

Brightline Rail Comes to Barefoot Bay, Forgets to Stop

The future is here, and it passes right through Barefoot Bay. Brightline (gobrightline.com) began service last week, providing passenger service from Orlando to Miami and back. A total of 32 trains will cross Barefoot Blvd and Micco Rd every day for the foreseeable future. The service is a boon for travelers in the Orlando area and those in southern Florida, where there are multiple stops from West Palm Beach to Miami. For those of us in Brevard County? Nothing. There are plans to add a train station in Cocoa, eventually, to accommodate cruise passengers, but as it seems with all things for southern Brevard County, we're always the last considered and the most easily forgotten.

Brightline provides high-speed, eco-friendly trains that help reduce traffic on our roads while also reducing carbon emissions. Over 2000 jobs have been created, and Brightline service will have a \$6.4 billion economic impact for the state of Florida over the next eight years. The trains are state of the art and provide both an economy (smart fare) and first class (premium fare) ticket option. Hand-stitched leather seats, complimentary Wi-Fi (via Starlink), and multiple USB ports (Type-A and Type-C) are provided at every seat. The premium fare offers complimentary snacks and beverages and access to the premium lounge. Snacks and beverages can be purchased on the train and at the stations. Brightline has multiple partner agreements allowing for free transportation between Brightline stations and entertainment venues. All of this is great news if you can access the benefits without having to drive an hour north or two hours south.

There are several natural locations for a new Brightline station between Melbourne and Vero Beach, where long stretches of undeveloped land are available. Palm Bay has an excellent location off US1 between Port Malabar and Palm Bay Rd that assumably would be large enough for the station and the parking facility required. Both Grant and Sebastian previously had passenger stations, though growth in both areas may limit options for a station today. There are long stretches along US 1 headed towards Vero Beach that would work, and even the Vero Airport would be a reasonable location for a new station. Any of these locations would be economically advantageous to our area and have a long-term, positive impact.

Many people would be willing to drive up to 30 minutes (north or south) to take advantage of the train. Any longer, and the convenience is lost.

As I've been reminded, this form of transportation has been around for over 200 years. The invention of the steam train was the catalyst for growth in the western United States. I'm also reminded that those communities that missed out on those transportation hubs, whether train or interstate, also missed out on the economic activity that travelers bring to an area. It's a shame it's taken this long to bring back passenger trains to Florida, but now that it's here, we need to make sure we're not left behind.

Happenings at the BOT meetings... August 22nd meeting...

Over the past year, the staff has had many complaints pertaining to secondhand smoke at the Pool #1 complex. The Board of Trustees did not originate this request; the concerned residents did. As the Board of Trustees is required to make any policy changes, they were tasked to work with staff and find a solution for an acceptable "designated smoking area" away from the majority of people attending events and put it into the policy manual. This was finalized at this meeting, and Property Services will start immediately to create the area; there will be a temporary area in use until the spot is officially opened.

RFP 2023-01 –Golf Course The Golf Cart Lease for Barefoot Bay Executive Golf Course was awarded to Yamaha.

Under Employee Insurance Renewals, the BOT selected Florida Blue due to its low deductibles and very competitive premiums and Principle Insurance due to its low premiums and Employee satisfaction for the last five years.

The General Counsel recommended that the Board of Trustees take the following actions and was the consensus of the BOT to immediately address ADA compliance issues with respect to pool 1 (if any), including contracting to modify an existing ramp to meet ADA standards and develop a self-evaluation program pursuant to current ADA requirements under the direction of the Community Manager.

The Golf Course Fees and Charges Resolution 2023-14 was held over until the 9/26 meeting for language correction and will take effect on 10/1/23.

Classification & Compensation Recommendation Resolution 2023-15 was held over until the 9/26 meeting for language correction.

Liability & Workers Compensation Insurance Award of Contract was awarded to the Preferred Governmental Insurance Trust (Brown & Brown).

Lien Recording Service Award of Contract was renewed with Simplifile LC.

The Budget Development Calendar for FY25 was set.

Well, the signs are out, and the campaigning has begun. This election begins our transition to three-year terms, and there are three residents who are qualified by the Supervisor of Elections to run for those positions.

Get informed. Know the candidates, go to the forums and ask questions. This year, there are only two Trustee positions and the candidate with the most votes receives a three-year term, the second-place finisher gets a two-year term.

This special enrollment period ends at 11:59 p.m. local time on Sept. 30, 2023. Contact our office.

Volunteer to Serve in Under-Resourced Communities: The Mission Continues helps Veterans and other service members continue their service after serving in uniform. Using skills developed in the military, Veteran volunteers deploy to work alongside other non-profit groups to make improvements in under-resourced communities.

If you are a Vietnam Veteran, find out if you're eligible for disability compensation due to certain medical conditions. Barefoot

Disability Benefits for Eligible **Dependents:** If you have a 30% or higher disability rating from the VA, you can add dependents to increase your compensation benefits.

