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Districts and schools to deliver a uniform and equitable statewide assessment program.

Assessments to yield fair and accurate results through consistent and standardized administrations.



Testing materials secure and properly used for each student



Test Security – Laws & Regulations

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State Laws

S.C. Code Ann. § 59-1-445 (2004) addresses violations of mandatory test security regulations and procedures, penalties, and investigations.



Board Regulations

S.C. Code Ann. § 59-1-447 (2004) requires the State Board of Education to establish detailed mandatory test security procedures by regulation.

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Test Security – Consolidating Data

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Consolidation of materials required multiple meetings and planning sessions across the Office of Assessment

Finding All Information Needed

Collecting data from all programs, searching SCDE drives and folders, SCDE Test Vault, and consolidating the information into one location

Programs And Vendors

Each program and vendor has its own Test Administration Manual and other documents to assist with testing and test security.

Establishing Universal Procedures

Holding Test Security meetings with all program managers and administration directors to establish one set of procedures for all



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
