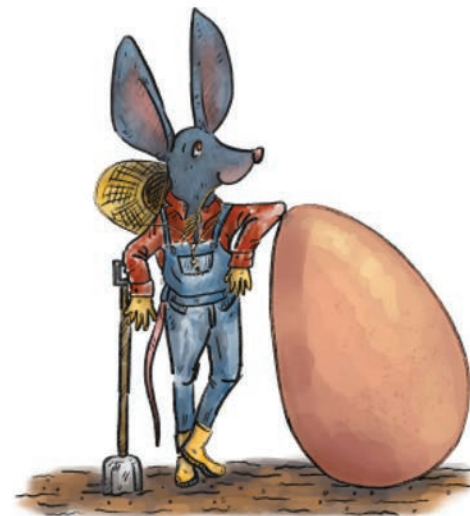






On Grandpa's Farm

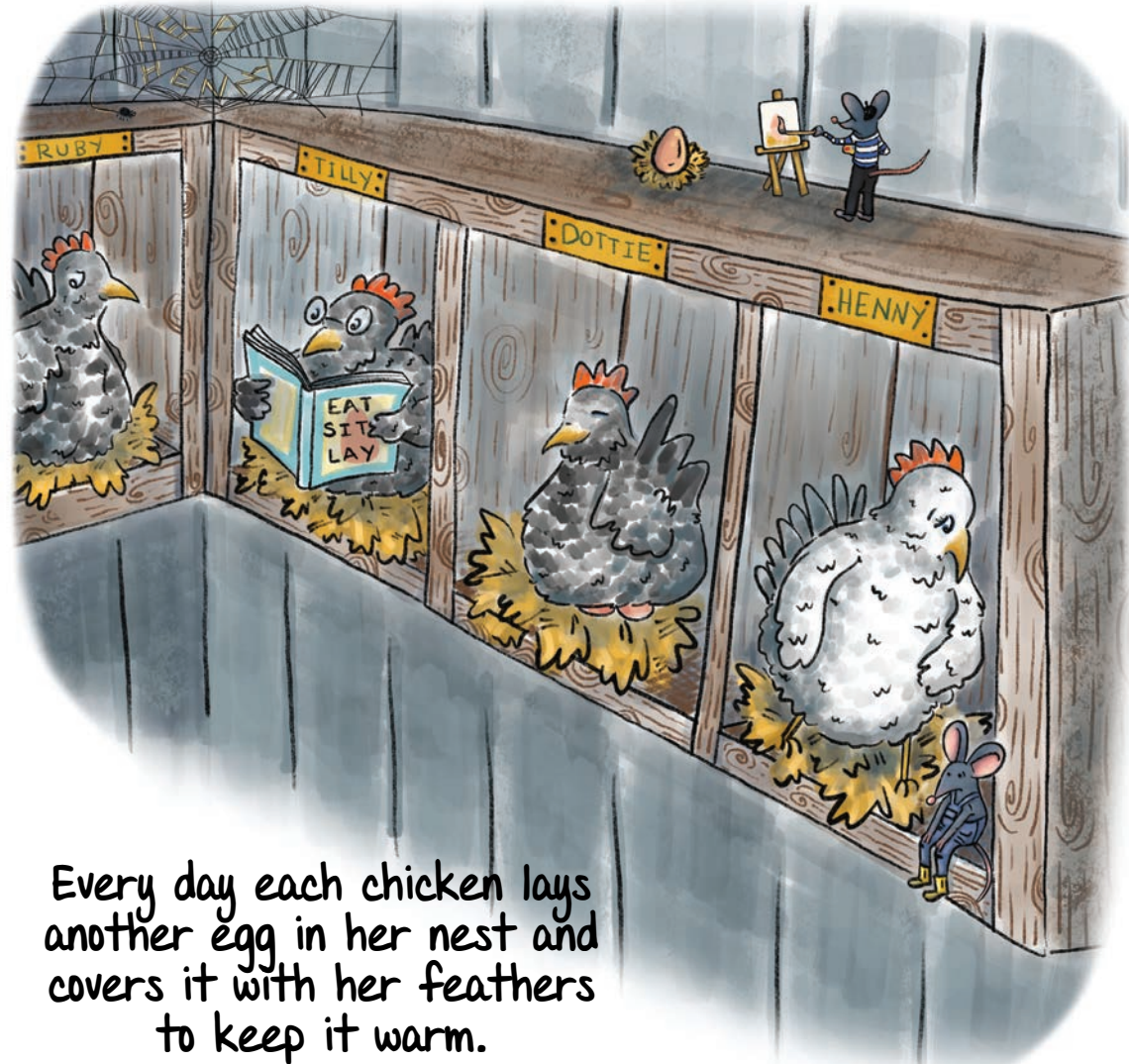

have their new babies.



