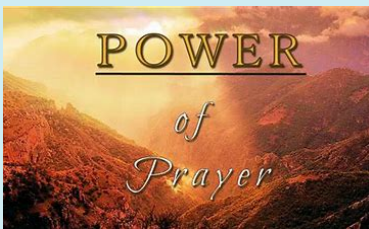

Love thy Neighbors...An update.

As many of you know Megan and Adam Passo (Tom and Sue Seegert's daughter and son-in-law) had some major health issues. Adam was diagnosed with a malignant brain tumor in early January and underwent surgery in mid-January. In January Megan had surgery to repair her knee from an injury she sustained in November. A calendar was set up to help provide rides to appointments (neither could drive), meals, dog walking, etc. The response from church members, friends, and neighbors has been amazing. They are humbled and so grateful for the support that has been so graciously given.

Here is the latest update.

Adam was to begin radiation about three weeks ago. Unfortunately, he developed an infection in his surgical site and radiation was delayed. The good news this week is the infection is subsided and he is clear to start radiation.

He is slowly getting back to work. He continues to have left side weakness and is adjusting. He will receive about 6 weeks of radiation and then chemotherapy will begin.

Megan is healing beautifully and as of this week, she no longer needs to wear her leg immobilizer. This is great news as she can now drive. She continues to have therapy a few times a week and can work from home.

There may be some future needs including transportation which will be posted on their give in-kind calendar.

ATTENTION COLLEGE-BOUND CTK STUDENTS:

Juanita and Al Newman Scholarships are available to students choosing church-related colleges while being a member of Christ The King. Since its inception in 1988, over 60 recipients have been granted over \$110,000 in scholarships during their first four years of college.

CTK LIBRARY – GRAND REOPENING – APRIL 3

After many hours of work since mid-January, the CTK Library will again be open starting Sun. Apr. 3. There are over 150 new books and DVDs

on the shelves. You can refer to what's available by using the Card Catalog Notebook which is on the table. Arranged by title in alphabetical order, it lists the call number where you can find the item you're looking for. Simply fill out the borrower's card in the inside back cover, place it in the box on the computer desk, and the book or DVD is yours for as long as you want it. We operate by the grace system; though there is a 'date due' pocket in the back of the book, just bring it back in a timely manner. Since shelf space is limited, in order to make room for the new materials, a lot of old materials which were duplicates or outdated had to be removed. You've seen these in the upper sanctuary. What's left will be taken to Milwaukee for the Great Hunger Book Sale, the largest used book sale in the city. All proceeds are given to churches and agencies which provide meal sites and food distribution. In 2019 \$19,000 was raised, so our discards will go to a good cause. How You Can Support Humanitarian Relief Efforts in Ukraine and Eastern Europe

Since last week, the news of the Russian invasion of Ukraine has filled news reports and social media feeds. Heartbreaking images of people saying goodbye to loved ones and lining up at the borders to leave the country are occupying our screens. Prayers and calls for peace are coming from around the world as we watch this crisis unfold.

Christ the King would like to offer an opportunity for prayer specifically for the Ukrainian people. Monday mornings from 11:00-11:30 our sanctuary will be open for those who wish to come and quietly pray. You may come for 5 minutes or the full time. A member of the Outreach Committee will be present. This will be a quiet informal time for individual prayer. An individual prayer guideline will be provided if you wish to use it. If you are unable to attend, please pray for those in Ukraine, Russia, and neighboring countries that have been affected by the crisis in Ukraine when and wherever you feel the call. May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need.

Here are some other ways you can support Humanitarian relief efforts spearheaded by Lutheran organizations in Ukraine and Eastern Europe:

The crisis in Eastern Europe is a big concern to everyone around the world. Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits. You can read more about the Eastern Europe Crisis Response at ELCA.org.
