

## THE HEALING OF THE BLIND MAN Mark 10:46-52

The miracle of the healing of Bartimaeus took place near Jericho, one of the most

ancient towns of the world, on the Jordan River, not far from the Dead Sea, close

to the mountain where Jesus fasted for 40 days. Jericho had special characteristics: it is about 15 miles northeast of Jerusalem. Because it is 1,200 feet below sea level, it was considered the winter residence of the high class of the Jews and for at least 20,000 Priests awaiting there for their turn of service in the Temple.

According to the customs of that time, the blind used to go two by two accompanied by a dog. That is why Luke and Matthew, who report the same story, mention two blind persons. Mark, who probably knew the blind man of Jericho personally, calls him by his name, Bartimaeus, which means in Aramaic "son of Timaeus".

It was close to the Passover, the last one for Jesus. The city and the streets of Jericho were full of people. Jesus was coming from the north, from the region of Galilee and intended to enter the city by the northern gate. Bartimaeus was standing there. He heard by the noise of the feet, that something special was happening. He asked "Who was passing?" He was told that it was Jesus. There and then he started to shout in order to attract Jesus' attention. The crowd pressing around Jesus, was disturbed by his cries and tried to silence him, but he only shouted louder, because no one was going to take from him his chance to escape from his darkness.

Then probably, he didn't wait for the p before them the call of Jesus.

Then, guided by his sense of smell to the scent of the Devine Perfume emanating from Jesus, he came running to Jesus. In his heart, in his mind as well as in his sense of hearing, he knew exactly where Jesus was, because when Jesus calls, he shows us how to approach him: "He is the way, the truth, and the light." The miracle of the curing of the physical blindness was preceded by the healing of the soul in order to see Jesus when he stands always before us and to hear him when he whispers to us.

This story is an illuminating story. There is the sheer persistence of Bartimaeus. Nothing will stop him to come to Jesus. His response to the call of Jesus was immediate and so eager that he cast off his cloak to run more quickly to Jesus.

Bartimaeus had faith. He was sure that Jesus would cure him, but chances happen only once and Bartimaeus came like a shot to Jesus. He won his chance.

In the end there is a precious touch in this story. Bartimaeus, may have been a beggar by the way side, but he was a man of gratitude. "Immediately as he received his sight, says the Gospel, he followed Jesus."

Let us examine ourselves. Bartimaeus was grateful, we most of the time, we are not. What room does Jesus occupy in our life? Are we not acting as scriptures say: "This nation honors me by its lips, while its heart is far from me?"

Oh my Jesus, strengthen my faith and help me to know that everything which is not for you makes no sense and at the end what remains is what is remaining for God.
