# SC issues notice on Bano's plea against pre-mature release of 11 convicts

The Supreme Court on tice Joseph asked, "We hearing the case, Monday issued notice to the Centre, Gujarat government and all the convicts on a plea filed by Bilkis Bano challenging the pre-mature release of 11 convicts who had gang-raped her and murdered her family members during the 2002 Godhra

A bench of Justices KM Joseph and BV Nagarathna posted the matter for hearing on April 18. It asked the Union and Gujarat governments to be ready with the relevant files granting remission to the convicts on the next date of hearing. The top court also directed that the pleadings in the case to be completed by the next date of hearing.

The apex court said there is a gamut of issues involved and it needs to hear the matter in detail.

# Work in progress: On the road ahead for the Opposition in taking on the BJP

The expulsion of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi from the Lok Sabha, following a contestable outcome of a defamation case against him in a Gujarat court, has become a new rallying point for the Opposition, at least momentarily. All the technical arguments notwithstanding, his disqualification is seen by most Opposition parties as a political move of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). Regional parties continuously adjust their relationship with the two national parties, the BJP and the Congress. From the vantage points of many regional outfits, these two parties are not necessarily two polar opposites. As a general rule, regional parties seek to expand their influence and power through fluctuating relations with the national parties, even when they are technically equidistant from both. The party in power in Delhi has considerable leverage, and regional parties are often vulnerable to pressure. In recent years, central agencies (the Enforcement Directorate and the Central Bureau of Investigation) have cornered Opposition leaders, and gone either aggressive or passive on cases according to the convenience of the BJP. While these facts were apparent, regional leaders have remained wary of confronting the BJP, and have often broken ranks with the rest. The Trinamool Congress (TMC), for instance, was not in alignment with the Congress-led strategy against the BJP on the Adani controversy.

The expulsion of Mr. Gandhi has prompted the TMC, the Aam Aadmi Party, the Bharat Rashtra Samithi and the Samajwadi Party, which are usually wary of the Congress, to condemn the action and call it out as dictatorial. These parties possibly realise that mutual rivalries and fear of the BJP and the central agencies could drive them to the margins or, even worse, at the receiving end of more vindictiveness. Fourteen of these parties have now approached the Supreme Court against the misuse of central agencies. The petitioners say they represent 42% of the electorate, and that 95% of the cases filed by the agencies have been against Opposition leaders. This is a move for self-preservation, and these parties are still far from having a joint view on several critical national issues. At the heart of the confrontation between the BJP and the Congress are questions regarding the Adani Group of companies that stands accused of dubious ownership patterns and business transactions. The BJP and the Centre have so far deflected these questions. While Opposition parties such as the Biju Janata Dal in Odisha and the Yuvajana Sramika Rythu Congress Party in Andhra Pradesh continue to stay aloof, it is noteworthy that other Opposition leaders have come out against the expulsion of Mr. Gandhi. Nevertheless, a robust opposition to the BJP is still a work in progress. It suits the BJP to keep the focus on Mr. Gandhi, and not on Mr. Adani.

# In too deep: On Sri Lanka's economic crisis and the IMF aid package

The International Monetary Fund's approval of a 48-month arrangement with Sri Lanka, under the Extended Fund Facility for a \$2.9 billion package, has been welcomed by Colombo and its creditors, who President Ranil Wickremesinghe will now have to conclude debt restructuring agreements with. Taking credit for some of the heavy lifting, India's Ministry of External Affairs. has said that India was the first Sri Lankan bilateral creditor to support the debt restructuring and to provide assurances to the IMF in January. Since last year, New Delhi has been a key part of Sri Lanka's support structure, appealing on its behalf to the IMF and World Bank, extending a \$4 billion package including credit lines, loans and debt deferrals, and raising the issue of debt sustainability at the multilateral sphere including the G-20. China, Sri Lanka's biggest bilateral creditor, and Japan (part of the Paris Club of international financiers) did not move as quickly, which held up the IMF announcement. Announcing the first tranche of \$330 million on Tuesday, Mr. Wickremesinghe said that the key message was to assure other lenders about Sri Lanka's capacity to service its debt, and potentially enable it to access about \$7 billion from international institutions and the IMF. Some credit is due to Mr. Wickremesinghe and his cabinet who have stabilised a few indicators since coming to power in challenging

