Court's Orders to Reschedule

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1 (Proceedings commence at 9:33 a.m.)

2 THE CLERK: Rosier versus Strobel.

3 I don't know if you've had a chance to review this.
4 There's no service and the Respondent is in jail.

5 THE COURT: What?

6 THE CLERK: The Respondent is in jail in Arizona,
7 according to that letter. And there's no service anyway, so.

8 Good morning, sir.

9 MR. STROBEL: Morning.

10 THE CLERK: Could you state your name for the record,
11 please?

12 MR. STROBEL: Jeffery Strobel.

13 THE CLERK: All right. And if you would raise your
14 right hand.

15 JEFFREY STROBEL, PETITIONER, SWORN

16 THE CLERK: All right. Thank you.

17 QUESTIONS BY THE COURT

18 THE COURT: Mr. Strobel, did you receive a copy of
19 the handwritten letter that the Respondent has sent?

20 THE WITNESS: Sent to me or --

21 THE COURT: Have you seen the body of this?

22 THE WITNESS: I'm not --

23 THE COURT: Have you received a copy of this letter?

24 THE WITNESS: I'm not familiar with that -- she sent
25 a letter to me, but I do not have a copy of one that she sent

1 to the Court.

2 THE COURT: Well, why don't you come up and read
3 this?

4 (Pause)

5 THE WITNESS: All right.

6 THE COURT: Well, what I would suggest doing is
7 reschedule this to a time after which she is released from
8 custody, but in the meantime, you might want to get a copy of
9 this letter and correspond directly with the attorney, the
10 probate attorney, out in Arizona, if she's willing to release
11 the \$105,000.

12 THE WITNESS: There isn't \$105,000. I know that's --
13 I guess I don't -- there's proof of that. How is it fair to
14 myself or my son if she continues to -- she got herself
15 incarcerated now for at least a year.

16 THE COURT: There's nothing I can do due to the fact
17 that she's in custody in Arizona.

18 THE WITNESS: I understand that, Your Honor.

19 (Pause)

20 THE WITNESS: Does the fact that she had ample
21 opportunity to respond to the court order of March 2009 and
22 failed to do so have any bearing on this, or do I have to wait
23 until she's released?

24 THE COURT: You don't have to wait until she's
25 released. If she's a beneficiary of some probate of estate out

1 in Arizona, you might want to contact an attorney out there and
2 see if you can file a lien against any entitlement that she has
3 based upon the court order here.

4 THE WITNESS: And if that's not the case, then I have
5 to come back to this court and --

6 THE COURT: Pardon me?

7 THE WITNESS: If it's not the case that there are
8 sufficient assets in that probate, then do I have to come back
9 to this court at a later date and file?

10 THE COURT: What I'm going to do is have this
11 rescheduled for late December.

12 THE WITNESS: She's not eligible for probation until,
13 I believe, it's the middle of February.

14 THE COURT: I thought it said December.

15 THE WITNESS: She got a one-year sentence, and based
16 on time served, it's two-thirds.

17 THE COURT: You heard from her -- from the attorney,
18 so she'll be released from the Department of Corrections -- the
19 soonest she would be released is December 2009.

20 THE WITNESS: Okay. This is from the Department of
21 Corrections website with her information.

22 THE COURT: Pardon me?

23 THE WITNESS: That is from the department of --
24 Arizona Department of Corrections website with her information,
25 and I believe it said, based on that date, would be

1 February 2010.

2 (Pause)

3 THE COURT: Why don't I set this to late
4 December 2009 and we'll see what her status is, all right?

5 THE WITNESS: Okay.

6 THE COURT: All right.

7 THE WITNESS: Thank you.
