One Year Later: BarefootBay.com

A year ago, we introduced BarefootBay.com to the community, and if you were there at the beginning, you know exactly how that went. The April launch wasn't great. Pages didn't load right. Things broke. It wasn't something you'd use twice unless you really wanted to see what we were trying to build. But underneath all of that, the structure was there. The Calendar worked. The idea made sense. It just needed time.

By the July 4th weekend, we were ready to try again. The relaunch was stable, and for the first time, we asked people to actually use it. Sign up. Come back. See if it has a place in your day.

That's when it started to take hold.

What It Looks Like Today

We're coming up on 1,000 registered users.

That number matters, but not for the reason people think. It's not about bragging rights. It's about consistency. People didn't just show up once. They came back, checked the Calendar, looked things up, and slowly started relying on it. The daily email reminders have been a popular addition.

We also have 14 Premium Sponsors—residents who decided, on their own, that this was worth supporting. That's not something you can manufacture. That's people making a quiet decision that what's being built here should stick around. And just this month, we signed our first Platinum Sponsor. For the first time, the site is paying for itself, at least for now. That's important. We needed to build something useful enough that it can stand on its own without turning it into a billboard or impacting the newspaper.

BarefootBay.com now shows up right at the top when someone searches "Barefoot Bay." That means when a potential buyer, a former resident, or someone's family member wants to see what this place is about, they're not being introduced to us through a Facebook argument. They're seeing something that reflects the community as it actually is. That matters more than anything we've built on the site.

On Criticism and Reality

I've heard the comments. Some of them are fair. Some of them aren't worth repeating. The idea that I don't go after the District enough comes up every so often. That I'm too supportive. That I'm not "independent" enough. Here's the reality.

If I think something is wrong, I'll say it. I've done that before, and I will again. But I'm not interested in taking shots just to prove a point or to keep up with the tone you see online.

Barefoot Bay isn't just a board or a budget.

It's the golf course that people play three mornings a week. It's the 19th Hole where people meet up on Thursdays for a little music and a beer or on Sundays to root on their favorite football team. (Go Broncos!) It's the entertainment that fills the Lake Stage on a Friday night or a special event that has you dressing up as a pirate or dancing to Michael Jackson's Thriller. Those things don't exist

by accident, and they don't run for free.

When budget information gets posted and then reshaped online, it doesn't just create confusion—it changes how people feel about the place they live. And over time, that negativity and divisiveness add up.

For a long time, that Facebook page was the loudest version of Barefoot Bay available to anyone looking in from the outside.

It isn't anymore.

Why I Took This On

We never wrote a mission statement for The Tattler or BarefootBay.com, and I don't think we need to dress it up now.

I live here. My kids grew up here. My business depends on this community being healthy and stable. That's not a theory—it's just how it works.

Nobody handed me this role.

I stepped into it.

Not because I think I'm the only one who can do it, but because someone needs to care enough to put something better in front of people than what's been out there.

I like this place. I've built a life here. I'm not going to pretend otherwise just to make a point.

Where We're Going

The Tattler isn't changing much, and that's intentional.

It shows up every month. It covers what's going on. It keeps a record of things. We may add pages over time, maybe expand a few sections, but the idea isn't to reinvent it. BarefootBay.com will keep evolving.

We're working toward turning it into an app, mostly to make it easier to use. Staying logged in, getting notifications, having it right there on your phone—it's a small thing, but it makes a difference.

The clubs have been one of the best surprises. A lot of them have taken ownership of their pages, added photos, updated their information, and made it easier for people to understand what they're about. We've already had people reach out from outside the area after finding those pages. It makes sense that you're going to trust someone who runs the club that happens to share your background or interests.

That's exactly what we hoped would happen.

The For Sale section and classifieds are still finding their footing, but the audience is there. Every time something gets posted, thousands of people can see it. That part will come along.

Being first is a decision.

You can wait and see how something develops, or you can step in early and support it. They chose to step in.

That support helps keep the site free for everyone else, and it's appreciated.

And Then There's Life Outside All This I turn 64 this month.

I know most of you have already been there for a while, but it still feels a little strange to say out loud.

I'm not retired. I'm still working, still building, and still trying to figure out what the next phase looks like. I'm also single, which adds its own layer to all of it. Life doesn't slow down; it just changes shape.

Over the past couple of months, I've started getting out more. In fact, I bought a Go Wild Pass from Frontier Airlines and can fly for peanuts, with some effort.

Some of you followed along on my trip to Colorado in March. Since then, I made another trip to Colorado—this one for a funeral. My dad's longtime girlfriend. Those kinds of moments stay with you longer than you expect.

In another week or so, I'll be heading to Texas to play in a poker tournament.

I'm getting real value out of that investment.

There are decisions coming up. Medicare, more travel, what I want the next ten years to

look like. I'd like to see more, compare communities, and figure out what we're doing right in Barefoot Bay that works as well as it does.

I've got a few things I want to do while I can.

I've outlived my parents and my siblings. That changes how you look at time. You stop assuming there's plenty of it.

So I'm going to use it. And promote our community at the same time.

Some of it will show up here. Some on the site. Maybe some more videos.

If it's not your thing, you won't have to go looking for it.

If it is, you'll know where to find it.

One year in, BarefootBay.com isn't an idea anymore.

It's part of the community now.

And we'll keep building from there.

BOT Happenings

March 12, 2026 Meeting Highlights:

Claudia D'Amelio was recognized for her 10 years of service in Food & Beverage. If you've enjoyed the delicious food served at any Barefoot Bay Event, you can thank Miss Claudia! Thank you, Claudia!