However, the IMF decision is no magic pill. This is Sri Lanka's 17th IMF bailout, and the third in the past decade. The IMF loan also comes with a number of conditions, which will cause more hardships and make the government, that has about 10% approval ratings, more unpopular. Adding to its discomfiture is the IMF distancing itself from the government's decision to postpone local elections, saying it had made no political stipulations. In its report, the IMF calls the risks to implementing the programme as "exceptionally high", refers to Sri Lanka's track record of implementing reforms as "weak", and calls for contingency plans in case there is a deeper crisis induced by weak market indicators. Apart from grappling with soaring inflation, stimulating growth and inviting global investment, the government must also ensure that creditors are satisfied with its debt restructuring process and no one accuses it of "side-deals". Sri Lanka appears committed to turning the corner, and is mending fences with every international player engaged in its complex geopolities, including the U.S., Japan, India and China. It is important that in turn, they recognise Colombo's precarious position and cooperate in shoring up the island nation as it continues to navigate a difficult economic path.



# The perils of selective international justice

How can the ICC's arrest warrant against Putin be executed? Can the ICC suo motu act like the West-constituted International Military Tribunal for the Far East (1945), which brought to justice 28 Japanese 'war criminals' and put them to the sword? Assuming that the West-backed ICC does succeed in doing so, will the Bench impart justice objectively and fairly?

THE International Criminal Court's (ICC) arrest warrant against Russian President Vladimir Putin has given a twist to the Russia-Ukraine war. What's in store for the President of one of the warring nations? Can he be brought to justice? Or will the ICC remain cocooned in its hallowed precincts, in keeping with the tradition of the world bodies of the past 100 years?

It's hard to predict and naïve to visualise a quick and effective implementation of the ruling of a Bench which doesn't have the wherewithal to enforce its verdict. It's because international criminal justice is selective, creating contradictions, confusion and chaos and giving rise to the belief that it's a system of, for and by the privileged to take on the underprivileged, deprived and provoked combatants.

Headquartered in The Hague, Netherlands, the ICC is a "court established by a treaty known as the Statute of the International Criminal Court (effective from 2002), with jurisdiction over genocides, crimes against humanity, war crimes and aggression." Curiously, the ICC's inception coincided with post-September 11, 2001, developments, when the US, under President George W Bush, launched the 'global war on terror'. Will it, therefore, be wrong to perceive that the prime

aim and objective of the ICC is to target perpetrators of crime operating in regions located far away from the West?

Today, the ICC has field offices in the Central African Republic, Ivory Coast (Cote d'Ivoire), the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya, Mali and Uganda — in the developing world. Powered and defined by the 1998 Rome Statute and its amendments, "while the ICC is independent of the UN, the Rome Statute grants the UN Security Council (UNSC) certain powers of referral and deferral."

So, who all constitute the Rome Statute? It consists of '123 parties' and the best — or the worst — part thereof is that all Permanent Five (P5) members of the UNSC (France, China, the UK, Russia and the US) are either virtually conspicuous by their absence or happen to be there with a conditional or token presence. Whereas China is totally absent from the statute, Russia and the US (along with Israel and Sudan) have signed but not ratified the Rome Statute. These four nations declared that 'they no longer intend to become party to the statute.' The UK and France are signatories to the statute, but 'with reservation and/or declaration', thereby reducing the whole institution of the

ICC to a sham, which mirrors the past 400 years of arrogance of the exclusive club of western imperial powers. The situation becomes murkier owing to Ukraine's stand. Kyiv isn't a party to the statute, but it has "accepted jurisdiction of the ICC with respect to alleged crimes committed on its territory since November 21, 2013." Thus, the ICC jurisdiction over Ukraine "extends to action committed by citizens of non-parties to the statute on Ukrainian territory but, since Ukraine itself isn't a party, not to the crime of aggression without a referral from the UNSC." Therefore, an extraordinary situation brings Ukraine under the ICC through an indirect route, without having formally accepted the Rome Statute. The ICC jurisdiction over Ukraine, unlike other contracting and consenting parties, comes through the New York-based UNSC, thereby making it one of a kind in the midst of universally accepted, so-called international law. Exception, rather than equality, seems to have found favour with western expediency when international law comes to the fore in mainland Europe.

