Dear Parents,

May the peace and joy of the Lord be with you and your families! Wednesday, March 5<sup>th</sup> marks the beginning of the Lenten season, a time for the grace of our Spiritual Renewal; to put aside those things that keep us away from God. Lent invites us to open our hearts and minds to the Word of God, and to His abundant Grace. It is important that we go to the Church on Sundays as a family to worship, adore, thank God and listen to His Message.

This year for Lent, we remind you that our School is participating in CRS Rice Bowl, a faith-in-action program that invites us to reflect on the challenges of global hunger and our responsibility to respond to the needs of our global human family. Through our Lenten prayers, fasting and almsgiving, we can respond to the call to ensure that all our brothers and sisters are fed good, nutritious food that give them what they need to fulfill their God-given potential.

#### WHAT IS CRS RICE BOWL?

We will collect your CRS Rice Bowls at the end of the Lent. This is an excellent opportunity to teach our children the value of sharing and caring for our brothers and sisters most in need as well as to make progress in their self-development. Every time they do a good listening, kind deeds to the sibling, give respect to others, being patient, and showing good manners...please, encourage them by giving some money to put in the Rice Bowl.

### **CONSECRATION TO SAINT JOSEPH**

The month of March brings the celebration of two great Saints of the Church: Saint Patrick, Patron of the Archdiocese of New York on March 17<sup>th</sup>, and Saint Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup>.
