

Set Up Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) For Dealers, Suppliers and Other External Partners

What is Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)?

MFA is an enhanced level of security to ensure sensitive information can only be accessed by authorized individuals.

How does MFA work?

When MFA is enabled, users are prompted during the sign-in process for an additional form of identification, such as a code on their cellphone.

Using a second factor to verify identity prevents anyone but authorized users from signing into applications, even if passwords are compromised.

With this method, Microsoft will send you a text via SMS to verify your identity.

[Set Up Authenticator App for MFA](#)

This method uses the Microsoft Authenticator App on your smartphone. Microsoft sends a code to the app to verify your identity.

[Set Up Browser Authenticator for MFA](#)

This method uses the Authenticator extension for Edge, Chrome, or Firefox. Microsoft sends a code to the extension to verify your identity.

[Set Up YubiKey \(Authenticator App\) for MFA](#)

This method uses a YubiKey together with the Yubico Authenticator App. When you sign in, Microsoft sends a code to the app to verify your identity.