Since contextually and conceptually, we are in the legal terrain pertaining to crime, one cannot avoid the fundamentals of jurisprudence or the principles on which the law is made. Hence, the alleged crime of Russia, being ongoing and visible, could be referred to for invoking speedy justice. But, does prosecution for murder or manslaughter have a shelf life? Can it fall under the limitation act for being 'time-barred'? No. That's the reason, even after being absconding for years, charges against a young murderer can be taken up for imprisonment or capital punishment even in the twilight of his life. In other words, murder/manslaughter can be punished any time as it doesn't have any time limit for implementation of the judicial verdict.

Coming back to the ICC arrest warrant against Putin, how can it be implemented, by whom, how and when? Can the ICC suo motu act like the West-constituted International Military Tribunal for the Far East (1945), which brought to justice 28 Japanese 'war criminals' and put them to the sword? Assuming that the West-backed ICC does succeed in doing so, will the Bench impart justice objectively, impartially and fairly?

As of now, a fair trial looks highly doubtful. Everything today, regrettably, appears to be a cacophony of culpability, 'One nation, one man, one army' is cited as the cause of all violence and brutality, maybem and massacre. In 1945, too, it happened when the jury of the West unanimously found Japan to be a 'war criminal'. The exception, however, was the sole Indian on the Bench. Justice Radhabinod Pal gave a landmark dissent judgment, absolving the 25 Japanese defendants in the case. "I sincerely regret my inability to concur in the judgment and decision of my learned brothers," were the words of the Indian jurist. That history-making verdict of Justice Pal was significant because when the West atom-bombed two Japanese cities, there was no uproar over a war crime, human rights violation and harbarism on the part of the Occident. Though the Hiroshima and Nagasaki bombings are not time-barred, history invariably stood for the crime of the West. Hence, any war on western land is a war against the world and deserves a warrant against the Orient.

# Improving employability a challenge for Punjab

Punjab's job seekers consider themselves qualified, but job providers regard most of them as unfit for jobs. The gap is widening as educational institutions are following traditional approaches to designing and implementing curricula, while the landscape of the job market is changing fast owing to technological advances. Future jobs are driven by technologies such as artificial

intelligence, the Internet of Things, 3D printing, robotics, cloud computing, smart sensors and drone technology.

PUNJAB'S youth are at a crossroads. Large-scale unemployment, exodus to foreign lands, vulnerability to drug abuse and involvement in agitations suggest that all is not well. The need of the hour is to provide opportunities to the youth for actively participating in development activities.

The state government has made a good beginning by providing 26,797 jobs in a year. In February, the state had

an unemployment rate of 8.2 per cent, a little higher than the national figure of 7.45 per cent.

According to sources, the state has around 25 lakh unemployed people and, hence, the generation of quality jobs on a large scale is the most challenging task. Employability of the Punjabi youth is also low, It is around 10 per cent in the case of general education and 25 per cent for technical education. Thus, improving employability should also be prioritised. Jobs offered by the agriculture, industry and service sectors are short of choices for the state's youth.

The thrust of the state's model of development has been on agriculture. The job profile of farm operations, however, is not as per the aspirations of the youth. The agriculture sector has

produced jobs which have largely attracted migrant labourers. The state's situation is ironical, with growth creating jobs for the migrants and joblessness for the locals. This phenomenon is also undergoing a change due to rapid mechanisation and, hence, may result in job losses even for migrants.

Barring a few, the existing industries hardly offer decent jobs to the local youth. The industrial sector is dominated by small enterprises using old technologies and employing mainly migrant workers. The service sector, though, is offering around 40 per cent jobs, but technical know-how is not modernised and, hence, the quality of jobs is compromised.

With a view to mitigating unemployment, a threepronged strategy is suggested. The first strategy is to clear the existing backlog. The second is to prepare the youth for future jobs and the third is to bring structural changes in the economy. At present, most of the unemployed people are matriculates, Class-XII passouts, graduates, postgraduates and diploma holders. They are qualified in the respective streams but lack skills required in the market. Job seekers consider themselves qualified, but job providers regard most of them as unfit for jobs. The gap is widening as educational institutions are following traditional approaches to designing and implementing curricula, while the landscape of the job market is changing fast owing to technological advances.

What is the way out? To clear the backlog, the government should prepare a roadmap in consultation with the industry, educational institutions, sector skill councils and financial institutions. After getting feedback from the stakeholders about skills in demand, the educational institutions should organise short-duration skill development programmes with practicum to equip the youth with the required skills. For this purpose, the institutions may

set up special-purpose vehicles in the form of finishing schools having the mandate to fill the gaps in the skills the youth possess and those required in the market. For self-employment and startups, the government should provide the seed money and arrange loans from financial institutions.

