

THE TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS September 14



When the sacred body of Jesus was taken down from the cross and carried to the grave of Joseph of Arimathea on Calvary, the cross on which Jesus died was thrown into a ditch or well, and covered over with stones and earth, so that the followers of Jesus might not find it. And to add more confusion in case the cross is discovered, they buried with it the two other crosses of the two thieves. Almost 300 years later, in 312 A.D. Constantine the Great, not yet a Christian, while battling with Maxentius for the throne of the Roman Empire, prayed in his despair to the God of his mother, Jesus, to aid him in his struggle.

In answer to his prayer a luminous cross appeared in Heaven bearing this inscription: "In this sign you will conquer". In gratitude for his victory over Maxentius at Milvian Bridge, on October 28 312 A.D., Constantine had the Sign of the Cross placed on the Roman banner and on the shields of the soldiers. He was baptized with a great number of his soldiers and it was the end of the persecutions against the Christians.

Then came the finding of the true cross at Jerusalem by St. Helena the mother of Constantine the Great. This holy lady in fulfillment of a vow, came to Jerusalem to build a magnificent Church, the Church of the Resurrection or the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, on the place of Calvary. During the excavations they found in a ditch the three crosses. To distinguish the true cross, the Patriarch of Jerusalem Cyril had the good idea of bringing a dead person. They laid the body on the first and second cross, but nothing happened. When it touched the third cross the dead person was raised to life. It was the true cross of Jesus. When this occurred, it was followed by many healings.

The cross of Jesus has been placed inside the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. In the present time what is left from the cross is kept in Rome in the Church of the Holy Cross. When they discovered the Cross, the Patriarch of Jerusalem, Cyrille ordered a big ceremony in the city of Jerusalem and every house made a little fire on the top of the roof as a sign of rejoicing. Throughout the years people would make fire on the top of the mountains to commemorate the finding of the Cross and this became the Feast of the Cross on September 14.

In the year 614 A.D. Chosroes II, King of Persia, invaded Palestine. He sacked Jerusalem and took with him the great relic of the true Cross. Then the Christian Emperor Heraclius of Constantinople at the head of a large army invaded Persia and forced the Persians to sue for peace and to restore the sacred Cross, which Heraclius piously brought back to Jerusalem in 629 A.D.

When he reached the city gate of Jerusalem on the way to Calvary the Emperor laid aside every robe and mark of royalty and clothed in sackcloth of penance and barefoot carried the Cross up to Calvary and restored it to its place in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

Children of every city, town and village will go to the closest mountain and with a torch made of dry reed will make fire from the bushes covering the top of the mountains. This they will do every year on the vigil of the Feast of the Cross on September 14. They will return home only when the reed is used completely which will go past midnight. The Feast of the Cross was considered in the East one of the great feasts of the year and churches were open 24 hours a day, with people kneeling and praying at any time of day and night. At that time every parish used to have a nice number of Priests, some of them counted around 26 Priests and on that day the alters of church were busy for the whole time with Priests celebrating mass and people attending more than one as a special devotion.