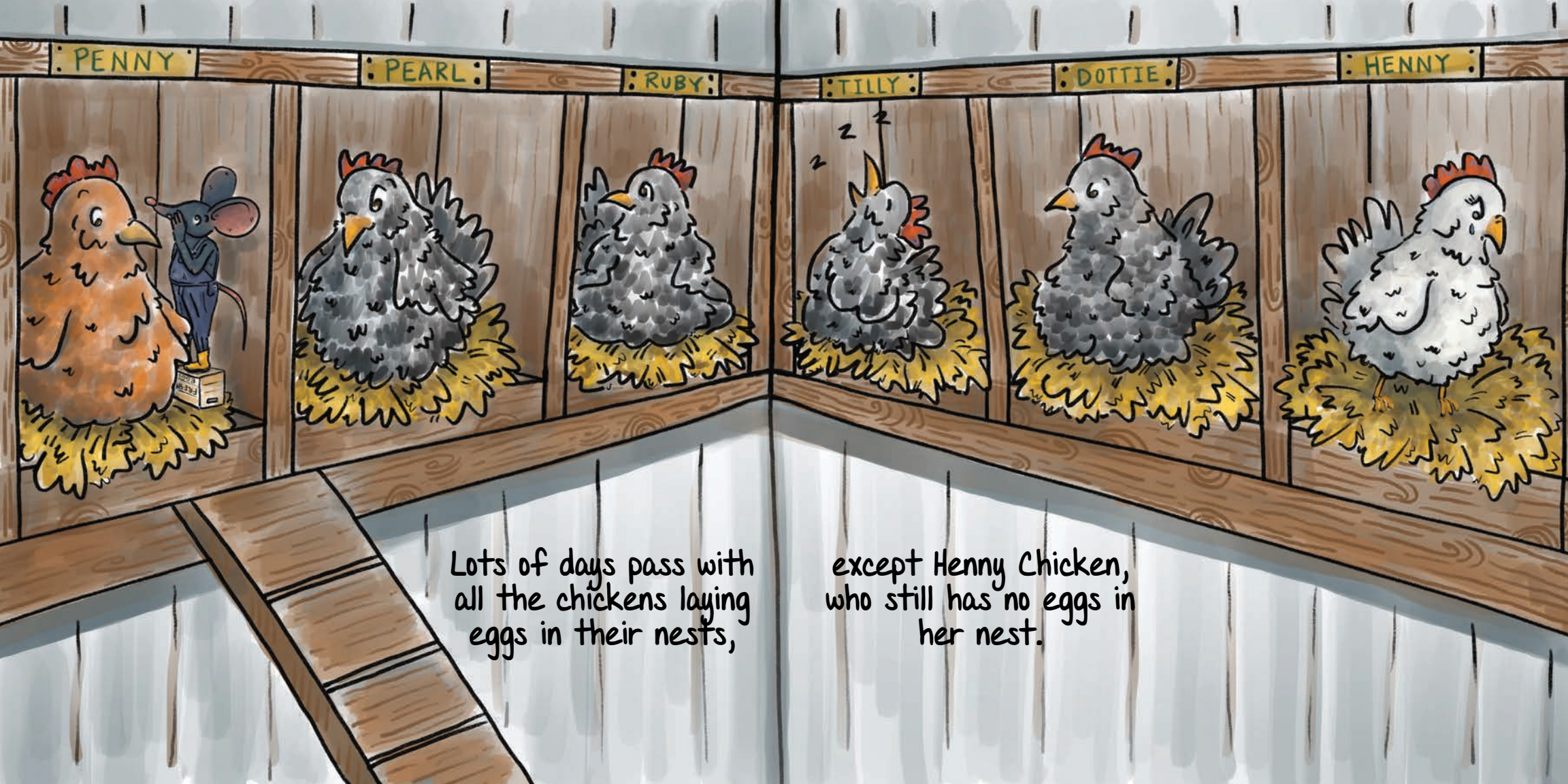
But Henny Chicken is having trouble.

She really, really wants her very own baby chicks.



