Tornadoes Miss, but Hurricane Milton's Winds **Damage Roofs and Carports**

Hurricane Milton's October visit resulted in damage to over 200 homes in Barefoot Bay, based on an assessment made the day after by Kent Cichon and the BBRD. The home of the Tattler was included on the list as we experienced some minor roof damage. Several homes in our community received significant damage, including one home considered uninhabitable. Others received damage to carports, roofs, Florida rooms, siding, awnings, as well as a few broken windows. Most of the more serious damage occurred to the oldest homes in our community. Newer homes held up well to the 45 - 75mph winds we experienced.

We should be thanking our lucky stars, considering the storm lost intensity as it crossed the state before reaching Barefoot Bay, but not before producing nine confirmed tornadoes (possibly as many as 14) just a few miles to our south, that did significant damage to Vero Beach, Indian River, Martin, and St Lucie Counties where six people died. The deadliest tornado, an EF2 with winds up to 125 miles per hour, was on the ground for 31 miles. Brevard County had a confirmed report of an EF0 tornado in Cocoa Beach that caused some dam-

We are incredibly lucky that those tornadoes missed Barefoot Bay, especially with the lack of a voluntary evacuation order by Brevard County EOG. Older manufactured/mobile homes are susceptible to significant damage, even from weak hurricanes and tropical storms, as seen by those homes that were damaged in Barefoot Bay, and even newer homes will not survive a tornado, which these storms are known to produce frequently. The lack of a call to "voluntarily" find alternative shelter during this storm may seem appropriate after the fact. Considering what happened to our south (and north), I wholeheartedly disagree. Our County government should always err on the side of safety, not luck or intuition. Brevard County should have made a voluntary evacuation "official" instead of nonchalantly suggesting communities like Barefoot Bay should evacuate in a video chat no one saw.

When the next hurricane comes, plan on leaving. Your life is worth more than a night in a hotel or crashing on the floor of a friend's house, as my family did for Milton.



Can you believe it? Halloween will be behind us shortly; we turn the clocks back on November 3rd. Hurricane Season is almost over, and the Holiday Season is upon us once again! It's hard to differentiate between bad stress and good stress! But we are here!

Barefoot Bay had quite a scare with Hurricane Milton, and although we had over 200 homes with damage, we had no fatalities. I am not downplaying the degree of damage, but it truly could have been so much worse. The District did an excellent job with its Emergency Plan during and in the aftermath of the storm. For those of you who may not be aware, a core group of employees must remain during this type of crisis to be prepared for the worst. And for the most part, those employees leave their own families and cover the needs of the Bay first and foremost. I wish to give them my deep respect and gratitude.

For those of us who have insurance, please make sure you file your claim. And remember that Brevard County residents may now apply for federal disaster assistance for losses resulting from Hurricane Milton. "To be eligible for federal aid under FEMA's Individual Assistance Program, storm damage and losses from the hurricane and flooding must have occurred as a result of Hurricane Milton, which made landfall in the Bradenton area and exited through Brevard County on October 10."

"If you have insurance, you must file a claim with your insurance company first. If you do not have insurance or insurance does not cover your claim, begin applying for FEMA assistance. Online at DisasterAssistance.gov, on the FEMA app, or by calling 800-621-3362 (FEMA)." Toll-free numbers are open from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., seven days a week.

You will need the following: Contact information (telephone number, mailing address, Social Security number); household income; address of damaged home or apartment; description of damaged/lost items; photos of your damaged home and belongings; information about insurance coverage; and Bank account and routing numbers for direct deposit of funds.

BOT Happenings: 09/24/24 Regular Meeting

Liability & Workers' Compensation *Insurance Award of Contract*

BBRD's liability insurance premiums are based on the history of claims, amount of coverage, and overall industry trends. For these reasons, the liability premium has increased to \$201,590 from \$194,477.90 the previous year (a difference of \$7,112.10). BBRD's workers' compensation insurance premiums are calculated based on the amount of exposure (payroll,) the rate for the classification or type of work performed by the employees, and general market conditions. They are then debited or credited by a "modifier" of the three years experience prior to the current year. A "MOD" of 1.00 is average or "par." By analogy, a bank lending rate is "modified" by an applicant's credit score. Please note that the increased experience modifier is from the claims activity in the last three years of FIA policies, thus increasing the premium from \$42,024 to \$67,019 (a difference of \$24,995).

The BOT accepted the Staff's recommendation to award liability and workers' compensation insurance coverage to PGIT (Brown & Brown) for \$288,330 and liquor liability insurance coverage to Founders Insurance Company in the amount of (\$19,721.

2025 BOT Meeting Schedule

The board accepted the Staff's recommendation to approve the proposed dates for the regularly scheduled BOT meetings and January Townhall meeting in the calendar year 2025 and authorized staff to advertise them in the Florida Today newspaper.

CivicPlus Media & CivicClerk Annual Renewal

The Master Services Agreement commenced on September 14, 2018, and remains in full force and effect during any associated Statement of Work (SOW) term. This renewal Statement of Work for the products above begins at the renewal date and runs for twelve months, then automatically renews for additional one-year renewal terms. The BOT approved the one-year Statement of Work (SOW) with CivicPlus for CivicPlus Media and CivicClerk in the amount of \$17,434.34.

Hurricane Milton Info:

More than 200 homes were damaged during Milton, and no injuries were reported. No District property was damaged.

I commend our Property Services department for their excellent work moving all the pool chairs, canopies, and other loose items to secure storage in building A. They also removed the nets at the golf course and put

many, many storm shutters on all the buildings to protect our investments. Also, thanks to every department that helped with the preparations.

They got right on the cleanup and stayed late to get things in shape, so the district was able to reopen most amenities on Friday. Thanks to everyone who pitched in with the brush clean-up and helped their neighbors.


Leonard Todd Russell, III




