worse or at least slow the rate of progression down; the sooner you find out you have kidney disease, the better. And generally speaking, experts agree that a healthy lifestyle is key to helping address this 'silent' disease.

**Q.** My son, who is sixty-two, has stage 4 kidney disease. What happens if it gets worse?

**A.** If your son's health continues to decline and he progresses from stage 4 kidney disease to stage 5, he might need to start dialysis therapy or be considered for a kidney transplant. However, everyone's body is different, and he should absolutely check with his physician for the best course of action to take.





#### Out of Darkness



We've received quite a few compliments regarding the Date Night Reviews column, and we want to thank those of you who enjoy them. We readily admit we're not a "meat and potatoes" type couple. Those who like things boring may not find our reviews of interest. We do have eclectic tastes. That goes for our movie choices, as well as our dinner choices. Fun fact! I took Karen out on our very first date for dinner and a movie where she lived in Calgary in 1998. We went to a local sushi bar, and, bless her heart, she had never tried sushi before. We had met online, and I had flown 3000 miles to meet her, so we could assume she had a lot of trust in me already. She absolutely loved it, and now we have a \$1500 annual sushi habit. Doesn't help that the kids like sushi too!

Naturally, our first movie together was You've Got Mail! A prescient choice with solid performances. Since that first film, we

have seen hundreds of films together. We'll often head out to see some small art movie, and we'll have the entire theater to ourselves, a private showing that makes the moment and the film a little more special. We were close to having that experience with our latest movie, *Out of Darkness*, when an older man and a young couple joined us just as the lights faded.

The barren Scottish countryside suffices for the harsh landscape a group of travelers must survive in the year 45,000 BC. With primitive weapons and no food, these nomads head into the unknown, afraid of what lies ahead. As they search for food and shelter, they deal with superstition and struggle with the constant fear of death as they are stalked and then captured and killed, one after the other, by some unknown force. You witness the strength of family and also the willingness to sacrifice the weak to survive just another night. By the end of the movie, the true monster is all too real.

Playing in limited theaters, *Out of Darkness* uses a small budget, big scares, and great lighting effects and is worthy of the accolades it's been receiving as a well-directed, smartly written film. Please note that the language spoken in the film is called "Tola," which was created by a linguist specifically for this film. Though historically and theoretically accurate, no one has heard a similar language since the Stone Age, so the film is subtitled, naturally.

Despite dining on a Monday night, we had a brief wait for our table, during which two parties of four arrived simultaneously. The air is redolent of warm island spices, and the drink menu has many rum-forward selections. It was near a full house with the previously mentioned mix of familiar faces to new ones.

As a quick starter, we began with the pepper pot soup, a blend of just the right proportions of ingredients to tantalize the taste buds, smooth and delicious. The next dish to arrive brought a waft of rich spices to the air. Authentic, jerk marinade drizzled chicken wings offered one of the best jerk flavorings we've ever tried. Our order of six wings could just as easily been a meal-sized portion of twelve or more, depending on your appetite. The wings were a perfect balance of savory, sweet, exotically spiced flavors with just the right amount of heat.

Next to arrive were our three (yes, three!) entrees. One each and one to share. Between us, the I Tal stew was a colorful blend of freshly steamed cabbage, carrots, celery, lentils, and chayote (a mango-shaped squash) cooked in vegetable stock in a rich, herbaceous ginger broth topped with a tall, crisp curl of plantain. This vegetarian delight is a traditional Rastafarian dish and did not disappoint.

Rob enjoyed his favorite Jamaican dish, curry chicken thighs cooked in green Jamaican curry and rice with its well-balanced flavors of turmeric, coriander, cumin, ginger, cloves, and pepper, served with rice and black beans. I ordered the oxtail stew in a rich, dark, brown beef gravy over garlic mashed potatoes and the freshly steamed vegetable side. That oxtail, though! Mmmmm... deeply flavorful and fall-apart tender roast beef with lots of delicious collagen. I could not have enjoyed that more!



We packaged two lunch meals worth of leftovers and somehow had room to sample tart Key Lime pie and a warm coconut custard pie. We can recommend both.

Mo-Bay Grill creates a warm, exotic, island-flavored experience well worth enjoying, and we highly recommend it for hosting your out-of-town guests. Reservations are recommended if you want to be sure of a shorter wait, especially with a larger party.
