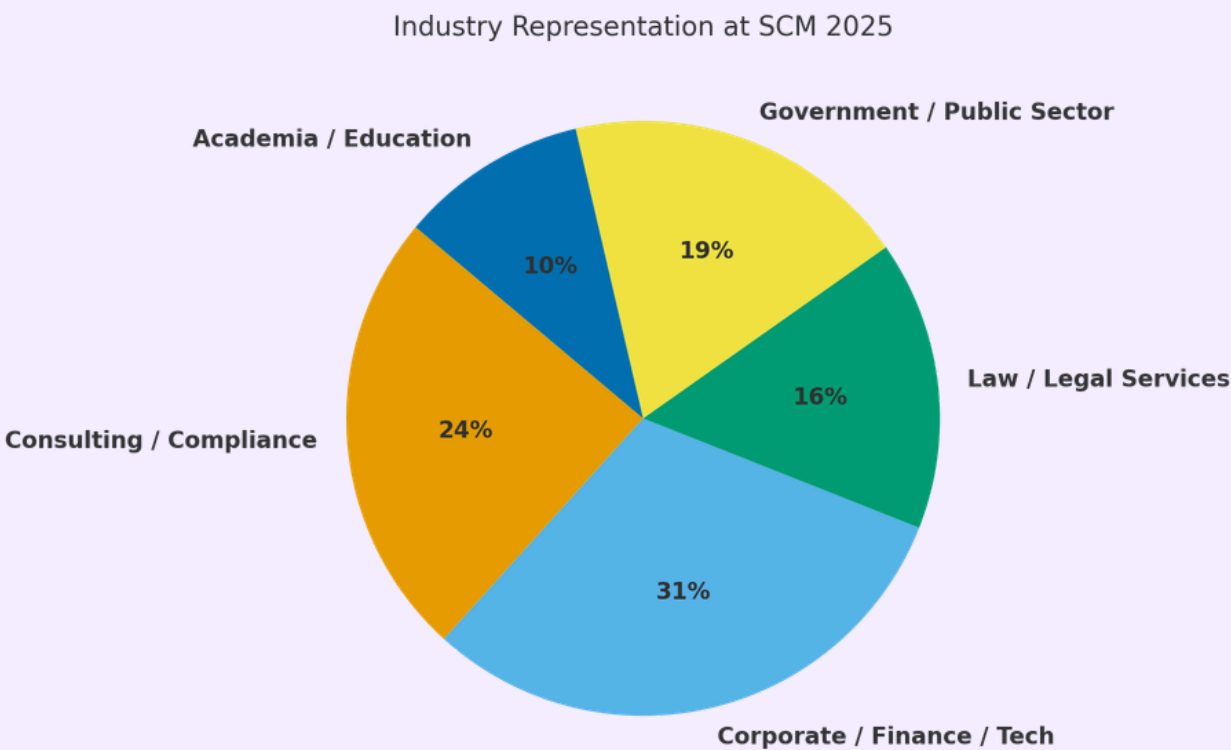

In particular the he growth of Russia’s shadow fleet, Iranian shipping networks, and Venezuela’s role in this has significantly impacted sanctions work. 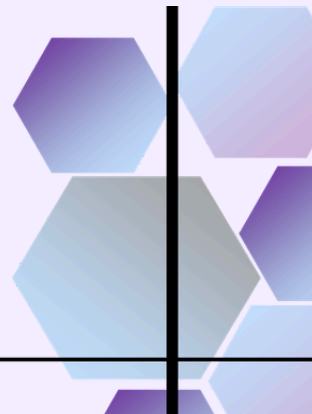
