### Why a Rain Garden?

State law requires Christ the King to have a stormwater management program to effectively deal with the water that runs off our building, as well as our pervious and impervious pavement sections. CTK's very own Mark Ellena, PE, reviewed our options and designed a rain garden to meet code with the understanding that the rain garden would be planted, maintained, and nurtured by members of Christ the King. Three years ago, over a dozen members of CTK gathered to spread and rake 35 cubic yards of engineered soil, plant 16 varieties of plants totaling over 400 with many having been added since.

These plants were chosen for their ability to effectively filter /clean the water from the lot to replenish groundwater while sequestering carbon within their root structure. The native plants in our garden are not only beautiful but extremely beneficial to our environment on multiple levels. Sadly, our rain garden was recently damaged when someone cut the tops from a large section of plants without consulting the garden committee.

Gardens provide healing and a calming atmosphere that is a gift from God. Please take a moment to enjoy our gardens while respecting their space and the hard work of those who devote time and energy to maintaining them.

Please respect the space of the rain garden. Don't walk through it. Do not trim the plants or disturb them in any way.

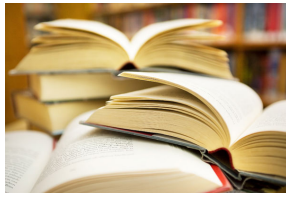

### HELP OUR AFGHAN ALLIES

Local Resources Updates (This is a rapidly changing situation. We will try to update this page as we receive more information. WCC is coordinating with Lutheran Social Services to offer educational resources and help connect churches to needs as they become clear).

- At this time, the Red Cross is helping Refugees who are at Ft. McCoy. All donations are being coordinated through them.
- Once refugees are officially settled in Wisconsin, local organizations like **Lutheran Social Services**, will coordinate and provide support.
- From Bishop Paul Erikson (ELCA – Milwaukee) – “LSS Refugee Resettlement has been notified that a large number of Afghans will be coming to the area and services will be needed. This is a fluid situation, and details are still unclear. What LSS needs to look into and set up:·
  1. Cash donations to pay for rent or residence hotels for up to 6 months.·
  2. Congregations with space for dormitory-style settings for up to 3 months.
  3. Ability to hook up several washers and dryers.·
  4. Catered food options and donations.·
  5. Personal hygiene kits.·
  6. Volunteers for recreation and child care respite for parents or single parents.·
  7. Volunteers for community outings.

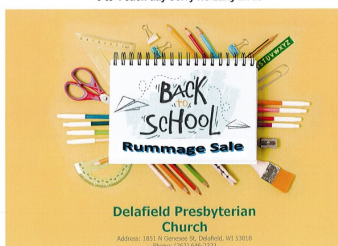
