Location of the Conference

The conference will be held at the Panorama Suite on the 8th Floor of etc.venues, located in the heart of Manchester City Centre on Piccadilly Gardens. The conference will be held in the private conference wing of etc venues.

Address: Panorama Suite, 8th Floor, etc.venues, 11 Portland Street, Manchester M1 3HU.


Within the building, the Panorama Suite which we will be using is located on the 8th floor. When you walk into the building from Minshull street there are lifts that will take you directly to the Panorama Suite. If you state which conference you are attending you will directed to the correct floor. Once on the 8th floor, take a right and another right and you will be in the Panorama suite. The venue will be signposted throughout.

There will be a coffee and refreshments available throughout the conference, and a continental breakfast at the start of each day, at the mid-morning and mid-afternoon coffee breaks there will be snacks and each day there will be a hot buffet lunch with 3 options meat, fish or vegan, with a salad bar and a dessert and cheese board.

There will be a demonstration room for Kharon's Clearview in the Panorama Lounge where refreshments will be served and this will be available during the breaks.

There is an manned cloakroom that can be used for coats and bags, and male/female and disabled toilets are located opposite the lifts.

Getting to and around Manchester and the venue

Manchester Airport

Manchester airport has excellent transport links and is a major hub in the UK. The airport has direct flights around the world from the US, the UAE, Qatar, Germany, France, the Netherlands, China, Canada, Egypt, Turkey, Singapore and many more places.

In addition, should there not be convenient flights into Manchester then both **Liverpool and Leeds** airports are only an hours train away, and both have excellent links across Europe. Whilst flying into London you can either get a connecting domestic flight to Manchester, or get the train from London Euston.

Arriving in Manchester

Manchester airport has a number of public transport links to Manchester City Centre including the tram and train, and you can get a minicab with Street Cars, who have the Manchester Airport contract, or pre-book with other local car transport firms.

Train

The train runs from Manchester Airport to Manchester Piccadilly Station in the centre of Manchester, via Northern Railway, TransPennine Express or Transport for Wales. When arriving at Piccadilly train station, there are a number of options for getting to hotels and the venue including walking, tram, bus or a taxi.

The cost of a train ticket is between £3.00-10.00 from/to Manchester Airport and Manchester Piccadilly train station takes approx. 20 minutes transfer time.

Tram

In order to get the Tram from the airport to Manchester City Centre you will need to take the blue tram line. This stops at several places in the City Centre including, Victoria Station and St. Peter's Square, which is located near many of the hotels. To get to the venue you will need to change at St. Peter's Square for a tram on the Light Blue destined for Ashton-under-Lyme, Etihad Campus or Piccadilly.

The cost of the tram £4.60 from/to Manchester Airport on Tram Network – approx. 52 minutes transfer time to St. Peter's Square.

Taxi

It is possible to get a taxi from Manchester Airport to the city. This takes approximately 30 minutes at a cost of around £30/40. At each terminal at the airport arrivals there is a taxi company Streetcars, if you give them your destination, they can sort a taxi for you. There is usually around a 10-minute wait depending on arrival time.



Additionally, you can prebook with other car carriers, or use Uber, but you will have to wait as they are not allowed to park-up at the airport waiting for fares.

Transport around Manchester


Manchester in general is a very walkable city. It is also very well connected with public transport with both an extensive tram network and a free city centre bus network. There are also taxi's available including booking through the 'FreeNow' App, Uber or Bolt.

Tram

The Manchester Metro Tram runs across the city and connects all of the train stations and Manchester Airport with the city centre.

The venue is located close to **Piccadilly Gardens** tram stop. This tram stop is serviced by the following Manchester Tram lines:

When arriving at Piccadilly Gardens the venue is 1-2 minutes walk away. The conference venue is across the road on Portland Street. The building can be accessed via private entrance with the door on Minshull Street.



St Peters Square tram stop, the venue is approximately a 9 minute walk.

To use the tram you need to touch in, touch out. When you start a journey, touch in using one of the yellow smart readers. Then when you get where you're going, touch out. (If you change trams between, there's no need to touch in or out at that tram stop). Make sure you use: the same card or device for all your trips to benefit from daily or weekly caps a different card for each adult.

It is vital that you travel with a ticket (such as tapping in) on the tram network as there are often monitors at the platforms.


There is a daily spend limit of £9.50.

London to Manchester transport links

Train

There are regular trains approx. every 30 mins from **London Euston to Manchester Piccadilly** and return - every day, running from very early morning to late evening.

The train takes approximately 2h 15 mins – 3h 30 mins depending on the time of day.

Plane

There are also flights from London Heathrow to Manchester. British Airways runs around 8 flights a day. The flights take around 1 hour.

Things to do

Manchester is a wonderful and vibrant city with an abundance of culture and activities to exhibit. Whilst you are in Manchester why not go to one of our many museums, or a show/play at one of our city centre theatres.

With all of the theatres we encourage you to go on their websites and book tickets in advance of coming as there are few if any options for buying tickets on the day.

Northern Quarter - Bars and Vintage Stores

Wander around Manchester's Northern Quarter. This area of the city is full of bustling bars and vintage clothing stores. It was recently used as a live catwalk for a Chanel fashion show celebrating the world-famous music and textile history of this city.

Chinatown Archway - Landmark

The Chinatown archway is one of the most iconic landmarks in Manchester, it helps to define the Chinese community and give the people an identity. The materials used were mostly imported from China, the twelve craftsmen and builders came from the Beijing Landscape and Classical Architecture Company. The archway was completed in 1987 and was the largest in the UK until the completion of the Imperial archway in Liverpool in 2000.




