

Letting go Sep 22, 2022

A popular meme on social media about fall says that the trees are about to show us how lovely it is to let things go. I am not particularly good at letting things go.

Jesus invites his follower to give up their lives (Matthew 16:25) – an extreme version of letting go. It's not something most of us aspire to in the literal sense. But there's a way in which following Christ is always about giving up our lives, in order to orient them toward the One who loves and holds us. The Greek word for "life" in Matthew 16:25 is "psuche" (pronounced soo-khay) or self – meaning our whole self. What does it look like to let God into our whole



lives? Can we invite God into our fear or hurt or shame? How might it feel to allow ourselves to be completely embraced by God's grace? Might letting go look different when we remember that we're already held?



The CTK Rain Garden is in full bloom and working hard to cleanse the air of Co2 pollutants and remove the storm water runoff of contaminates. More than ever it is so important for the recently designated "endangered Monarch butterfly " and all other pollinators.

The migratory monarch butterfly (Danaus plexippus) was recently added to the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species[™] as Endangered. Habitat destruction and fragmentation, increased use of pesticides, and a changing climate have been key contributors to the monarch population decline.

The good news? You can help; and it's easy! Just plant some native milkweed and companion nectar plants outside your home (and encourage others in your community to do the same). You'll be helping monarchs as well as other important wildlife species like bees and birds. And wildlife presence can double in just one season!