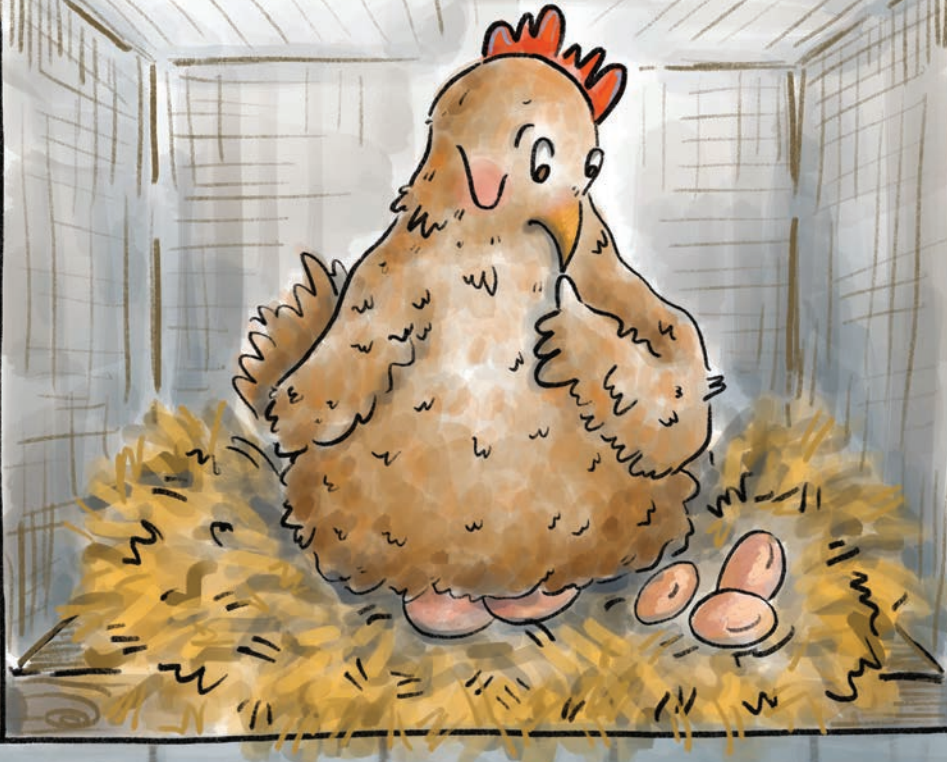
What to do?

her nest.

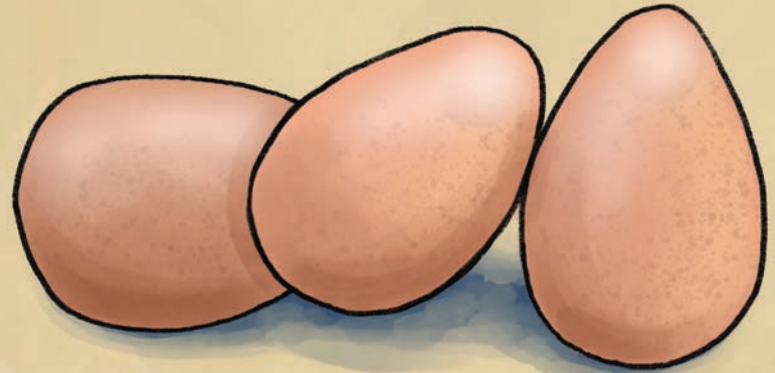

...and waiting.



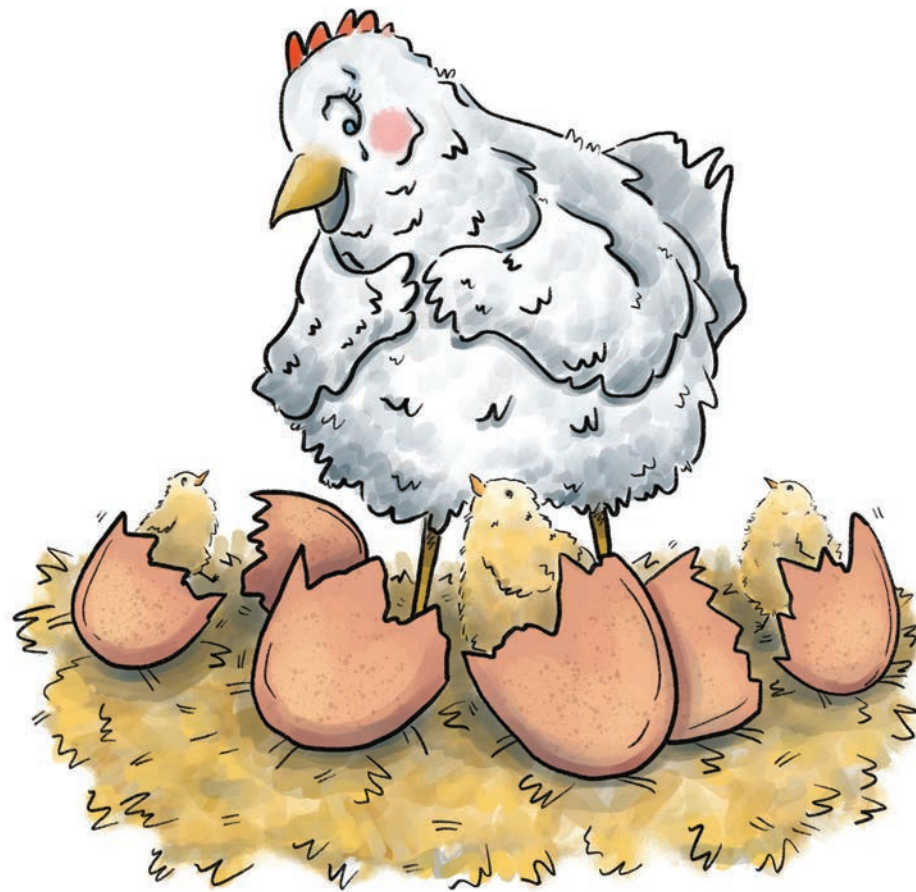
...and waiting.

