Early Fall Musings

Progress has come slowly to south Brevard—many in our community like it that way. The past six months have seen a dramatic drop off in traffic on Micco Road with the road closure, and to be honest, it's been nice, and it feels safer. This must have been what it was like back in the late 70s and 80s when there were few homes to drive traffic between Palm Bay and US1 on our stretch of Micco Road. Remember the oranges? They were everywhere. As much as we'd like to go back to those days, I'm afraid progress has finally caught up to our little neck of the woods.

Don Walker with Brevard County has confirmed that the Micco Road Bridge project will be completed, and Micco Road will reopen to through traffic by October 2. This will come as a welcome relief to those that traveled that stretch between US1 and Babcock Street while at the same time increasing traffic overnight. Increased traffic also increases the danger for anyone turning onto or crossing Micco Road. Please take extra care as others may not.

Progress continues, with thousands of new homes planned just to our west. Palm Bay is growing fast, and new developments will begin to appear along Micco Road sooner rather than later. We need to remain diligent, protecting the interests of the people who live in our community. Traffic studies will be done and we need to make our concerns known during government meetings related to growth in south Brevard County. Will we receive traffic signals, signaled crosswalks, wider roads, proper drainage, and/or noise abatement? In the long term, we also need to ensure access to the growth to our west via a multi-use path for walking, biking, and golf carts along Micco Road.

Have you noticed the Brightline trains? I don't know if it's me, but does it feel like there are fewer trains? Brightline's website appears to offer the same 32 scheduled trips, but I don't see them as much anymore. I saw a shorter Brightline train with only five cars, which only made it appear that much faster. Zoom, and it's gone.

After a very ominous start to this year's hurricane season, the middle of the season has provided few threats for Florida. At the time of publication, there was a storm brewing in the Caribbean that had the potential to hit the USA, and may be headed for Florida as you read this. But with 60 days left in this hurricane season we can keep our fingers (and toes) crossed that our area avoids a hurricane this year.

Even without major storm activity, we've had plenty of rain, and with these thunderstorms, there's always the possibility of a tornado. We don't see EF5 tornadoes in FL, but it doesn't take more than a dust devil to create havoc for a manufactured home. Florida's EF0 and EF1 tornadoes have plenty of destructive force and have caused significant damage and deaths in Barefoot Bay and southern Brevard in the past. You're actually more likely to experience a tornado in our area than a hurricane, so take note of where you would go in the event of a tornado warning. An interior room, closet, or bathroom is ideal. My first home on Vireo Drive had tornado damage from a system associated with Hurricane Wilma in 2005. In 1993, a tornado associated with Hurricane Gordon destroyed quite a few homes in Barefoot Bay, left several people injured, and killed a resident. It doesn't take a hurricane to spawn a tornado. Be aware and be prepared. A weather radio is always a great addition to any home in Florida.

I don't know if you are aware, but there's an election coming up in just a few weeks. Florida residents will be voting for President, US Senator, several Florida Constitutional Amendments, including recreational marijuana legalization and abortion, as well as a variety of local races including our Trustees fighting it out for an extra year of service to the community. To say the least, it's important that you vote. If you're not currently registered, you still have time. Even if you know you're currently registered, it always makes sense to check your current status and be sure that you haven't been purged from the voter rolls in error. Go to Vote.org to check your current status and make sure you are registered to vote before October 11.

There are two Christmas-oriented events coming on consecutive weekends in November. Candy Cane Lane is offering a fun way to meet many of Barefoot Bay's local crafters and visit multiple yard sales on a single weekend. Each Candy Cane location, marked with a yard sign, will be printed on a map in the next issue of The Tattler.

The following weekend, Barbara Snow Events is hosting a Kris Kringle Market near Building A. This will be a large three day event that will feature local musicians, crafters and vendors, food trucks and a variety of activities for children including the opportunity to make Christmas ornaments and even meet Santa. Barbara Snow is well known for producing similar events around the area and has hosted several events at Riverside Park in Sebastian. This is her first show in Barefoot Bay. Let's help make it a success.



BOT Happenings:

08/27/24 Regular Meeting

The Board voted to accept the Staff's recommendation of Florida Blue for healthcare coverage due to its low deductibles and competitive premiums and Principal Insurance due to its low premiums and employee satisfaction for the last six years.

The Board had to officially ratify the motion approved by the Board at the August 15, 2024, Special Meeting to repair the BBRD Golf Course irrigation system by Paramount Pump

The Board voted to accept a donation of \$1,028.35 from Louise Hirst for a memorial bench to be located at the end of the fishing pier facing the river.

09/12/24 Regular Meeting

5-year service awards were presented to Property Services employees Pamela Williams and Ray Cliche.

The Policy Manual Resolution 2024-08, amendments, and updates were accepted.

Peter Cary was re-appointed to the Architectural Review Control Committee (ARCC) as a voting member for another 3-year term.

The FY2026 budget meeting schedule was set.

Resolution 2024-10, adopting BBRD's goals, objectives, performance measures, and standards as mandated by section 189.0694 of the Florida Statutes, was passed. This requirement is new this year. When ready, it will be posted on the website.

There was a discussion on the locking mechanism for the beach restroom. The main problem is that a "door" lock cannot be keyed to match a "padlock," so the existing gate key is not usable for the restrooms. Property Services had three types of locks to suggest to the board. It was decided to investigate a "key card" system. This system, once implemented, can then be used to lock access into most of the amenities, and there will not be a need for a traditional key. 

