Summer Musings

Echoes of Warning, Notes of Hope

It only takes a spark. A week ago Thursday, lightning struck in Micco, sparking a blaze that burned through the night and into Friday morning, scorching more than 200 acres. For a while, many of us wondered if homes in Barefoot Bay would catch fire. We were spared. River Grove was evacuated for a short period of time while flames were literally in their backyard. A multi-county fire department effort kept the flames away from structures through the night, and we are deeply grateful for the dedication and resilience of those firefighters who made all the difference. Unfortunately, a home was lost off Fleming Grant Friday morning after an all-night effort. The fact that only a single home was lost is a blessing, but also a warning. Tragedy can strike any one of us like a bolt of lightning from the sky. Whether fire, tornado, or hurricane, the potential for disaster is always just beyond the horizon.

This summer has reminded us of that reality in more ways than one. Our community voted decisively to change the Deed of Restrictions and once again allow singlewides (600 sq ft minimum), marking their return to Barefoot Bay. It was the most significant DOR vote in decades, and more than 70% of those who cast ballots approved the change — even though overall turnout was lower than hoped. For those who voted in favor, the message is clear: you now have options if you ever need to replace your for Barefoot Bay. As development moves home. The decision reflects a community into our area, the community spirit, involve-

looking ahead and insisting on choices, even if not everyone agrees on how best to get

For Richard Clayton, that choice means everything. Richard lost his home last year, an older single-wide, and has been living in limbo while waiting for the community's decision. His damaged home has now been removed, the lot cleared, and the surveys and permits are in the works. Richard will soon build the first single-wide to return to Barefoot Bay in more than twenty-five years. Naturally, he feels the pressure. "Oh yeah," he told me, "We want the place to shine like a new dime. After all the attention this has brought us, I can do no less." His optimism and gratitude toward his fellow homeowners — is a reminder that these decisions are about people, not just policy.

Richard's optimism mirrors something larger. Over the past year, many in our community have rolled up their sleeves in ways big and small. We came together on the DOR and were successful, proving that persistence and participation can make a difference. At the same time, there has been an uphill — yet sincere — effort to petition the Barefoot Bay Water and Sewer District, which will not make a difference. Sometimes you win, sometimes you lose, but what matters is that we tried together. New challenges bigger challenges — are on the horizon

ment, and support we have shown are as important as ever.

We've also been reminded that growth around us is not slowing down. Lotis, Emerald Lakes, Ashton Park — names that may sound far off but will soon mean more traffic, more strain on Micco Road, and more pressure on the way of life we've built here. And here's a caveat: I haven't written before about Emerald Lakes. It's another 3,760 homes planned at the intersection of the St. Johns Heritage Parkway and I-95. Where exactly does the County expect all those

eastbound cars to go? Everyone knows Micco Road can't handle the burden alone. The recent fire even cleared the way for a potential road south of the solar farm - yet we hear nothing. Hello? Is there anybody out there?

That's why,

when our attempts to meet directly with Ashton Park's representatives fell through, I sent a list of questions (see sidebar), pertinent to the new growth, to the players — the developer's engineer, Palm Bay city officials the warning.

and county staff at Brevard County Bridges and Roads, and asked the Board of Trustees to formerly invite them to October's Town Hall. Barefoot Bay residents deserve more than rumors and secondhand updates. We deserve to be in the room, hearing firsthand what's planned, and making our needs

BOT Happenings:

7/22/2025 Meeting Highlights:

Island Harbor Custom Builders, LLC, was awarded the contract for the lounge cooler project. After the contract is signed, permitting will begin. Upon the county issuing the permits, work will begin. The walkway, behind the lounge, will be closed for the duration. The "smoking area" will be temporarily relocated. Please check for signs. Once work starts, it is estimated to take 2 to 3 weeks to complete.

The public Hearing and Adoption of the FY26 Non-Ad Valorem Special Assessment was held. Resolution 2025-09 was read by Mr. Olsen and adopted by the board of trustees.

Green Hammer Concrete, LLC, was chosen as the Concrete Contractor for the replacement Shed and Canopy - Pickleball/Tennis Courts Project.

The title of the "Community Manager" was changed to "District Manager" to align the title with the duties of the position and to be consistent with all other "Special Districts". "Community Manager" was a holdover from before Barefoot Bay was a special district.

8/14/2025 Meeting Highlights:

The BOT approved and certified the 2025 DOR Ballot and Amended and Restated Deed of Restrictions with incorporated amendments. All questions were passed with a majority of "YES" votes.

The BOT approved and adopted Resolution 2025-10, providing for submission to the electors for approval or disapproval of a ballot question asking if the Board of Trustees of the Barefoot Bay Recreation District shall have the authority to expend no more

than \$165,000.00 on the construction of two new pickleball courts and certifying Resolution 2025-08 to the Brevard County Supervisor of Elections.

These courts are in the FY2026 budget using a FRDAP grant. The way FRDAP grants work is that you apply, you get the go-ahead from the State, and then you build it using your money. When the job is completed, the state inspects the job to make sure you did what was promised. When you pass, they start the reimbursement process. Since the new courts are not "connected" to the existing courts, it could be interpreted as a new amenity. Our charter states that a vote of the electors of the District must be held on "new" projects over the \$50,000 limit, so a question will be on this November's Election ballot.

Complete Electric, Inc. was chosen to repair and update the Golf Course Irrigation Electrical System. The cost is to be funded under the FY2025 FRDAP Grant.

I was asked to remind people to walk in the pedestrian lane and face traffic. If you don't face traffic, you may be putting your life in jeopardy! Please be alert on the streets- keep your head up, not down, looking at your phone.