In order to improve employability, the state's Finance Minister announced two schemes in the 2023-24 Budget — Professional Coaching for Employment, and Soft Skill and Communication Training. The government also announced the Punjab Young Entrepreneur Programme to 'incentivise business ideas'.

Preparing the youth for future jobs is a multipronged process. Our mindset is mainly trapped in the existing jobs. Enabling students for existing jobs is a good practice, but, simultaneously, we should take decisions to invest resources for future jobs. Future jobs are driven by technologies such as artificial intelligence (AI), Internet of

Things (IoT), 3D printing, robotics, cloud computing, smart sensors, drone technology, cybersecurity technology, blockchain technology and data science.

According to the World Economic Forum's (WEF) report on the future of jobs, the top emerging jobs in the US are of big-data architects, automation technicians and engineers, renewable energy engineers, organisational development specialists, new technology specialists, IT administrators, digital transformation specialists, IT project managers and data analysts.

The universities in the state should join hands to prepare the youth for future jobs. The universities should identify ubiquitous technology-driven courses, research and innovations, depending upon their strengths. They should also restructure the existing curricula in tune with the new jobs. Institutional partnership with the industry and society should be made mandatory.

Another challenge for the state is the obsolescence of the skills of workers due to changing technologies. The WEF, in its report 'Towards a Reskilling Revolution', has suggested innovative methods to identify viable job transition pathways for disrupted workers. By learning from worldwide experience, the state government should incentivise the employers and educational institutions to initiate reskilling programmes for the workers to make them ready for new jobs.

Structural transformation of the economy based on the existing technology is not enough to generate quality jobs. The policymakers, like entrepreneurs, should adopt innovations in policies to build a 'new Punjab' in tune with technological advances. Thus, for creating future jobs in the state, the structural transformation in economy in favour of high-

tech industry (Industry 4.0) and the service sector (Service 4.0), steered by digital and smart technologies, should be initiated in a planned manner. The state's Industrial and Business Development Policy-2022 is a step in this direction. The Education Minister, during a session on 'Future of Work: Industry 4.0, Innovation and 21st Century Skills', during the G20 summit, shared the state's commitment to promote new business skills among school-children. The government should extend this programme to higher education by setting up business incubators. Punjab should take advantage of the Centre's flagship programmes like Skill India and Startup India.

Quality jobs can also be generated in the agriculture sector by promoting digital agriculture (Agriculture 4.0), covering the entire agri-food value chain by employing technologies such as remote sensing, AI, mobile phones, e-extension services, positioning technologies, e-commerce platforms and big data.

# EPFO likely to decide rate of interest on employees' PF deposits for FY23 today

The retirement fund body EPFO is likely to announce the rate of interest on employees' provident fund (EPF) deposits for 2022-23 at its two-day meeting beginning Monday

EPFO had lowered the interest on EPF for 2021-22 to an over fourdecade low of 8.1 per cent for its about five crore subscribers. from 8.5 per cent in 2020-21 in March 2022

This was the lowest since 1977-78, when the EPF interest rate stood at 8 per cent.

The Employees' Provident Fund Organisation's (EPFO's) apex decision making body Central Board of Trustees (CBT) is likely to decide the rate of interest on EPF for 2022-23 at its twoday meeting beginning on Monday afternoon," a source said.

Besides interest rate, the CBT will also discuss the annual ac-counts of the EPFO for 2022-23.

The trustees will also deliberate on the action taken by the EPFO on the Supreme Court order for giving a four-month win dow to Employees' Pension Scheme 1995 subscribers to opt for higher pension.

The EPFO has provided the facility to opt for higher pension to its subscribers till May 3, 2023.

The 8.5 per cent interest rate on EPF deposits for 2020-21 was decided by the CBT in March After the CBT decision, the in-

terest rate on EPF deposits for 2022-23 will be sent to the Ministry of Finance for concurrence. EPFO provides the rate of interest only after it is ratified by the government through the finance ministry.

Government bond prices ended on a mixed note today. Long-term bonds were up as mutual funds stepped up purchases on increase in inflows in their debt schemes, as they will no longer benefit from long-term capital gains and indexation benefits after Apr 1.

The Finance Bill, 2023 stripped the benefits on long-term capital gains that debt mutual funds enoy and plugged the tax arbitrage between fixed deposits of banks.