The Board discussed the temporary smoking area that had been established in the southwest corner of Pool #1's lower deck during construction of the Lounge walk-in cooler. Now that the project has been completed, many residents have requested that the temporary smoking area remain available so they may continue to enjoy outdoor entertainment. After weeks of interviewing lakeside residents for opinions pro and con, the Board discussed allowing smoking in a designated area in the southeast corner, previously identified by staff as a suitable location. The Board approved the location with stipulations that smoking will be permitted after 5:30 PM only on evenings when outdoor entertainment is taking place. The Board noted that this decision may be revisited if a significant number of complaints are received from residents, and the allowance could be discontinued if necessary.

Additionally, the Board approved the renewal of the District's general counsel agreement.

March 19, 2026 Budget Workshop Highlights:

District Manager, Kent Cichon, presented the Barefoot Bay Recreation District FY 27 Proposed Budget to the Board for analysis over the next month.

March 24, 2026 Meeting Highlights:

The District's independent auditors, Forvis Mazars, presented the annual audit report. The Board approved the report, and it will be submitted to the State of Florida as required.

BBRD acquired 855 Hawthorn Circle on April 4, 2022, through the Neighborhood Revitalization Program. Having now satisfied all legal requirements, the District is able to move forward with the sale of the property. The Board authorized staff to list the property with Sea Breeze Realty & Property Management Services LLC.

The Board of Trustees also approved the continuation of Valley Bank as the District's depository.

In other updates, a contractor has completed the installation of a new HVAC system in Building C. The Board also received an update that both Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) grants, one at the golf course and one at the softball field, are currently in the closeout process.

A New, Noninvasive Option for Osteoarthritis

Cleveland Clinic Indian River Hospital is expanding access to a promising, noninvasive treatment for osteoarthritis (OA): low-dose radiation therapy (LDRT). While this approach has been used safely for decades in other countries, it is gaining renewed attention in the United States as research continues to show strong results for pain relief and improved function.

Indian River Hospital is the first Cleveland Clinic location in Florida to offer this treatment, following a care pathway developed at Cleveland Clinic's main campus in Ohio in 2023.

"The doses of ionizing radiation used for non-cancerous conditions are far smaller than traditional cancer treatments," says Marc Apple, MD, a radiation oncologist at the Scully-Welsh Cancer Center. "Here at Indian River Hospital, we routinely treat benign disease with low-dose radiation and are glad to be able to now offer it to appropriate patients for arthritis."

What the treatment is like

Osteoarthritis triggers ongoing inflammation that worsens pain and stiffness over time. Low-dose radiation helps reduce this inflammatory response, easing swelling and improving movement.

LDRT is delivered using advanced radiation technology that precisely targets affected joints. Treatments are quick and painless, typically lasting only a few minutes. Most patients receive low doses twice a week for about three weeks. Side effects are uncommon and usually mild. Some patients may experience temporary fatigue or slight skin irritation, but serious complications are rare.

A long history of safe use

Low-dose radiation has been used for many years to treat conditions such as plantar fasciitis, keloids and other painful inflammatory disorders. Research has shown improvements in both pain levels and physical function, particularly in people with mild to moderate arthritis.

Who may benefit

LDRT may be an option for adults with osteoarthritis in one or several joints – such as the knee, hip, shoulder, hands, or lower spine – who have not found enough relief from medications, injections or physical therapy. It can also help people who cannot tolerate certain medications.

Brevard County Strengthens Hurricane Preparedness Efforts for Barefoot Bay Manufactured Home Community

As we approach the 2026 hurricane season, which runs from June 1st through November 30th, I want to stress that it is never too early to begin planning for your family and your home for storm season. Our Brevard County Emergency Management team is reinforcing preparedness efforts in Barefoot Bay to ensure residents are informed, prepared, and ready to act.

Barefoot Bay is Brevard County's largest manufactured home community, housing over 10,000 residents who are especially vulnerable during hurricanes. If an evacuation is called, you cannot stay. This is about your safety, and the safety of your family. Have a plan, know where you're going, and don't wait until the last minute. Preparing now before a storm is on its way can make all the difference.

My office staff and I work closely with Brevard County Emergency Management and other County departments to ensure residents have the information, resources, and support they need heading into hurricane season. That includes clear communication on evacuation zones, available shelters, and assistance for those who may need additional help.

Manufactured homes, even when properly installed, are not designed to withstand the sustained winds and potential debris impacts associated with hurricanes. These structures are particularly vulnerable to high winds, flooding, and storm surges. Emergency Management Officials continue to stress that early preparation and timely evacuation are critical to protecting lives.

I am urging residents to take a few simple but critical steps:

- Know and understand your evacuation zone and flood risk.
- Plan to evacuate and where you will go when a storm threatens, and a mandatory evacuation order is issued
- Build a disaster kit to include water, food, medications, and important documents
- Stay informed by signing up for AlertBrevard and monitoring official county updates
- Secure your property by bringing in outdoor items and reinforcing vulnerable areas where possible.
- Check on your neighbors, especially those who may need extra assistance.

Residents are strongly encouraged to attend a Hurricane Preparedness Meeting on June 2nd at 2:00 pm at the Barefoot Bay Main Clubhouse (Building A), located at 625 Barefoot Bay Boulevard. I will be joining John Scott, Director of the Brevard County Emergency Management Department, to provide important updates on hurricane preparedness, evacuation procedures, and steps residents can take now to protect themselves and their property this storm season. Community residents are encouraged to attend and take advantage of this opportunity to get informed and ask questions.