WARNING: Predatory Law Firms Scam your Benefits: Have you recently been aggressively contacted by a company or law firm regarding legal representation to file your PACT Act or Camp Lejeune presumptive VA claim or an e-mail? Dishonest attorneys are messaging Veterans with offers of assistance but charge inflated fees. VA will help gather the necessary evidence to support it. There are no costs or hidden fees to apply. Apply directly to VA securely online or in person at any regional office. Or at the Veterans Service Office in Barefoot Bay, Florida.

VA Has emergency buttons to call 911. You will have to see your doctor at Palm Bay Viera Clinic or Orlando. It is free to any veteran that might need one. The button is good anyplace in the United States of America for 911 calls.

Come into the Service Office for information on the Buddy Check program: The Service Office and the Service writers have all the information and sign-up forms. Get a call to see how you are and if you need help. You can also call and leave a message for a call to sign you up. 772-663-0645



Awareness is Power

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, a time to become educated on one of the most common cancer diagnoses in women in the United States. One of the best ways to defeat breast cancer is early detection, so it is important to remain educated on the early warning signs. Below, we answer some of your questions:

Q: A friend of mine got breast cancer, and she said that she didn't have any lumps. Are there any other warnings a woman can watch out for?

A: Signs and symptoms of breast cancer can appear in many different ways. While it's true that one of the most common symptoms is a lump or thickening in the breast that feels different from the surrounding tissue, there are other signs that indicate you may have breast cancer. These signs may include bloody discharge from the nipple, changes in size or shape of a breast, inverted nipples, peeling or flaking of the nipple, or redness or pitting of the skin over your breast.

If you have seen any changes or found a lump in your breast and are concerned, you should schedule an appointment to talk with your doctor.

Q: Are there any 'groups' more at risk for breast cancer than others?

A: There are some factors associated with an increased risk of developing breast cancer, but it is important to remember that having one or more of these factors does not mean you will automatically develop breast cancer. Many people who develop breast cancer do not have any of these risk factors.

The risk factors are:

Being female - Women are more likely to develop breast cancer than men (but men can develop it).

Increased age - The risk increases for those women who are 55 years or older.

Obesity - Obesity increases your risk of developing breast cancer because fat tissues produce estrogen that can help advance certain cancer cells.

Q: My sister was recently diagnosed with breast cancer. Thankfully, she caught it early, so the doctor said the prognosis was "good." But still, are there things I can do that could help minimize the chances of me getting breast cancer?

A: Small changes to your daily life can help decrease some of the risk factors associated with breast cancer. Maintaining or developing healthy habits such as exercising, maintaining a healthy weight, and limiting alcohol are measures you can take to institute a healthy lifestyle.

American Cancer Society, women ages 40 to 44 should have the choice to start annual breast cancer screening with mammograms if they wish to do so. Women ages 45 to 54 should get mammograms every year. Women 55 and older should switch to mammograms every 2 years or can continue yearly screening.

Q: My friend was recently diagnosed with breast cancer, and it was a reality check. Her doctor told her that surgery was her only choice. Is that true?

A: I cannot comment on a specific person, but in general, treatment for breast cancer varies depending on the type of breast cancer, how advanced the disease has progressed, and the patient's health. The various treatment options are:

Surgery – Surgeries vary depending on the severity of the disease. A lumpectomy is when the tumor and surrounding tissue are removed, and a mastectomy is the removal of all the breast tissue. A doctor may also suggest the removal of lymph nodes that surround the breast tissue to prevent the spreading of tumors and cancerous cells.

Radiation Therapy – Radiation is a type of treatment that uses high-powered beams of energy to kill cancerous cells. Radiation might be used after surgery to decrease the chance of cancer cells spreading.

Chemotherapy – Chemotherapy uses drugs to kill cancer cells. This treatment may be recommended for people who have a stronger chance of reoccurrence with their disease, and it can even be given to women before they have surgery. The side effects of chemotherapy can be severe, with hair loss, nausea, vomiting, and fatigue.

Drugs – There are various drug treatments, such as trastuzumab, lapatinib, and bevacizumab, that are designed to treat specific abnormalities within the cancer cell.



In addition to changing your daily routine, you can also take a more proactive approach to self-examinations and screenings:

Breast self-examination – Breast selfexaminations require you to check your breasts to detect any lumps or changes. You should do a self-examination on the same day every month in order to remain consistent. Self-examinations are done by lying down on the floor or a bed, taking your three middle fingers, and moving them in small coin-sized circles around your breasts. Applying light, medium, and hard pressure throughout the examination will help you check the various tissue levels of your breast.