"There's mutual fund buying in the longer tenures, that's what has caused this market movement," said a dealer at a private sector bank. "They were selling in the short tenures; five-year is quite far down."

According to amendments to the Finance Bill, income from investments in mutual funds, where not more than 35% is invested in equity shares of do mestic companies, will not get long-term capital gains and indexation benefits and will be taxed at the individual's tax rate for investments after Apr 1.

Currently capital gains aris ing from transfer of mutual fund units, other than equity-oriented funds, held for more than three years, are considered long term, and are taxed at 20% with indexation benefit.



#### NEW DELHI

The International Boxing Association (IBA) has accused the International Olympic Committee (IOC) of "lack of transparency" and "unlawful" conduct and raised questions about its "transparency principles" while inviting boxing officials for the 2024 Paris Olympics qualification process, The IBA has threatened to take IOC to court for redressal of the issue.

In an open letter to IOC president Thomas Bach ahead of the global sports body's executive board meeting on Tuesday, IBA has said its competition officials were being approached by IOC "without prior approval or communication to IBA", which is a breach of the data transfer agreement signed between the two parties in 2019.

At the root of the problem is the ban imposed by IOC on the boxing body due to concerns around its governance, financial transparency, sustainability and the integrity of refereeing and judging process. The IOC has informed IBA that it would conduct boxing qualification events leading up to the Paris Olympics, the same way it had done before of the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

Despite the IOC's instructions, the boxing body declared that the IBA-run women's World Championships in New Delhi, which concluded on Sunday, would be the main qualification event for 2024 Paris. On Monday, IBA wrote to IOC, saying, "...sharing the IBA's deep concerns regarding basic IOC governance, impartiality, and transparency principles seen during the monitoring process ahead of Paris 2024 which will mark the 120th anniversary of boxing's participation the Olympic Games.

# Ronaldo happy again with Portugal's national team

Under new coach, the star is enjoying his return

Cristiano Ronaldo is feeling at home again.

It took only two games for him to make his peace with Portugal's national team and show he is not done impressing at the international level just yet.

In his return after a disappointing World Cup and a controversial move to Saudi soccet, the 38-year-old Ronaldo scored four goals in Portugal's first two games in 2024 European Championship qualifying, showing he remains the leader that fans got used to seeing wearing the national team's red and green uniform.

Ronaldo netted twice in the 6-o rout of Luxembourg on Sunday, three days after scoring another brace in the 4-o win over Liechtenstein, when he became the men's player with the most international appearances with 197.

"Two games, two victories," the Portugal captain said on his social media accounts after the win at Luxembourg, "Happy to have contributed to a very positive start by our national team. Let's go."

The goals came against Eutopean minnows but seemed to be enough to restore Ronaldo's confidence and his role as a starter with the national

Ronaldo was in tears the last time he left the field with Portugal following a loss to Morocco in the quarterfinals of the World Cup in Qatar last year after he was benched by then coach Fernando Santos in the knockout stage.

The disappointing World Cup, added to his decision to accept a lucrative deal from Saudi club Al Nassr, had put in doubt his future with the national team. He said last

week he wasn't sure if he would ever play internationally again and only returned after reflecting with his family and realising it wasn't time to "throw in the towel" yet.

Also likely playing a part in his decision to keep playing was the arrival of coach Roberto Martinez to replace Santos after the World Cup. The Spaniard pledged to respect Ronaldo's history, and the star forward said he welcomed the "breath of fresh air" to the national beam.

Martinez said he was thrilled with the attitude shown by Ronaldo in the coach's first two games in charge. "Ronaldo is a unique player and brings a lot of experience to the locker room," the former Belgium coach said. "He is a reference and is prepared to be a leader and a

captain of this national team."

With his four goals at the

With his four goals at the start of the Martinez era, Ronaldo extended his international scoring record to 122 goals, 13 more than former Iran striker Ali Daei. Ronaldo's 198th international appearance on Sunday left him two ahead of Kuwait's Bader Al-Mutawa.

Portugal, the 2016 European champion, plays its next two matches against Bosnia-Herzegovina and Iceland in June. The team leads Group J in Euro 2024 qualifying with six points, two more than Slovakia. The top two finishers in each group will advance to the tournament in Germany next summer.

And if Ronaldo remains as happy and motivated as he is now, he will certainly be there to try to help Portugal win yet another European trophy.
