CC&Rs:

Please remember that we all legally agreed to Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions as part of our property purchase documents. These CC&Rs require several things that help enforce maintenance of the beauty and desirability of living in Vuemont, **as well as our property values!** These can be found at www.vuemont.org by clicking on the Documents tab and include provisions that:

- The owner or occupant of each residential site shall maintain their hedges, plants, shrubs, trees and lawns in a neat and trim condition at all times.
- No trash, refuse pile, vehicles, underbrush, weeds, compost pile or other unsightly growth or object shall be allowed to grow, accumulate or remain on any residential site, including failure to maintain landscaping...
- All material changes to driveways, paint colors, roofing and landscaping must be approved by the Architectural Review Committee. The form for applying to the Committee can be found at the website above. Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for more information prior to designing/beginning an exterior home or major yard improvement project.
- All vegetation must be kept trimmed away from the sidewalks to improve pedestrian accessibility.
- Please be aware of chipping, peeling and faded paint and make repairs/repaint in a timely manner to help maintain the visual appeal of (and home values in) our neighborhood.

A FEW REMINDERS and LINKS:

- <u>Halloween is coming up!</u> The areas we drive through will be crawling with adorable little goblins and witches on Halloween night. Please drive slowly and carefully on October 31 (and every day!).
- E-motorcycle laws! Speaking of safe driving, it has come to our attention that many underage drivers are driving the public roads in the neighborhood on electric motorcycles. Safety is truly a concern here, with the younger drivers not being aware of traffic regulations and rules. - <u>Winter Weather is coming!</u> It's best to be prepared in the event of snow events and weather that make living on our beautiful mountain a bit more difficult. Here are a few links to help everyone stay safe!

 - The City of Bellevue asks that all homeowners "adopt" the storm drains in front of their houses. While they do clean up after storms and the fall leaves dropping, they can't be everywhere at once. If we keep our storm drains cleared of debris, the underlying system works better and there will be less surface water on our neighborhood streets (which means less ice in the event of freezing weather).