A Word From Your

County Commissioner

On July 22nd, the Board of County Commissioners held a Public Hearing to set the Tentative Millage for fiscal year 2025-2026. Questions are frequently asked about taxes, including what they are and how they have changed. Property owners in Brevard County's areas will encounter a multi-component property tax structure for the 2025-2026 fiscal year, which begins on October 1, 2025. Here's a breakdown:

General Countywide Property Tax Rate: The proposed General Fund millage rate for the 2025-2026 fiscal year is 2.8643 per \$1,000 of taxable property value. This represents a slight decrease of 1.93% from the previous fiscal year while reducing property tax rates for the twelfth consecutive year and adhering to the Charter Cap on ad valorem tax revenue growth. This millage rate funds general county operations and services available to all residents.



Aggregate Property Tax Rate: This encompasses the general fund rate along with other millages that might apply to specific areas or situations. The proposed rate for the upcoming year is 4.5129 per \$1,000 of taxable value, an increase of 2.34% from the 2024-2025 rate.

Special Assessments: These are based on property use and type as opposed to property values. Examples include Stormwater, Fire Services, and Solid Waste.

Voter-Approved Millages: A specific property tax levy that requires the explicit approval of voters to be implemented or renewed. They fund specific programs or projects with a dedicated funding source. Examples are the Environmentally Endangered Lands (EELs) Program and the county-wide Parks referendums.

Charter Cap: Brevard County has a voter-approved charter provision limiting year-toyear increases in property tax revenue to the lesser of 3% or the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (which is 2.95% for FY 2025-2026). This limitation excludes revenue from new construction and voter-approved tax rates.

The County Manager prepared a budget that complies with the Charter Cap revenue growth limitation outlined in the County Charter. The millage rates presented by staff were for a budget that included significant cuts to capital improvement projects for a variety of Departments. The Board supported advertising an increase to the millage rates for Parks and Recreation and the Environmentally Endangered Lands Program to half of the voterapproved rates. Additionally, an increase in the Fire Control Municipal Service Taxing Unit to the full voter-approved amount was advertised by the Board.

The 2025 Truth in Millage (TRIM) Notices were mailed to all property owners on Monday, August 18, 2025. They are also available online through the Brevard County Property Appraiser's website. The TRIM Notice provides estimated property taxes for the year and is not an actual tax bill. The official 2025 property tax bills will be mailed in early November.

I believe the Commission made tough decisions on setting the Tentative Millages and exemplifies the Board's dedication to providing responsive, quality services to residents and maintaining fiscal sustainability. Strategic decisions were made to balance the General Fund budget, including the dissolution of the North Brevard Economic Development Zone. Given rising costs that outpaced revenue growth, further reductions across County departments were necessary to achieve the Board's priorities.

Through strategic decision-making and planning, Brevard County stands poised to meet current needs and future challenges, while striving to enhance community well-being and quality of life.

On September 10th at 5:30, the Commission will hold its first Public Hearing, and on September 23rd at 5:30, it will hold the Final Budget Hearing. Future meetings will provide an opportunity for the County Commission to decrease the millages prior to the adoption of the rates. These rates cannot be increased from the advertised tentative millages. The link below will take you to the proposed 2025/2026 budget.







- *2)* While you are visiting your local VA clinic, look for and take a sheet called "Save A Trip... How to Reach Us Between Appointments," which has many more helpful tips. Use it and write on it your doctors' extension numbers. You'll be glad you did. File it in a folder you reserve for Health Matters.
- *3)* Discover within your circle of contacts (family and friends) who actually take an interest in your well-being. Consider making them your health care advocate. You never know when a big decision comes up and you need someone to talk to about it.

Take a look at everyone's creation—each pear tells its own little story, and together they make a truly joyful harvest of talent!









COMPUTER CLUB

Scams and scammers are still the #1 topic of discussion from the Sheriff's Office, Federal Trade Commission, the AARP Magazine, and so many other places. Why? Because it is that important and that profitable for those who continue to call you, leave brochures, emails, and send you letters.

The first suggestion is to read whatever is sent and make sure you understand what is being offered. If you have questions, call the actual provider- not the number on the letter. The phone number can be found on the billing statement, or you can Google the company and get the Customer Service number. Recently, people in Barefoot Bay are receiving notices from FPL regarding their meters- is this for real? I don't know, but I do highly suggest that you contact FPL, which may not be the phone number on the notice. Always check with the provider of the service in question, not the number listedwhether it is from FPL, your bank, your credit card, or any other source. This is the easiest way for a scammer to get you to talk to them further, and to "offer" you something is when you have just called them back.

Second, you are not required to answer your phone just because it rings. If you recognize the number, feel free to answer. If you do not recognize the number, please do not answer. It is as simple as that. Many scam calls will only ring 3 times, and then they disconnect. How frustrating it is to rush to answer the phone only to have no one at the other end. The scammers have plenty of other people to call who might be "victims," and they do not want to spend time waiting for you to get to the phone. Could you wait for three rings before answering? If it is someone who needs to talk to you, they will leave a message or call right back. A scammer will not call your number again in a short time frame. If you do get a message, listen carefully to what the caller is asking. You do not want to provide your name, phone number, social security number, bank account, or credit card information to someone you do not know. Reviewing a message will give you time to think about the message and what your response might be, before you begin the conversation by calling back.

Third, you are in control of who you buy from, who you talk to, and who you invite into your home. Make sure you know and fully understand the caller's purpose or the information in an email or letter.






