Wild Rivers Habitat for Humanity (WRHFH) brings people together to build strength, stability and self-reliance through shelter in Burnett, Polk, Rusk and Washburn Counties in Wisconsin.

An affiliate of Habitat for Humanity International, WRHFH builds and repairs homes using in-kind gifts, donations and volunteers to offer a hand up, not a hand out, to those in need of decent and affordable housing. Since forming in 1997, WRHFH has constructed 46 new homes and completed over 400 projects through our home repair and painting programs.
