

Jesus was in Galilee in the North and intended to go to Jerusalem in the South and he The house of Lazarus was composed of Lazarus and his two sisters, Martha and Mary.

took the road of Jericho which was 10 miles, North of the Dead Sea at 1,000 feet below sea level. In Jericho, Jesus cured the blind man Bartimaeus and was at the table of the Publican Zacchaeus. Climbing from there to Jerusalem which was 25 miles from the Dead Sea and 3,250 feet above it, Jesus went walking to Jerusalem. The travel was hard and sloppy with at least six hours of walking. In order to take some rest, Jesus stopped for a while in Bethany in the house of an old friend, Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. St. Luke, reporting the fact, doesn't mention the name of the village probably to save the family of Lazarus from the retaliation of the Jews because he was writing before 70 A.D. St. John writing a long time after, gives all the details; John 12:1. Martha, because she was probably the oldest of the two sisters and because of her strong character, was behaving as the house lady, having the control of all the household things and was busy with all the hospitality business. Mary was probably the spoiled little sister of the family. Her story is a little complicated. Some historians think that because of a scandal she left Bethany and established herself far away in Galilee, in a city called Magdala, from which came her nickname of Mary Magdalene. There she met Jesus who transformed her life in a Loving Penitent and she became one in the group of women, who was following Jesus and working and helping the Apostles.

Martha and Mary have two different temperaments. Martha was naturally a dynamo of activity and Mary was the opposite, a very quiet person. While Martha was very busy with the household affairs, Mary was sitting at the feet of Jesus and kept listing to his words. It would have not been difficult for Martha to do the job alone but probably in order to attract the attention of Jesus to what she was doing for him, she complained to him about the laziness of Mary. The answer of Jesus was not a reprimand to Martha it was instead an appeal toward the great principle: God must be served first. Jesus, in praising the attitude of Mary didn't disapprove the conduct of Martha. He blamed Martha not for what she was doing, but especially for her great worries and her excessive care of earthly things.

Jesus praises prayer and contemplation but he does not deny the value of activity. Jesus is not praising quietism and he is not for activism. God did not make everyone alike. One person may pray while working and another may sit with folded hands to think and pray. Both are serving God. God needs his Marys and his Marthas too. The hermit is supposed to work and the worker is supposed to pray. Usually hermits have a little piece of land to cultivate and he will work regularly every day to make it fruitful. He is proud of his work and he is allowed to welcome the visitors by offering to them what he had in his land, but he is not allowed to use the fruit of his hands for himself. This piece of land is to force him to make some exercise, to keep his body in good shape and to prepare him for a greater union with God in prayer and contemplation. Here is one of the great difficulties in life. The great achievement is to know how to harmonize between prayer and work, work and prayer.
