WELCOME HOME: MEET THE NEWEST RESIDENTS

In the early part of 2025, we welcomed 11 new residents. Pete the pig & his 10 goat friends came from another Florida sanctuary that closed. While this was a major undertaking, we knew they needed a safe place to land. Pete is a pig that requires special care, as he lost a good portion of his lower jaw due to a predator attack when he was a piglet. Pete doesn't let that stop him from digging in the dirt or trying to eat everything in sight!



WELCOME HOME: MEET THE NEWEST RESIDENTS

Lola was found locally on a rural dirt road, suffering from heat exhaustion when a kind Samaritan stopped to check on her. Lola happily followed him into his car and enjoyed the air conditioning. Lola was clearly very comfortable around people and shouldn't be left alone. That's when we were asked to offer Lola a safe, loving home. Lola joined a little over a month ago and will be slowly integrated into the existing flock.



Arnold the pig came to Yesahcan after the local sheriff's office reached out about a pig on an evicted commercial property. Years ago, the property tenant found Arnold in the woods, where someone had likely dumped him. While he couldn't offer much space, he cared for Arnold as best he could, until recently. With all options exhausted, Arnold was at risk of being auctioned off and likely slaughtered. We stepped up & offered Arnold a safe place to land.
