Guest Speaker in September, Flagstaff Mayor Coral Evans



pregnancies when abortion wasn't legal, often jeopardizing their safety and health by self-inducing or seeking a dangerous procedure. When the Supreme Court passed Roe v. Wade in 1973, women could finally have safe abortions if they needed one. And yet today we still have those who would deny women the right to decide for themselves.

Having a child should be a woman's decision and not made for them by someone else -- especially a group of men. In this country we have no right to force our beliefs on others, either pro or con. Under pro-choice you have the right to believe as you want. You simply don't have the right to choose for others. Under pro-life, there is only one option. This is not the American way.

Women attained the right to vote in 1920, a right we won't allow to be taken from us. We fought for and won the right to decide for ourselves whether or not to continue a pregnancy. Seventy-three percent of America agrees with Roe v. Wade. Let's not let the small minority in this country take away our choice.

Guest Speaker in October: Gary Beverly

Gary Beverly earned a PhD degree in Physical Chemistry from the University of California. Moving to Prescott in 1974, he taught physical science and alternative energy at Yavapai College then worked as a farmer, ceramic artist, solar contractor, and businessman. Since retiring, he is a full-time volunteer environmental activist using photography, writing, and public presentations to alert citizens about the value of and the threats to the Verde River.

In 2010 he organized a team of conservationists and wrote "A Citizens' Proposal for the Upper Verde Wild and Scenic River." That proposal caught the interest of Hugh Denno, leading to this film project as a means of educating more citizens to the plight of the Verde. A Sierra Club member since 1984, he is active in local and statewide conservation issues specializing in public lands and water and serves as Public Policy Chair of the Citizens Water Advocacy Group.
