#### **Family Promise Update**

Family Promise has continued to serve families throughout the pandemic and has expanded services to single women. The program also now includes two apartments for families who need shelter.

The return to the church rotation model may begin as early as January 2022. We are currently surveying our volunteers to be sure we have enough people to help us remain as a host church. We will continue to need cooks (solo or teams) to prepare meals, people to serve the meal and dine with the families (5pm-8pm), and volunteers to stay overnight and set up breakfast (8pm-7:30 am). Our church becomes a one-week shelter for up to four families 4-5 weeks of the year.