Mammograms – A mammogram is an x-ray picture of the breast, and it is meant to check for tumors in the breast that might not be detected through self-examination. Ask your doctor what age you should begin getting a mammogram. According to the



Jeff Grunow, Candidate for BOT

Please let me introduce myself and ask for your support on Election Day. Although formally named Jeffrey, I simply go by Jeff. In May of 2017, my wife and I moved to Barefoot Bay after taking early retirement from Weber State University in Ogden, UT. Having served three years on the violations committee, I was honored to be chosen to fill Roger Compton's unexpired BOT term in 2020. Again, I'm honored to be serving out Mike Mainos's term.

I've always contributed to public service. In my collegiate days, I was active in our rural volunteer fire department and rescue squad. Having gone to school to be an RN, I taught numerous first aid courses to the Boy Scouts and the community. As a volunteer mobile intensive care nurse, in 1982, the state of NJ allowed me to test out as a National Registry paramedic. Up until retirement, I built paramedic education programs in Central NJ, Eastern KY, Charlotte, NC, and the entire Intermountain West (ID, WY, UT, NV). I estimate over my education career, I've led to the certification of nearly 1,000 paramedic students. In addition to teaching, I served 22 years in the USAF Reserve as an aeromedical evacuation flight nurse, retiring as a Colonel. I presently serve as the commander of Barefoot Bay American Legion Post 366.

I'm pleased to say I make every effort to communicate with the residents. If you e-mail, phone, mail, meet me on my screen porch, and yes, I'll visit your home. I respond to all concerns. If you ask a question, I will be brutally honest with an answer.

Upon election, I will continue to serve ALL residents and the interests of the Bay. As we go forward, the greatest challenge for the District will be our aging infrastructure, which is approaching 50 years of age. As a board member, I will continue to prioritize infrastructure projects in our five-year plan. I'm not afraid to question the status quo. I also like the consistency of operation. During my first term, I was keenly interested in reviewing the Bay's COVID-19 status at every BOT meeting. I was a champion in changing BOT terms to 3 years on a 2-2-1 election cycle. This change, up for referendum in 2022, passed and will allow for greater efficacy of new board members and never allow a majority of the BOT to turn in any election. Another initiative I successfully supported was to raise our capital spending limit to \$50K, allowing our Neighborhood Revitalization Program to better compete with developers and "flippers."

I've enjoyed serving the Bay by finishing Roger Compton's and Mike Maino's terms as a trustee. If elected, I will continue to serve the residents of the Bay with both the ethical and due diligence expected.



Most Board of Trustee Meetings Are Poorly Attended

I have seen multiple comments on Barefoot Bay-related Facebook pages asking why the Barefoot Bay Board of Trustees (BOT) meetings are not held in the evenings. Historically, people don't attend evening meetings. Evening meeting attendance has been no different than afternoon meeting attendance, which is lackluster at best unless there's a "hot topic" like the recent fee schedule changes. People say they will go to the evening meetings, and they may go once or twice, but then they stop going. It's also important to note that evening meetings are not conducive to having department heads from BBRD attend due to their 8-5 work schedules. I think everyone would agree that it's important to have them at these meetings.

What are you going to accomplish at an evening meeting that can't be accomplished at a daytime meeting? Actually, very little. You can call or email the BOT members and the Community Manager anytime and ask your email to be read aloud during the audience participation part of the meeting. As long as your letter takes less than 3 minutes to read, you've accomplished exactly what you would have accomplished going to the meeting since Trustees do not respond to audience participation. You're not missing out on interaction with them, but they are still hearing your point of view through your email.

BOT meetings are live-streamed, and recordings of the meetings are available if you are unable to stream them live. If there's an issue with the recording, minutes of every meeting are available in the agenda packet for the next meeting. The meeting schedule is in the Peek of the Week every Monday, and the BOT meeting agenda is available on BBRD.org one week prior to each meeting. These are available for those interested in viewing what will be before the BOT twice a month. The District publishes these ahead of each meeting. No one is hiding agenda items from you. No one is secretly voting.

There were lots of comments online regarding the new fee schedule, which was completely ready to go after months of meetings, and because of the volume of emails received and calls from residents, the Barefoot Bay Recreation District Trustees held a town hall meeting, followed by a workshop to adjust the fees. Please stop suggesting the Trustees don't listen to the community because your suggestions weren't included or acted upon. I have been unhappy with some of the BOT's recent votes, but I realize that they are doing what they think is in the best interest of the District and the residents of Barefoot Bay.

You have elected the Board of Trustees to represent you. They strive to represent the majority of the community, not their own interests. If the majority of the community doesn't tell the BOT what matters to them, how can they know how to vote? Use your voice. Email them, call them, or text them about issues that matter to you. You have the agenda at your fingertips one week before each meeting. Trust that they are working as best as they can for you. If you think they are doing a terrible job, let them know and consider voting for someone else...

It's a volunteer position. If you think can do better, run for the BOT next year.




