LAKE CAPACITY STUDY OF BIG SHELL LAKE

The Lake Capacity Study of Big Shell Lake is nearing completion. The next step is to conduct the boat traffic study, an important step in the process that is done in two steps. Step one is to fly a drone around the lakeshore first thing in the morning to count all watercraft on lifts, tied to docks and on the shore. The next step is to count all vessels actually on the water midafternoon of July long weekend. This part of the study is key and provides a true idea of lake usage.

WASTE DISPOSAL GUIDELINES

Below is a review of how to dispose of varying materials.

Yard Waste Site - accepted and prohibited materials shown and outlined below. The Yard Waste Site only accepts trees, branches, leaves, weeds and reeds. We can no longer dispose of construction lumber, or any wood that is treated or painted, plywood or particle board, as well as plastics, metals etc. in the yard waste site. Please refer to the flier or the entrance sign at the Yard Waste Site.

Clean Dirt Site - accepted and prohibited materials outlined in the attached flier. The Clean Dirt Site only accepts sand, dirt and clay. Metal, concrete, and bricks need to be removed from the Resort Village of Echo Bay as we do not have any area to dispose of them.

If you witness anyone dumping the wrong material at either site, please make one of the councilors aware of the issue. People disposing of material in the wrong place could cost the village unnecessary time and money.

With the orange recycle bins, DO NOT fill the bin with large boxes from purchases brought to the lake. Take those large boxes back to the city recycle sites! The recycle bin needs to be used for regular household recycled items. Follow the flier and the decals to be sure what is acceptable and what is not. The flier has been included in this email.


During the majority of the year, any item that needs to be disposed of and is not household garbage or regular household recycle needs to be removed from the Resort Village of Echo Bay.

A large waste bin will be placed at the Quonset in early May. Residents will be given the opportunity to deal with items that are **NOT** household garbage, recycling material or large appliances. Large appliances cannot be disposed of anywhere at the lake and need to be taken to approved facilities designed to handle appliances. The small bins beside the large bin should never be used for garbage of any kind. Every time somebody puts any garbage in the small bins it costs the residents of the Resort Village \$120!

Please remember that for any construction project, we have loaner waste bins that can be set at your site. They can be used for many projects around the cottage from simple cleanup to larger renovations. Cost to you is only \$120/bin tip. Please contact us to arrange delivery of a bin to your location.

PUBLIC STORAGE

This is the year that everybody must renew their contract on the Public Storage Lot. The fee for renewal is \$160 for four years. Please put the new tags you will be provided with on your stored items. You will be supplied with two tags to store two units equivalent to the size of a boat trailer each. Untagged units will be removed from the area. New keys and tags will be available at the Annual Informational Meeting in May. If you need a new key and tags to secure a spot in public storage contact Sophie Uzelman. The lock will be changed on May long weekend.

We appreciate people using public storage as it eliminates trailers, fish shacks etc. from being stored in the bushes around the village. You only must drive through lake areas that do not have public storage areas to appreciate the way these storage programs keep our cottage/lake areas looking more organized and less junky! Thank you to everyone who parked their units along the perimeter of the public storage area leaving room in the middle for backing units up and moving within the public storage area.

*Please Park your unit along the perimeter of the fence and leave the center open.

PERMITS

- New builds, additions, new decks, and permanent sheds all need a permit. If you are demolishing or moving a building you need a permit as well. Both permits are available online at http://rvechobay.com or contact our administrator. There is now also a guide to the building process on the website.
- 2. For work along the water's edge you need to get a permit from the Saskatchewan Water Security Agency. Their web site is www.wsask.ca.

TAX ASSESSMENT

Included in this Newsletter you will find the 2023 Resort Village Budget. Based on our proposed budget the 2023 Echo Bay municipal flat tax will increase by \$50 to a total of \$850. Storage lots will increase by \$15 to \$125 per storage lot.

QUONSET/WASHROOM/KITCHEN

Having a family celebration at the lake and need more room? Our Quonset is available for use on a first come basis. There are 10 tables and 60 folding chairs and the addition of L.E.D. light fixtures has brightened up the area. The kitchen has a fridge, microwave and sink with hot water. Council has formalized the procedure for residents to utilize the Quonset

for private functions. On the Village website you will be able to find a form to fill out and submit to Tara. She will then inform the Summer Workers so that preparations can be made. We have also implemented a \$100 fee to help recoup the costs of preparation and of electricity and sewage use. These fees will also be used to repair and maintain the Quonset.

local landowners and reduce your speeds by their houses and livestock. Some of them are the ones who give us permission have to snowmobile trail and we would not want to lose that option. We have had some concerns of people riding where they should not in the summer. Just because we have a snowmobile trail in the winter does not permit folks to ride in the same corridor or cross the same land after the trails are closed.
