Daily Devotions from Pastor Jim April 2 & 3

In the Cross of Christ, I Glory

It is tempting to focus on the moment when circumstances around us are so unstable and scary. Incessant watching of the news is not necessarily the best plan for our mental or emotional health. While we carefully abide by the mandates and recommendations from our government and health agencies we can also look beyond the current crisis



and come back to the grounding we have in our God. The great hymn of Lent "In the Cross of Christ I Glory" by John Bowring, 1792 -1872, expresses the truth of the cross of Jesus that helps us look beyond the day to day struggle. The first verse is:

In the cross of Christ I glory, tow'ring o'er the wrecks of time. All the light of sacred story, gathers round its head sublime.

In my personal devotions this week I was struck by the fourth verse.

Bane and blessing, pain and pleasure, by the cross are sanctified; peace is there that knows no measure, joys that through all time abide.

All our life experiences, good and bad, are sanctified, made holy, by Jesus on the cross. In the cross of Christ I can know peace that has no limit and can experience joy that transcends the moment that we are now in. This was good news for me.

Psalm 143:8 Let me hear of your lovingkindness in the morning, for I put my trust in you; show me the road that I must walk, for I lift up my soul to you. Prayer: O God, we have moments of despair and uncertainty. We hurt for those who must suffer and die alone and without family surrounding them. Help us to trust in these times of trial and pain. Lift our eyes to focus on your presence and show us the way to follow. Amen.

Hosanna in the Highest

Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday can be a confusing day on the church calendar. The scriptures for the day move from crowds shouting praise to Jesus who comes in Jerusalem on a donkey and ends with an angry mob demanding that he be crucified. I don't mind saying that I prefer Palm Sunday with a good crowd that waves branches and encourages Jesus. However, one of the reasons this Sunday was changed to the Sunday of the Passion was that many people were missing the Maundy Thursday and Good



Friday worship when the "rest of the story" was told in all its raw and disturbing detail. The cross was by-passed on the route to the resurrection.

Another lesson from this Sunday comes from Psalm 31. Jesus uses words from this Psalm when he proclaims from the cross, "Into your hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit" (Ps. 31:5).

Psalm 31:9-10, goes on with verses that some who are experiencing the ravages of covid-19 may understand only too well.

We approach this Sunday from a different vantage point this year. Palms will be handed out (with gloved hands and facemasks) to those in the safety of vehicles passing through the church parking lot. How odd, and yet it may be a reminder that we gather to be sent again on a mission to proclaim Christ to the world in need of the Savior. Save those palms for burning to be used next Ash Wednesday. We still shout "Hosanna, blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord".

Prayer: Compassionate God, thank you for small gifts we can celebrate each day; the kindness of strangers, the compassion of healthcare workers, the friends who call. May we be that gift to others. Amen