Arthritis and You

Approximately 53.2 million U.S. adults aged 18 years and older have been diagnosed with arthritis, with the prevalence higher among women at 20.9% compared to men at 16.3% (and 24.2% among Veterans compared to 18.5% among non-veterans), according to the National Institute of Health (NIH). If you or a loved one are among these statistics, it's important to know how to minimize the pain from this debilitating disease. Below, we answer your questions:

Q. I'm embarrassed, but I don't know exactly what arthritis is. Could you please explain it?

A. Arthritis is joint swelling that causes pain and discomfort. It occurs when there is inflammation in one or more joints and can involve a breakdown in cartilage. Cartilage protects the joints, so when there is limited cartilage, joints can become sore and inflamed, causing swelling and pain.

Q. My mom was diagnosed with "rheumatoid arthritis." What exactly is this, and are there other kinds of arthritis?

A. The term "arthritis" generally describes more than 100 types of rheumatic diseases and conditions affecting the joints. Rheumatic conditions are generally described as pain and stiffness in the joints and can evolve gradually over time.

• Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA) is an autoimmune condition that occurs when arthritis affects five or more joints. RA 'activity' levels can fluctuate over the course of the condition or the condition can increase in pain and be constant.

• Osteoarthritis is commonly known as a joint disease and is the most common form of arthritis. It is defined by the symptoms of pain, swelling, and stiffness; approximately 12.4 million adults ages twenty-five and older suffer from it. It is estimated to affect about 26.9 million adults ages sixty-five and older.

• Childhood Arthritis is an umbrella term for several types of arthritis. There are many different cases and clinically differing definitions of childhood arthritis; however, the most common type is juvenile arthritis, which affects children sixteen years of age and younger.

Q. Isn't arthritis just normal pain that comes with getting older?

A. No. It is a common misconception that arthritis is strictly a disease of old age. Arthritis affects people of many ages, even infants and children. Arthritis is not necessarily normal aging pain; it can indicate a larger, more severe problem in the joints. In some cases, arthritis can cause debilitating pain and discomfort.

Q. I think I have arthritis. Is there a cure?

A. There are varying treatment options available for those suffering from arthritis. It is important to understand that a few arthritis-related conditions can be cured, but most forms of arthritis are a chronic condition and can last long-term. Therefore, much of the treatment for arthritis is centered on pain management.

Usually, an over-the-counter medication such as aspirin or ibuprofen is recommended to treat the inflammation and pain. In some cases, your doctor may prescribe medication to help manage symptoms. Prescription medications may include biologics to improve quality of life or corticosteroids to help reduce inflammation. In some cases, surgery to rebuild or replace a joint may be recommended. It is important to talk with your physician before undergoing any treatment options.

In addition, lifestyle modifications are a great way to treat arthritis, especially when treating osteoarthritis, and may include:

 \bullet Implementing an exercise program such as low-impact aerobic activity, range of motion exercises for increased flexibility, and strength training.

• Introduce physical therapy into your life through specific exercise; also, utilize hot and cold compresses, splints, and other orthotics to support joints, water therapy, or frequent massages.

• Getting plenty of sleep, which may help prevent arthritis flare-ups.

- Avoid movements that put extra stress on the joints.
- Avoid staying in one position for too long.
- Including more fruits and vegetables in your diet.
- Losing weight (if you are overweight) to relieve added stress to the joints.



The PACT Act ensures that Veterans receive the comprehensive, tailored care they have earned. Its two main types are dry ARMD, involving the gradual breakdown of light-sensitive cells, and wet ARMD, characterized by abnormal blood vessel growth beneath the macula, leading to bleeding, swelling, and rapid vision loss.



Prevention is key. Smoking and poor diet are major controllable factors for ARMD, while genetics can also play a role beyond your control. Combatting these risks involves adopting proactive measures, such as a ketogenic diet enriched with dark green leafy vegetables like spinach, kale, collard greens, and arugula. These veggies contain lutein and zeaxanthin pigments, which deposit in the macula, protecting against oxidative damage—a crucial factor in ARMD progression. Avoid processed foods, especially toxic seed oils like canola, corn, and vegetable oil.

The landmark AREDS2 study, spanning over 15 years with thousands of patients, demonstrated that a specific multivitamin formula reduced the relative risk of ARMD progression by one-third.

Regular vision monitoring is vital. Besides annual retina exams, check each eye separately monthly, immediately reporting any distortions or missing areas on the Amsler grid to your ophthalmologist. Such distortions may signal retinal changes, indicating the shift from dry to wet ARMD.


Untreated wet ARMD can lead to irreversible scar tissue formation and permanent vision loss. Fortunately, anti-VEGF drugs, repurposed from chemotherapy, can treat wet ARMD and prevent scarring. These drugs necessitate periodic injections through the white of the eye after numbing drops to maintain vision and prevent further damage.

Alas, because of its odd nature the last book of the Bible is also for so many the lost book of the Bible. But you can unlock some of its secrets and mine some of its riches by keeping a few things in mind.

First, the Bible is like a library with many kinds of books. Some appeal to the will, like the books of the Law; some to the intellect, like the book of Romans; some to the heart, like the Psalms; and some to the imagination, like Revelation. Such books use symbols.

Some symbols are pictorial—imagine a political cartoon with a Russian bear and a Republican elephant. The words Russian and Republican are not there, but we know what they mean, and a lot is covered in those pictures: the Cold War and much more in one; presidential candidates and much more in the other. It is a compressed, efficient, and imaginative way of communicating.

Other symbols are literary. We know, for example, that Jonathan Swift wrote Gulliver's Travels to say something about the politics of his day. If he had said it straightforwardly, he'd have been thrown in jail for sedition. However, the way he put it imaginatively as a story allowed him to communicate without being thrown in prison.

Some symbols are numerical. We get jumpy around "Friday the 13th." See? Or we might say there were a hundred there. No one quibbles about whether there were actually 96 or a 111. We know it means a lot.

Keep these thoughts in mind and see how Revelation seems to you now.






Obituaries




