## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Our Mahamaya Degree College is established in the year 2003 by the initiative of local residents of RajaparaPt-I, Bagribari. The college is situated just 1 km away from the Holy Maa Mahamaya Temple of Bagribari, Kokrajhar. Surrounded by the beautiful saal trees of Parbatjhora, covering about 18 bighas of land, the college has been serving as the main center of learning for the deprived students of remote Parbatjhora region since the many years.

Our college has been granted permission and concurrence for establishment by the State and BTC Government. The college is affiliated to Bodoland University of Kokrajhar. We have been given permission by the university to open various Major and General Courses in various disciplines. Students in huge number, especially belonging to poor family background from various caste and community are being admitted to our college every year. We are also proud to inform that, a good number of passed out students from our college has also been able to get a quick placement in various central/state government sector jobs.

At present we have three Assam Type RCC building, a library, girls' common room, a kitchen, separate toilet for boys and girls and staffs and a spacious playground. The college is situated at the outskirts of the noisy town area- that meets the requirement of a conducive learning environment.

Our college library is also extremely utilized. At present there are approximately around 10000nos books of in our College Library. Books consist of both text book and reference books.

At present we have twenty eight teaching staffs and fourteen non-teaching staffs. Some of the Assistant Professors have already cleared the NET, SLET and Researchers Degree, while others are still pursuing P HD at various universities and appearing the NET and SLET exams regularly.

## ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Students seeking admission into Four Year Under Graduate Programme must apply Online through SAMARTH PORTAL ([assamadmission.samarth.ac.in](http://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in)) a common admission portal launch by Department of Assam Higher education. The applicant needs to register and log into the portal and follow the steps.



The admission committee will verify the application form and documents and prepare a list of selected candidates on merit basis by following reservation reservation guidelines.

- ❖ Students can submit application form for admission for the academic session 2024-25 in Mahamaya Degree College in both online & offline mode.
- ❖ Students who want to get admission into Mahamaya Degree College will have to apply online through SAMARTH Portal by selecting Mahamaya Degree College under Bodoland University. During admission day the students will have to produce their requisite documents in original for verification and submit the Photostat copies of their documents along with SAMARTH Registration Page has to the college office.
- ❖ The office Admission help desk will help those students seeking for offline admission to register in SAMARTH Portal. During admission day the students will have to produce their documents in original for verification and submit the hard copies of their documents.
- ❖ The College will shortlist the selected students on merit basis and upload in the College website as well as will be pasted on the College Notice Board.
- ❖ The applicant must submit scanned copies of necessary documents (admit card, pass certificate, mark sheet, caste certificate, passport size photograph, bank account, aadhaar card, gap certificate etc). The gap certificate has to be issued by the head of the institution last attended.
- ❖ Admission to the College will be strictly on merit basis and subject to the approval of the Admission Committee, Mahamaya Degree College.
- ❖ The submission of application with above Percentage (45%) does not mean admission is confirmed in respective course. Admission procedure will be strictly on merit basis according to seat capacity of the College.
- ❖ New Students must have passed Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in Arts, Science & Commerce under Assam Higher Secondary Council (AHSEC) or any other equivalent examination.
- ❖ No claim of applicant for admission will be admissible after filling up of mentioned seats.

- ❖ There is reservation of seats as per Govt. norms for ST, SC, OBC, MOBC and differently abled NCC, Bharat Scouts and the candidates excelling in extra Co-curricular activities. Candidate will have to mention in the admission form the category of reservation and must submit valid documents.
- ❖ The valid documents with the signature of competent authority only will be considered for the above mentioned reservation seats.
- ❖ Any invalid or wrong information regarding marks and certificate will be punishable according to law.

### **RESERVATION OF SEATS:**

There is provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to SC, ST(P), ST(H), OBC, MOBC, physically handicapped categories as per Govt. rules. A few seats may be allotted to the students having outstanding performance in the field of sports, culture, NCC/NSS (minimum state level).

### **IDENTITY CARD:**

Students must carry the Identity Cards issued by the College authority and should be able to produce the same whenever so required. The College Identity Card once issued is valid for one academic session only. If the Identity Card is lost, a fresh Identity Card will be issued on payment of Rs. 50/- only.
