Family Promise

As of May 31, 2022 Family Promise of Waukesha County has served 48 households in both shelter and through the Family Homelessness Prevention Program. These households consist of 68 adults and 93 children. Currently all four apartment units leased by Family Promise are full and we have received an additional 30 calls for shelter in May and an additional 20 applications for prevention assistance.
