

# THE HUMAN CONDITION

**Bible Text:** Genesis 3–4

**Lesson Focus:** We rebel against God when we sin, but God consistently comes to us with mercy and forgiveness.

**Big Question:** Am I a bad person when I make poor choices or break a rule (even if I think it's not a good rule)?

**Key Words:** SIN, JUDGMENT, SEPARATION, MERCY

## BIBLE CONNECTION

- ] The man and the woman are given names: Adam and Eve (Genesis 3:20; 4:25).
- ] Though not mentioned by name, sin enters into creation in Genesis 3 and 4.
- ] Sin is anything that causes a breakdown in a relationship.
- ] Adam and Eve eat the forbidden fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil (Genesis 2:17; 3:6).
- ] God kicks Adam and Eve out of the garden, but God does not abandon them (Genesis 3:23).
- ] The story of Cain and Abel shows that even family members can be violent and hurtful to one another (Genesis 4:1-16).
- ] God lets us make choices, but those choices have consequences.
- ] We are all sinful beings, and nothing can change that.
- ] We have a God who loves us and forgives us despite our sinful condition.

- ] Why are Adam and Eve worried about what they're wearing?
- ] What choices are you making? What are potential consequences of those choices?
- ] What changed when Adam and Eve failed to respect the limits God gave them?
