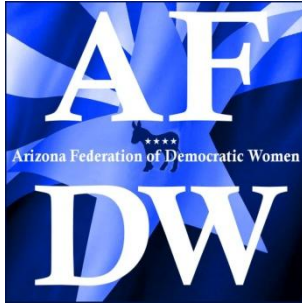
Arizona Women's Conference