...and out pops one baby chick.....HOORAY!

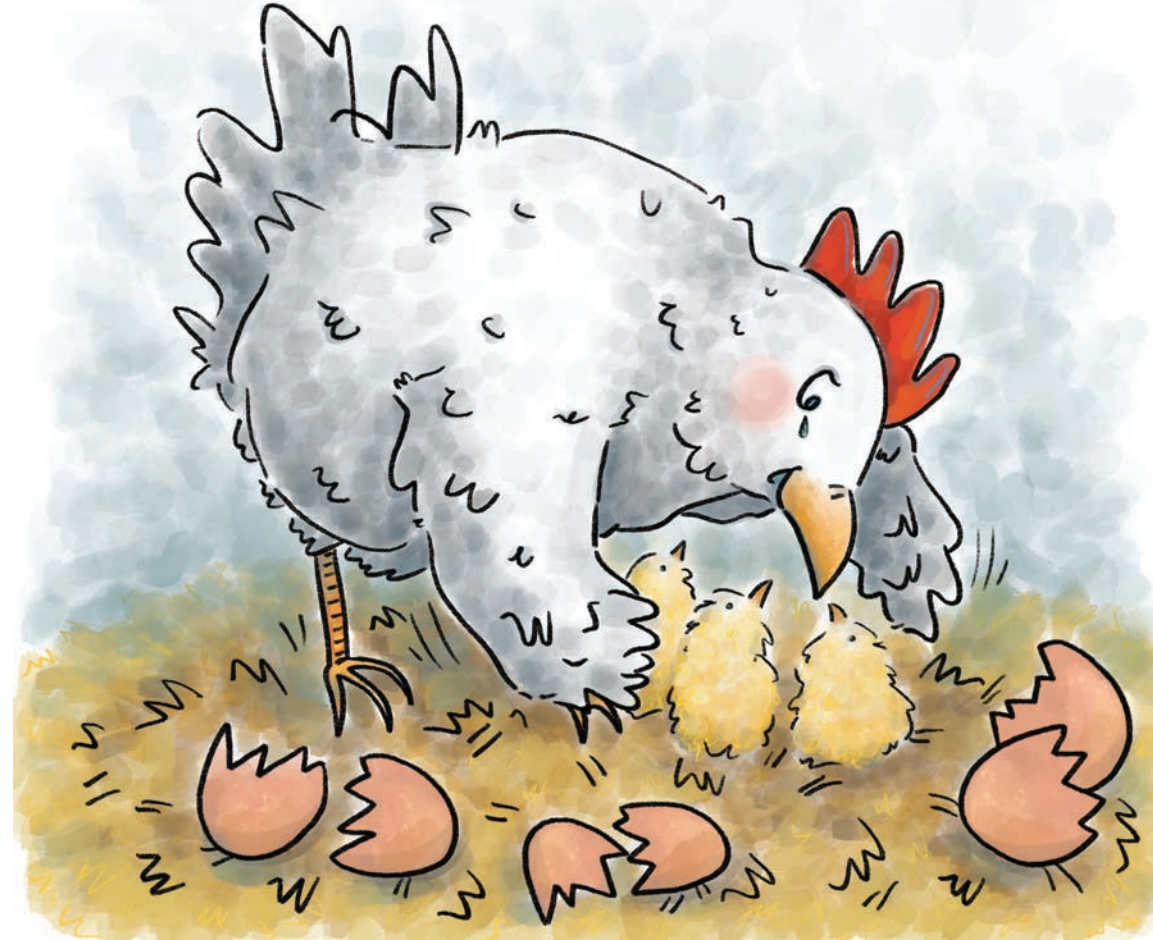


and another.....and then another!
