

# CONSECRATION OF THE HUMAN RACE TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Most sweet Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us, humbly prostrate before Thine altar.

We are Thine and Thine we wish to be; but to be more surely united with Thee, behold each one of us freely consecrates himself today to Thy Most Sacred Heart.

Many, indeed, have never known Thee; many, too, despising Thy precepts, have rejected Thee.

Have mercy on them all, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to Thy Sacred Heart.

Be Thou King, O Lord, not only of the faithful who have never forsaken Thee, but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned Thee, grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house, lest they die of wretchedness and hunger.

Be Thou King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof and call them back to the harbour of truth and unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one shepherd.

Be Thou King of all those who even now sit in the shadow of idolatry or Islam, and refuse not Thou to bring them into the light of Thy kingdom. Look, finally, with eyes of pity upon the children of that race, which was for so long a time Thy chosen people; and let Thy Blood, which was once invoked upon them in vengeance, now descend upon them also in a cleansing flood of redemption and eternal life.

Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church, assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the Divine Heart that wrought our salvation: to it be glory and honour forever.

Reflections on Luke 10:21-24: The Praise of the Father

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel reading, we are invited to witness a profound moment of joy and revelation in the life of Jesus. In Luke 10:21-24, we see Jesus rejoicing in the Holy Spirit and offering praise to the Father, the Lord of heaven and earth. This passage provides a rich tapestry of theological insights and spiritual encouragement that are particularly relevant to our faith journey.

Jesus begins by thanking the Father for revealing divine truths to the "childlike" rather than the "wise and learned." This juxtaposition highlights a recurring theme in Jesus' teachings: the kingdom of God is accessible to those who approach with humility, openness, and a pure heart. It is a powerful reminder that intellectual prowess or worldly wisdom alone do not grant us access to the deeper mysteries of God's love and grace. Instead, it is through a childlike trust and faith that we come to truly know Him.

This passage also underscores the intimate relationship between the Father and the Son. Jesus acknowledges that all things have been handed over to Him by the Father and that mutual knowledge exists exclusively within this divine relationship. This unique bond between the Father and the Son is the cornerstone of our understanding of the Holy Trinity. It is through Jesus that we come to know the Father, and it is through the Father's will that we receive the revelation of His love and salvation.

As Jesus turns to His disciples, He bestows a special blessing upon them: "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see." This statement is both a recognition of the disciples' privileged position and a reminder of the fulfillment of long-awaited prophecies. For centuries, prophets and kings yearned to witness the coming of the Messiah, to see the works of God unfold in their midst, and to hear the words of eternal life. The disciples, and by extension all believers, are blessed to live in the light of this revelation.

What does this mean for us today? First, we are called to embrace the childlike qualities of humility and openness in our spiritual lives. We must approach God with the same trust and simplicity that children exhibit, allowing His grace to work in our hearts without the barriers of pride or self-reliance.

Second, we are reminded of the profound privilege we have as followers of Christ. We have access to the fullness of God's revelation through Jesus, a gift that countless generations longed to receive. This should inspire in us a deep sense of gratitude and a commitment to live out our faith with joy and enthusiasm.

Finally, this passage invites us to deepen our relationship with God. Just as Jesus shares an intimate bond with the Father, we too are invited into a close, personal relationship with our Creator. Through prayer, reflection, and the sacraments, we can grow in our understanding of God's will and experience the joy that comes from knowing Him more fully.

As we meditate on these words from the Gospel of Luke, let us ask the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with the same joy that Jesus felt. May we always seek to know and do the Father's will, and may we cherish the blessings we have received as His beloved children.
