

May is Older Americans Month, and we're proud to support aging adults through our Housing Plus program. With a Certified Aging-in-Place Specialist on staff and our partnership with the national Coalition for Home Repair, we're helping older adults stay safe and independent in their homes. From accessibility modifications to critical repairs, our work ensures that growing older doesn't have to mean leaving the place you call home.

We're excited to continue momentum from the Washburn County Community First Housing Summit by convening a follow-up discussion in May to move from talk to action. We're also thankful to the Burnett County Tourism Coalition and the many communities who welcomed us to share more about how Habitat supports housing access and talent retention through affordable homeownership and repairs. And finally, we're thrilled to announce a new partnership with Tiger Tech at the Webster School District for their upcoming home project—giving students real-world experience and helping build the future of our communities, one home at a time.

In April, we completed three critical home repair projects – one each in Polk, Bayfield, and Burnett Counties – thanks to excellent work and partnership from Superior Spray Foam, Royal Flush Plumbing, and Window World. Our new home build in Ladysmith is nearing completion, and we're grateful to everyone who has helped us get to this point. We also want to thank Super One Foods and Miners Inc., as well as the generous shoppers who rounded up their purchases – raising an incredible \$8,200 in just two weeks to support our work!

We're also welcoming the next generation of changemakers! Wild Rivers is offering internships this summer in construction, community outreach, Girls Build leaders, and ReStore. It's not too late to apply – interested students can reach out to us directly to learn more about how to get involved and gain hands-on experience while making a difference in our communities and earning college credit.

We're feeling the ripple effects of recent federal funding reductions, particularly to AmeriCorps and the NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) program. Wild Rivers was set to host a NCCC team in July to complete construction on a new home in Webster. These service members have been vital to our mission in the past – helping build homes, support repairs, and strengthen our rural communities. Without these hands-on volunteers, we now face longer timelines and higher costs for projects that serve veterans, older adults, and families in need. We're doing everything we can to advocate for the reinstatement of this critical support while finding new ways to engage local partners and volunteers.

As costs continue to rise, so does the need for safe, affordable housing – and we can't meet that need alone. Every day, our team fields calls from neighbors in crisis: families seeking rental assistance, older adults facing unsafe home conditions, and veterans in need of critical repairs. These are not strangers – they're the people we see at the grocery store, our kids' teachers, the seniors caring for their spouses, the veterans who served our country. They work hard, care deeply, and deserve a safe place to call home.

We're asking our communities to come together – through donations of time, dollars, and support – to help us continue this work. Whether you can swing a hammer, make a monthly gift, or share our mission with others, it all matters. As Desmond Tutu once said, "Do your little bit of good where you are; it's those little bits of good put together that overwhelm the world." Let's keep putting good back into our communities – together.
