Bring a snack to share if you can. This is an EPIC event where every person in Christ is invited and welcome. Open your eyes to new possibilities at CTK!



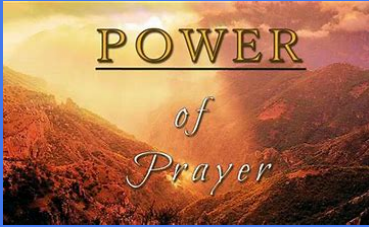

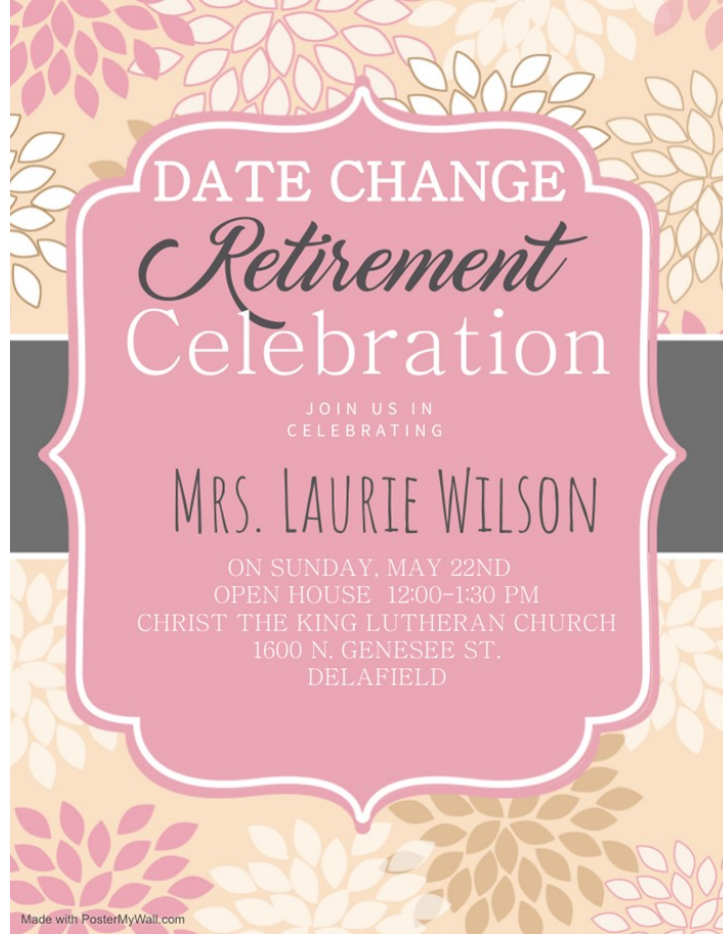

Pastrix: The Cranky, Beautiful Faith of a Sinner & Saint. This is a great book by Pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber. This book is available in the CTK Library. This book is about Nadia, who was into drugs and alcohol for years and received the Calling to be a Lutheran Pastor. I read this book several years ago and loved it. The book is fantastic. Heavily tattooed and loud-mouthed, Nadia, a former stand-up comic, sure didn't consider herself to be religious leader material—until the day she ended up leading a friend's funeral in a smoky downtown comedy club. Surrounded by fellow alcoholics, depressives, and cynics, she realized: These were her people. Maybe she was meant to be their pastor. And that she did. She serves as the founding Pastor of House for All Sinners and Saints, a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in Denver, Colorado.


CTK Dementia Friendly Training May 12th & 19th

CTK's Core Values include recognizing the infinite worth of each person and creating harmony through the differences we make and the smiles we create. One way for us to demonstrate our commitment toward living out our values is to learn how people feel when experiencing the onset of dementia. Education on this topic is crucial for everyone with aging family and friends. Helping our members to recognize and assist others experiencing dementia is part of being a Dementia Friendly Church.

Jennifer Harders, a dementia expert for Waukesha County Health Department, will be at CTK for a 2-part training opportunity. The first discussion forum will be on Thursday, May 12th from 4-5PM. During our time together Jennifer will share general information, signs & symptoms as well as some suggestions for helping those experiencing dementia. There will be time for questions. A simple snack bar will be provided.

The following **Thursday, May 19th**, Jennifer and some of her associates will be at CTK to provide more hands-on information and personal experience for part two of the training! **Register for your personal 30-minute time slot early.** We will schedule guests every 15 minutes so that the rotation through several stations can work smoothly. Ukraine and Eastern Europe

How You Can Support Humanitarian Relief Efforts in Ukraine and Eastern Europe

Christ the King would like to offer an opportunity for prayer specifically for the Ukrainian people. Monday mornings from 11:00-11:30 our sanctuary will be open for those who wish to come and quietly pray. You may come for 5 minutes or the full time. A member of the Outreach Committee will be present. This will be a quiet informal time for individual prayer. An individual prayer guideline will be provided if you wish to use it. If you are unable to attend, please pray for those in Ukraine, Russia, and neighboring countries that have been affected by the crisis in Ukraine when and wherever you feel the call. May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need.

Here are some other ways you can support Humanitarian relief efforts spearheaded by Lutheran organizations in Ukraine and Eastern Europe:

The crisis in Eastern Europe is a big concern to everyone around the world. Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland, and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water, and hygiene kits. You can read more about the Eastern Europe Crisis Response at ELCA.org.
