LETTER FROM PRESIDENT & CEO



In the coming year change is on the horizon yet again in both Virginia and North Carolina. We have already begun to assess potential impacts of managed care in Virginia and proposed reform in North Carolina. We are also re-examining our workforce to determine what expertise is needed to meet new regulatory requirements and infrastructure demands. Workforce additions will be necessary and the cost for staying in business continues to escalate. To meet this demand our strategic plan includes a significant focus on service growth and expansion. While we always look for internal operation areas where we can improve efficiency, our larger efforts will focus on growth. Our plans include opening an opioid treatment program in FY 2017/2018 in Winston-Salem, NC and expanding vocational services in Virginia.

DAY SUPPORT AND EMPLOYMENT VIRGINIA

DAILY ACTIVITIES, INTERACTION AND FRIENDSHIP

Our day support program offers community-based experiences and person-centered services to adults with intellectual disabilities. The program, called Opportunities Unlimited Day Program (OUDP) supports individuals by allowing active participation in our facility where we provide skill building activities and by engaging in community activities such as participation in delivering Meals on Wheels. The facility has wide open spaces, large group rooms that are configurable as well as smaller private rooms, computer stations and restrooms that ensure cleanliness, privacy and dignity. Our direct support professionals take health and safety very seriously and we are proud of the dedicated staff and their efforts. We help our participants make friendships, engage with others and get out into the world and do fun and rewarding things.



SOURCE AMERICA FOOD SERVICE NAB LITTLE CREEK - VIRGINIA



CAI is proud of the food service workers at the Naval Station Galley at Little Creek. Through a subcontractor agreement on a Source America contract, CAI provides the very top level of food service, from prepping and to cleanup, table setups and dishwashing/scullery. Workers on this important Source America contract have been honored by earning the Capt. Edward Ney Award for the best food quality service of shore bound facilities. CAI employees are patriotic and proud of serving the men and women of the military in this way.

BUSINESS SERVICES - BEACH PACKAGING VIRGINIA

CAI's Business services division, Beach Packaging has been continuing its usual workload of kitting and packaging power equipment parts for Stihl Manufacturing and other vendors. The facility maintains all DOL and OSHA requirements and is proficient with quality control. We meet or exceed CARF regulatory expectations earing us the highest rating, a three-year accreditation.

We meet all state and federal requirements while still continuing to operate 10 hours per day, with two shifts producing on average 31,000 to 40,000 kitted products per week. The company was able to meet revenue goals and we are always looking for ways which will increase output to customers in the coming months and years ahead.

SPONSORED RESIDENTIAL AND IN-HOME CARE - VIRGINIA

Sponsored Residential

We believe that individuals flourish when they can live as active members of a family. Our Sponsored Residential program offers compassionate care in a home-based setting by carefully matching persons with developmental and intellectual disabilities to sponsored residential homes. Our sponsored residential home providers empower individuals they bring in to be active members of families, experience community involvement, and find normalcy in everyday life. A stable home is a place that fosters better inclusion, offers help with personal care, provides safety, assistance with daily care and much more.

In-Home Care

CAI offers In-home residential support services based primarily in the individual's home. These in-home services are designed to enable individuals more engagement and interaction, enhancing functional skills, ensuring health and safety, assistance with activities of daily living and the use of community resources. We also provide medication management and monitoring the individual's total health. Each person has a detailed plan specific to their needs.



HELPING MOTHERS AND FAMILIES CHARLOTTE, WINSTON-SALEM AND DURHAM, NORTH CAROLINA

We hired a treatment supervisor in preparation for the Buprenorphine clinic planned to open in 2018. Year end outcomes for the WISH (Winston-Salem) program included:

100% of the babies born in the program were drug free; 98% of the program participants report being satisfied with the services provided to them; 100% of the program participants report being treated with dignity & respect, and 100% report improvement in their quality of life.

In Durham, we were successfully in recruiting and hiring a new program manager. We were also able to retain clients longer in treatment. In FY17, 50% of the perinatal clients graduated treatment and 64% CASA graduated treatment, easily surpassing targets from funding agencies. We moved our residential program to a new apartment complex, which was updated, clean, and safe. Our landlords welcomed us with open arms. We have had very few problems and they have been very responsive when problems arise. We had some significant staff turnover but a new team has formed and they continue to provide quality services. We received the funding to provide outpatient SAIOP services in 2017-2018. Plans for outpatient services is projected for August. We look forward to offering outpatient treatment to pregnant and parenting women in the community.

PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES - SUCCESS!!

Day Support/Residential in Virginia

We achieved and surpassed our benchmarks in Virginia by scoring high on the CARF benchmarks in the four areas including community integration, employment supports, job development services and organizational support services. Regular chart reviews occurred and documentation reviews of individual records for those we showed regulatory compliance. Satisfaction surveys from consumers were also successful as well as requirements for integration and outside community activities were exceeded. Individual reviews of each persons activities ensured that each person participated in their interests of choice and we also were successful in surpassing employment benchmarks, maintaining proper ratios in federal contact at NAB Little Creek.

Substance Treatment/Residential North Carolina

Outcomes for the WISH program in Charlotte and Winston Salem included: 100% of the babies born in the program were drug free; 98% of the program participants report being satisfied with the services provided to them; 100% of the program participants report being treated with dignity and respect, and 100% report improvement in their quality of life. In Durham, 50% of the perinatal clients graduated treatment and 64% CASA graduated treatment, surpassing the regulatory benchmarks significantly.



FINANCIAL SUMMARY

For The Year Ending June 30, 2017

CAI financial results through June 30, 2017 were mixed.

NC operations experienced turnover in staff which may have had an impact on our billing operations and we also had revenue numbers affected by the census negatively. In Durham we bore the rent cost for two properties for a short time as we moved from one to the other.

In Virginia Beach, Beach Packaging exceeded budget by \$66,000, especially in the summer they can become very busy. We are proud of our staff and count on everyone to do a great job serving our clients and keeping us financially strong.

We are beginning to build more relationships in the communities we serve and this will help us on many fronts. We are a strong and well organized company and quick to adapt when needed.
