Merton quickly realized these retreatants were benefactors of the Trappists. I feel humbled by and deeply grateful for our own holy and kind hearted Nativity benefactors. I have the awesome gift to serve in leadership of an organization where all members of our mission assume admirable dispositions of holiness and kind heartedness.

Principal's Letter




