CONSECRATION OF THE HUMAN RACE TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Most sweet Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us, humbly prostrate before Thine altar.

We are Thine and Thine we wish to be; but to be more surely united with Thee, behold each one of us freely consecrates himself today to Thy Most Sacred Heart.

Many, indeed, have never known Thee; many, too, despising Thy precepts, have rejected Thee.

Have mercy on them all, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to Thy Sacred Heart.

Be Thou King, O Lord, not only of the faithful who have never forsaken Thee, but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned Thee, grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house, lest they die of wretchedness and hunger.

Be Thou King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof and call them back to the harbour of truth and unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one shepherd.

Be Thou King of all those who even now sit in the shadow of idolatry or Islam, and refuse not Thou to bring them into the light of Thy kingdom. Look, finally, with eyes of pity upon the children of that race, which was for so long a time Thy chosen people; and let Thy Blood, which was once invoked upon them in vengeance, now descend upon them also in a cleansing flood of redemption and eternal life.

Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church, assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the Divine Heart that wrought our salvation: to it be glory and honour forever.

Amen.

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Saint Peter

Saint Peter was a fisherman from Bethsaida in Galilee. He was the son of John and the brother of Andrew. He was probably a disciple of John the Baptizer and partner in fishing with James and John, sons of Zebedee and Salome. His name was Simon, but Christ changed it to Peter which means "rock". He was married, living with his mother-in-law in Capernaum. Tradition says that he has a daughter named Petronilla.

The Gospels speak about Peter more than any other apostle. He was honored on many occasions. Christ stayed at his home, preached from his boat. He was with Jesus at the transfiguration, at the raising from death of the daughter of Jairus, at the agony of Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane. There he struck the high Priests' servant Mallkus and cut off his ear. But he denied Jesus three times at the court of Caiaphas.

But after the resurrection, Jesus appeared to him personally. He appeared also to him and six other disciples on the seashore of the Lake of Tiberius. He conferred the Primacy on him, and he became the Vicar of Christ and the head of the Apostles and the first Pope. After the Pentecost he delivered the first public sermon and cured and converted 3000 people, cured a man lame from birth and as Acts of the Apostles say "Act.5:15", the shadow of Peter used to cure the sick people put on his way in the streets of Jerusalem. Peter received the first gentiles, Cornellius and his family. He presided at the Apostolic Council in Jerusalem in the year 50. Then, he went to Antioch and became the first Bishop of that city. Peter was miraculously rescued from the prison of Herod at Grippe.

Peter dwelt in Rome intermittently for 25 years, as founder and first Bishop of Rome. Finally in the last year of Nero's reign, he was crucified with his head downward at his own request.

The two Epistles of the New Testament are attributed "The Gospel of Peter".

Saint Paul

Saint Paul was born at Tarsus, Cilicia, at the beginning of the Christian era. He was of Jewish parents and was a Roman citizen from birth. As a young man he was at the stoning of Saint Stephen. In order to complete his schooling, Saint Paul was sent to Jerusalem, where he sat at the feet of the learned Rabi Gamaliel and was educated in the strict observance of the law. Soon his zeal and emotional character developed into a religious fanaticism against the Christians. Entrusted with a formal mission from the high Priest, he departed for Damascus to arrest the Christians there and bring them bound to Jerusalem. As he was nearing Damascus about noon, a light from Heaven suddenly blazed around him. Jesus, with his glorified body, appeared to him. An immediate transformation was made in his soul. He was suddenly converted to the Christian faith. He lost his sight. But Ananias brought back his vision and baptized him, and he became an Apostle.

Saint Paul remained some days in Damascus, then he went to Arabia for two years, then he returned to Damascus to preach. But this time because of the hatred of the Jews he was forced to flee from the city, lowered down in a basket from the walls of the city. Later he went back to his native Tarsus. From there he joined Barnabas in Antioch. After one year, on the occasion of a famine, Paul and Barnabas carried alms to the community of Jerusalem.

After this, Paul and Barnabas made the first missionary journey visiting Cyprus and Asia Minor and established churches there. On their way to Jerusalem, they passed by Phoenicia, Tyr or Saida. Arriving in Jerusalem they attended the council of Jerusalem.

After that, Paul, accompanied by Silas, Timothy and Luke, made his second missionary journey to Asia Minor then, sailed to Europe: Philippi, Thessalonica, Athens, Corinth, then back to Ephesus and Antioch. At Troas, Paul restored to life, the young man Eutychus who fell from the third floor and was found dead.

On his third missionary journey, Paul visited the same previous regions. He remained three years in Ephesus, making from it the center of his mission. Then he started his passion: two years of imprisonment at Caesarea, very, disturbing trip to Rome with two soldiers. He was released after two years of imprisonment, then he was arrested again and was beheaded in the last year of Nero.

Saint Paul wrote 14 Canonical Epistles. They show him as a profound religious thinker. He had an enduring formative influence in the development of Christianity. The centuries have made more apparent his greatness of mind and spirit. He was a giant Apostle.

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
